
You might not be aware of this, but the Fall has become the most popular time for weddings in St. Louis. We have six weddings this month, with three of them just this Saturday. We have also had six funerals over just the last two weeks and seven baptisms (those both keep going year round). Every year each parish needs to send a report to the archdiocese stating how many people received different sacraments

and the following are the sacraments we celebrated from July, 2021 through July, 2022:

2021-2022

Baptisms: 81
(# infants, 0-7) 68
(# 8+ years old) 13
Professions of Faith: 1
First Communions: 89
Confirmations: 100
Weddings: 27
Funerals: 87

I added these to the plots we had from last year that show the history of our sacraments from the founding of the parish (that data had been for calendar years not fiscal years) and you can see we



have made some corrections for a COVID dip in some of our numbers.

Looking at all of these sacraments also reminds me that RCIA has just started again. We have about 15 people currently inquiring, however it is not too late for people to still join. Consider this if you or someone you know might be interested. You can see that they would not be alone.

We realize that while the numbers might be interesting, it is the people that matter. This means not only those receiving the sacraments, but also the many assisting in different ministries to help. Some of those are sacristans, wedding coordinators, funeral luncheons, marriage preparation, music ministers, RCIA team members, etc.. Our Ministry Festival is this weekend, so consider how you might use your gifts to help our parish in the many ways we serve as the body of Christ.

Becoming Catholic Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

As we prepare the assembly for this years ministry, one of the key elements are our sponsors.

Worship: Sponsors are active participants in weekly Sunday Mass and the major worship events of the parish. They are responsible for the attendance of their catechumens at these events. Daily prayer: Sponsors spend some significant, concentrated time in prayer every day (at least 15 minutes). Sponsors are responsible for teaching their catechumens how to pray daily.

Penitential prayer: Sponsors regularly examine their consciences and regularly practice the many forms of penance in Christian life (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1434-1439). RCIA sponsors are responsible for teaching their catechumens how to practice some of these forms.

Intercessory prayer: Sponsors regularly bring their needs before God (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2629-2636). RCIA sponsors are responsible for teaching their catechumens how to petition God for their needs.

The next example sponsors are to give is how to bear witness to the faith. And how do they do that? By praying in public or teach them a prayer, share

a book, or movie, Be joyful. By remaining steadfastly joyful in all situations and sharing that joy with others, sponsors bear witness to that faith.

Assumption welcomes SDHS students

This year, Assumption is working with St. Dominic to provide opportunities for A+ students to complete service hours. The A+ Program is designed for high school students who graduate from an A+ designated high school (Like St. Dominic) with an overall unweighted grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale. In addition, the graduate must have at least a 95% overall attendance record for grades 9-12. Lastly, the graduate must have performed at least 50 hours of unpaid tutoring or mentoring, of which up to 25% may include job shadowing prior to graduation.

We have three (3) SDHS students who will start on September 13th, working about two afternoons per month – when SDHS has early release days. Students Grace B, Harsh P, and Gabriella C. will be working with our Learning Consultants from 1-3pm on the designated days helping students with reading and math. The service must be direct interaction with Assumption students. As the high school students progress through their service hours, the Assumption supervisor will log their hours and sign off on the service completed. 
