Evangelization begins with Prayer

Through the death and resurrection of Jesus, the Holy Spirit has been poured out over all the earth; the promised Spirit dwells in the hearts of all who believe. Jesus has answered Moses' prayer, "Would that the Lord might bestow his spirit on them all!" The Holy Spirit has, indeed, been given to all who believe; from our experience of God's love revealed in Jesus, we go forth to proclaim God's Kingdom in Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. Many of us may defer this work because we are afraid we may say the wrong thing; or because we doubt our worthiness to evangelize; or because our glimpses of glory are fading in our own hearts.

Yet we are ready. Our work of evangelization begins with prayer. Let us recommit to daily prayer alone with God, together with our families and in community. The fruit of our prayer will be a growing confidence in God's power to save, together with our own willingness to share the good news with others. In addition to the Eucharist, to the Memorarae and to our parish prayer, I commend to you the three canticles which are at the heart of the Church's Prayer every day. You may not be able to pray all of morning prayer, evening prayer and night prayer; yet these Gospel Canticles can strengthen you each day. The Morning Canticle is Zechariah's blessing of his son, John the Baptist, as a prophet (Luke 1:68-79). The Evening Canticle is Mary's proclamation of the Gospel when she visits Elizabeth (Luke 1:46-55). The Night Canticle is Simeon's proclamation of God's salvation when Jesus is presented in the Temple (Luke 2:29-32). All three Canticles proclaim God's promises to us fulfilled in Jesus Christ.

No matter the circumstances of our lives, we can count on God's promise to save. The letter of James and Jesus' warning in the Gospel encourage us to be honest about the many ways our own will gets in the way of God's will. We are called each day to surrender our own will, our own little plan of salvation, leaving room for God's loving plan of mercy to unfold in our midst, a glorious unfolding. Let us pray for ourselves, for each other, for the Church and the world, trusting that God's love for us will bear fruit in our love for one another. Let us join Mary in her Canticle of Praise, proclaiming the greatness of the Lord and rejoicing in God our savior.



OCTOBER - Month of Mary

The historical roots of October as a month of Mary are unclear. Some attribute the association between October and Mary to the devotion to Our Lady of Fatima. On October 13, 1917, in Cova de Iria outside of Fatima, Portugal, the last of six monthly Marian apparitions to three shepherd children is said to have taken place. On this day, a crowd of approximately 70,000 pilgrims reported witnessing what became known as "the miracle of the sun," in which the sun appeared to "dance" about in the sky and could be looked upon directly without burning one's eyes.

Others associate October with Our Lady of the Rosary, while May, the month of the first Fatima apparition, is more traditionally the month to celebrate the devotion to Our Lady of Fatima. In fact, October 7 is the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary. It began as the feast of Our Lady of Victory, instituted in 1571 after a Christian military victory in the Battle of Lepanto. In 1573, this feast day was renamed Our Lady of the Rosary by Pope Gregory XIII, and in 1716, Our Lady of the Rosary was celebrated as a feast of the universal Church for the first time

- ◆ October 6th please join us in the Chapel for the Living Rosary, following the 8:00am Mass. Immediately following the Living Rosary, the Legion of Mary will be serving a free Continental Breakfast and everyone is invited! The breakfast will be held in the School Building -- Art Room.
- ◆ October 7th Pro-Life Prayer Chain -- Everyone is invited to stand in unity and prayer, praying for an end to abortion! Please gather in front of the Chapel and help us line up and down Hwy K beginning at 2:00pm.
- October 13th All are invited to join in unity with our brothers and sisters all around the U.S. to pray the rosary! We will gather at the Fatima Statue in front of the Chapel at Noon!

In October, in a special way, we remember Mary both as Mother of God and as our mother. This month includes the feasts of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7), as well as those of Blessed John Paul II (October 22), and of a Canadian, Blessed Marie-Rose Durocher (October 6), both great devotees of Mary. October also begins with the memorial of St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus. The French Carmelite once wrote that she was drawn especially to Mary, not so much because she is Queen of heaven, but because she is our mother. Let us, with St. Thérèse among all God's saints, this October and forever, rejoice that we are children of so great a mother.





September 30, 2018 — Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

NM 11: 25-29; PS 19: 8, 10, 12-14; JAS 5:1-6; MK 9:38-43,45,47-48

Our Gospel passage and the Second Reading from the letter of St. James urge us to examine our lives for anything that is keeping us from loving God above all else.

Jesus says, "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off... If your foot causes you to sin, cut it off. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out."



The urgency of our need to detach from all that is not God is clear. When we hold onto possessions too tightly, they come to possess us. The "stuff" can easily become the focus of our energy and attention. Attachment to material things slowly and steadily corrupts.

The spiritual discipline of tithing — or stewardship of treasure — can help us with this. Tithing leads us to let go of unhealthy attachment to material things and leads us to attach instead to God, relying on Him as our true source of security and happiness. We come to understand that all that we have is a gift from our loving Father and we use it to bless others and glorify Him.

Amazingly, we actually enjoy material gifts, and all other gifts, more as a result because we realize where they really came from and are using them as God intended. What wonderful freedom there is in living this way!


