Welcome

One of the primary goals identified for our parish from our Pastoral Planning, as it is in most parishes, is to increase Mass attendance, and particularly to increase it for young families. With any goal, one of the challenges is always to determine how will we know if we have achieved the goal or not? Is there any way to measure it? We have a couple of means we have used to look at overall Mass attendance in the past, counting everyone at Sunday Masses over a few weekends (which we have been doing once a year since 2011, and I will talk about that another time), or tracking how many hosts we buy over a year. But to segregate out young families is a little harder so we tried a different means.

In November we conducted a survey of all day school and PSR families to gain a better idea of how many actually are attending Mass, at what frequency, and to consider how we may encourage their attendance and participation at Mass. We sent home an anonymous survey with all day school and PSR families and asked them to please return it. We were able to give a popular incentive to the day school families, of a dress-down day for the students, and had almost a 100% response. With PSR we couldn't think of a good incentive, and the timing was around Thanksgiving which caused large time gaps and resulted in a much lower return rate. Because of that, while their responses are being recognized, I am not including their responses in the numbers below as it gets statistically very messy and lowers the confidence of the information. The responses were as follows:

The Mass attendance and the Mass times that are preferred, fit well with what we expected, and tell us two very basic things:

1. the number attending Mass is not much different from the general population and has plenty of room for improvement

2. the Mass times we need to focus our efforts on for family-friendly concerns and to make children aimed services available (such as Children's Liturgy of the Word), are the Sunday 10am Mass and the Saturday 5pm Mass. Most families are not considering participating in different ministries. From the overall data and other comments provided one of the reasons this may be is not feeling able to commit to additional schedules. Possibly finding more ways to incorporate people into ministries without prior scheduling may improve the number of those participating. I was glad to see many enjoy our homilies (I'm sure you mean Fr. Patrick's and Msgr. McCumber's also) and our music and find a sense of community in our celebrations. We can always work on improving these, but we also need to improve our appreciation of the Eucharist and our encounter with Scripture.

Well, this is our starting point. Our Worship Commission is thinking of ways we might increase our attendance and participation and are open to ideas. Meanwhile I hope we can all continue to be welcoming, and it doesn't matter when you come or even how often, we can all participate in singing.





Unlike a painting or a piece of sculpture, which are compositions in space, a musical work is a com-

position dependent upon time. Rhythm is music's pattern in time. Whatever other elements a given piece of music may have (e.g., patterns in pitch or timbre), rhythm is the one indispensable element of all music. Rhythm can exist without melody, as in the drumbeats of so-called primitive music, but melody cannot exist without rhythm. With interesting items, our Middle School students are creating rhythmic patterns, which are "movement marked by the regulated succession of strong and weak elements, or of opposite or different conditions". In the case of our students, pots and pans, basketballs, brooms, buckets, and bongos are the 'instruments" of choice for this "STOMP" project in Cathy Pescarino's Music class. Students in Middle School have been creating rhythmic patterns with these instruments and will then perform these measures in front of their fellow students. Students were placed in groups and chose which items would serve as their instruments. As part of the class, students, once they had created their rhythms, needed to practice... and with the volume so high, the parking lot seems to be the best location for practicing. Students enjoyed the opportunity to create, to see how patterns can differ, and to listen to differences in beat and tempo.





January 16, 2022 — **Second Sunday in Ordinary Time** *IS 62:1-5; PS 96: 1-3,7-10; 1 COR 12:4-11; JN 2:1-11*

Today's Gospel reading from John recounts the familiar story of the wedding feast at Cana when Jesus launched His public ministry by performing His first miracle at his mother's request.

In the midst of the feast, the Blessed Mother noticed that the wine had run out and pointed out the problem to Jesus. Then, she gave the servants instructions that are equally applicable to us modern-day stewards, saying, "Do whatever He tells you." Jesus gives the servants a simple and seemingly mundane task, telling them to fill some stone jars with water. They did what He told them to do. And Jesus used their obedience in the accomplishment of that simple task to perform His first miracle, turning the water into the choicest wine.

Our Lord didn't have to include those servants in order to perform this miracle — He chose to. And today, 2,000 plus years later, He still chooses to include us in the performance of His miracles through our cooperation with Him in using the gifts and talents He has given us. What a privilege! Let us take care to listen to our Blessed Mother: let's examine our lives this week to see if we really are "doing whatever He tells us," cooperating with God to make the best use of the gifts He has given us for the benefit of those around us. If we all take this call seriously, He will perform miracles in our families and our parish.
