Epiphany - An epiphany is an experience of sudden and striking realization. Generally, the term is used to describe scientific breakthroughs, religious or philosophical discoveries, but it can apply in any situation in which an enlightening realization allows a problem or situation to be understood from a new and deeper perspective.

That is a generic definition for the word 'epiphany', and it seems an appropriate name for our celebration today. On the feast of the Epiphany we celebrate the three magi, or three wise men coming to give honor to this baby, the newborn king of the Jews, the Christ or Messiah. The epiphany of realizing who this baby is. This is traditionally celebrated on January 6th, the 12th day of Christmas, but for our convenience we have moved it to the second Sunday after Christmas. Others will open up the timeframe and consider that the Epiphany goes up to the baptism by John the Baptist. This also makes sense since this was when we see Jesus being identified for who he is, not just a carpenter's son, but the Holy Spirit descends and God says this is my son.

So what does the Feast day of the Epiphany mean to us? Some would say it is the day that you can now, or should now take your Christmas decorations down (liturgically it is Christmas up until next Sunday when we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord). Others have many customs from different cultures in how they celebrate this feast. I think in most of modern American culture we don't give it that much weight. I mean Christmas is the big day, the celebration of Christ, God, being born as man. Even if they didn't realize fully who and what this meant back then, we do now. This is why the big celebration is for his actual birth, not when the magi came to visit.

In some ways I think our culture today needs to put a greater emphasis on the Epiphany. With the great public celebration of Christmas it can be too easy to lose the meaning. By making a bigger emphasis on the Epiphany, we can possibly encourage ourselves and others to be open to realize what this really means. Recognizing that on God and Mary's part the birth has taken place, now on our part do we understand what this really means? In our Lenten preparations have we gotten to the point where we have made a breakthrough, a discovery, an enlightened realization or at least a somewhat deeper perspective of who Christ is and what his birth means to us in our life?

While it will depend on the weather outside when some of the Christmas decorations will eventually come down, (even if it is in the 60's on Christmas Eve you never know when we might get an ice or snow storm). I hope for all of us that this has been and continues to be a blessed Christmas Season and we are all open to epiphanies from God in our lives.

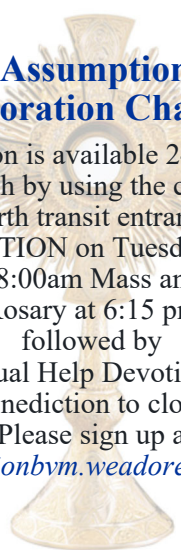

Epiphany January 6, 2022 – Home Blessing

One interesting custom for Epiphany is for families to ask God's blessing on our own homes. The ritual calls for parents to mark, with blessed chalk, the main entrance door with the initials of the Magi and a code of the current year. This year's mark will be: **20 + C + M + B + 22**

The numbers stand for the year in which the blessing is inscribed (2022). The letters stand for the names traditionally given the Magi who found the Christ Child: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They are also an abbreviation for the Latin blessing: *Christus mansionem benedicat*, or "Christ bless this dwelling." Blessed chalk will be available after masses the weekend of January 5/6.

Gather your family at the main entrance to your home. All make the sign of the cross.

Parent: *"Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be God forever."*

Family: *"Blessed be God forever"*

Parent or reader: (reading from Sacred Scripture) *"And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage."* Matt 2:10-11

Parent imparts the blessing: *"Lord God of heaven and earth, You revealed Your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill them with the light of Christ, that their concern for others may reflect Your love. We ask this through Christ, our Lord."*

Family: *"Amen"*

Then the parent sprinkles holy water on those gathered and sprinkles it about the home.

January 02, 2022 – Feast of the Holy Family

SIR 3:2-6, 12-14; PS 128: 1-5; COL 3:12-21 or COL 3:12-17; MT 2:13-15; 19-23

Today, as we continue our celebration of the Christmas season, we focus our attention in a special way on the Holy Family. This is a great time to thank God for the gift of family life.

Our first reading, from the Book of Sirach, speaks of the blessings that will come when children give honor to their parents — both young children who respect the authority of their mothers and fathers, and adult children who lovingly care for older parents. These are the actions and attitudes that create an atmosphere of respect, tenderness and unity in the family; all key elements of hospitality.

Our second reading, from St. Paul's letter to the Colossians, gives still more specific instructions on fostering hospitality within our homes. Paul reminds us of our great dignity as "God's chosen ones, holy and beloved." This applies to every member of the family, from youngest to oldest and all those in between. In the daily drudge of family life it is important to remember that each one of us is cherished by God. We are not just fathers, mothers, children, grandparents; we are all also brothers and sisters in Christ.

Paul's instruction to "put on" compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and forbearance towards each other is the best possible formula for family hospitality. Paul is reminding us that (especially in the messiness of family life) we won't always feel the feelings of compassion, kindness, and so forth. What can we do? We can "put them on" — we can act in ways that a compassionate, kind, humble person would act. This will create a transformative atmosphere of hospitality within the home that will spill out in the family's interactions with those outside the home.

Of course, this is not easy to do. But we can turn to the Holy Family for help.

Lest we think that the Holy Family is somehow unable to sympathize with our struggles, we see in our Gospel passage from Matthew that this Family was certainly not free from trials and stress; quite the contrary. The very life of the newborn Jesus was threatened by Herod's extreme jealousy such that the family had to flee suddenly into a foreign land for protection until Herod's death. Yet Mary and Joseph remained united and ever obedient to the leading of the Holy Spirit for direction. Who better to turn to for help and inspiration for our own families?

Happy feast day to all families living a stewardship way of life!

Assumption BVM Administrative Assistant: Faith Formation Team

The Faith Formation team is currently seeking a fulltime Administrative Assistant to provide support to the Director of Religious Education to ensure the efficient delivery of religious education to the parish community, specifically Elementary School and PSR programs. The candidate will report to the Director of Religious Education (DRE) and will perform the following functions:

- Assist the DRE in creating and coordinating meaningful liturgical experiences including masses, prayer services, Stations of the Cross in conjunction with the school faculty, PSR catechists, and clergy.
