Hello,



I think it is interesting that with the COVID-19 virus there have been some very high tech and some very low tech ways we have been dealing with it. Two such ways that have been very obvious in our school are the following: one, we use computers and other electronic means to stay in contact and communicate without risking infections; and two, we go outside and use open places with shade to have safer distances while allowing the breeze and fresh air to minimize risks of infections. Only ten years ago it would have been very difficult to have all of the electronic communications we do today (20 years ago it just wouldn't have happened). With the outdoor stuff we have had, even before we had caves, we are fortunate that the weather has been cooperating pretty well since school has started to allow us to take advantage of it (there is a reason we first used caves and eventually buildings).

Hopefully we have also been recognizing how some of these newer and more high tech ways help us to grow in our faith too. One of the most obvious is being able to livestream and record Mass to share with others while we can't gather in large groups. This has been particularly helpful with funerals. Some of the people who would normally come to a funeral are those who are most at risk from the virus. But it has also made us realize that even if we didn't have the virus, there may be many times when people are at a great distance or other physical limitations may have prevented them from attending, that we realize there are ways we can still share in these events with them. Hopefully we have also found a few more resources that are available online to learn about and share our faith. These resources can be used not just locally but just as easily around the whole world, helping us realize that we are a universal church.

An old means of our faith that we have also had the opportunity to share in, is quiet contemplation and prayer. We don't always have to be in contact with everyone, always be doing something or going somewhere. Sometimes it is good to just be alone and silent with God. We can get caught up in doing things too much at times, and sometimes we need the opportunity or even the limitations, so that all we can do is to be, and listen. Recognizing that we ultimately always rely upon God and being able to be comfortable and just quiet with Him.



Sick only to have the person pass away before the priests are able to get to them. While we do our best to be available, we are not always able to respond at a moment's notice. Especially with current restrictions for visiting hospitals and nursing homes, it may take us longer than usual to be approved to visit. If a loved one is suffering from a serious illness or old age, do not wait to ask for the Anointing of the Sick. A person does not have to be imminently dying to receive the sacrament. It is better for them to receive the grace of the sacrament earlier, rather than delaying grace.

<u>September 13, 2020 — Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time</u> SIR 27:30-28:7; PS 103:1-4, 9-12; ROM 14:7-9; MT 18:21-35

Today's readings call us to look inward to the state of our hearts, our thoughts and emotions.

Our first reading, from Sirach, addresses the complicated emotion of anger. "*Could anyone nourish anger against another and expect healing from the Lord?*" We have all been wounded by others at some point, some perhaps quite deeply. Our emotions are gifts from God. But we must steward them well, rather than allowing them to overcome us.

How do we do this? Sirach tells us. "Remember your last days, set enmity aside... Remember the Most High's covenant and overlook faults." We embrace the stewardship mindset — not brooding over hurts, but recalling all the gifts our good God has given us, all the love He continually pours out upon us, and we put our focus and trust in Him.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, Jesus reminds us of the true position we have before Him in light of all that He has done for us, comparing the kingdom of heaven to a *"king who decided to settle accounts with his servants."* In the parable, a debtor is brought before the king, owing such an overwhelming debt that it could not possibly be repaid. Yet, the king is filled with compassion for the servant, forgives the debt and lets him go free.

Doesn't that sound like each of us in relation to the King of Kings? The Father has given us life, and then sent His only Son to die for us to free us from our sin "debts" and make eternal life with Him possible for us. It is impossible for us to repay this debt. All we can do is thank God by giving Him our whole selves — inside and out.

What joy and freedom we find in the stewardship way of life!



OF ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY PARISH

It is a beautiful story of how the Holy Spirit has been at work... and even continues His work to this very day. And so the story continues....

While pastor at Assumption Parish, Father Sonnenschein persuaded the Sisters of the Most Precious Blood to take over the operation of the school. The Sisters of the Most Precious Blood taught and managed both the primary school and the high school for Assumption Parish for about 120 years.

The next 60 years saw a number of outreach endeavors, including a Catholic Newspaper and the beginning the first Catholic High School in St. Charles County. (Originally called Assumption High School, it has grown and is now St. Dominic High School). During this time the parish numbered more than 150 families. The time to collect money and develop the plans for the building of a new church fell to the leadership of Father Clement J. Moening.

Assumption's first church was torn down in September 1930. The laying of the new church's cornerstone took place on Sunday, Nov. 16, 1930. Archbishop John J. Glennon laid the cornerstone. Many parishioners helped in the construction of the new church, and farmers hauled the stone from

Weldon Spring because the stone at the local quarry on the Gentemann farm was not suitable to use in the construction.




