

Hello,



This coming Tuesday we celebrate the conversion of St. Paul, who went from a persecutor of Christians to one of Christ's most

outspoken followers and a leader and evangelist in the early Christian community. If you haven't read or heard those passages lately, it is repeated three times in the Acts of the Apostles, 9:1-22, 22:3-16, and 26:12-18. The first one contains the most details and the next ones have Paul telling others about how he came to believe. I think Paul's conversion falls at a time that can hopefully provide us with a good opportunity to reflect on three different celebrations/anniversaries last week.

Last Monday we remembered Martin Luther King Jr. and his peaceful confrontation with violent racial discrimination. Last Saturday was the Anniversary of the Roe vs. Wade decision legalizing abortion in the United States, and last week we also celebrated a Week for Christian Unity. For all of these situations we realize there are real divisions and animosity, at times to the point where others can even be demonized. Including a week for Christian Unity into this group may seem a bit extreme. There cannot be that much division among Christians, can there? I don't think we have to go too far back to realize in our country when this was the case. The simple fact that we felt there was a need to have identified a specific week for Christian Unity, when it seems like it should be something that is only natural, appears to support that understanding.

Looking at the conversion of St. Paul, hopefully, encourages us to recognize that incredible changes can occur within people. He is an example that the hearts of people can be changed, their eyes can be opened, and those who we once considered our persecutors and opponents can become our strongest defenders and friends. I know of people who once were strongly opposed to beliefs, whether it be treating one another with equal dignity and respect regardless of race, recognizing the life and rights of an unborn child, or recognizing common beliefs of all christians, who have made drastic changes and now speak out against their past actions. If we don't believe this change can happen, then we are not likely to recognize the reason, the values, and the common beliefs that those we may be striving to convert or change already share with us.

Another aspect of Paul's conversion is that it took someone else, Ananais, to have the courage and faith to listen to God's call in helping and welcoming Paul. When we have differences with others we need to be open not to just stand up for what we believe is right, but believe in the conversion of others, and recognize that conversion may be needed in ourselves, and always open to listen to and follow Christ.

Growth Again in Math, Reading and Writing @ Assumption


Typically, schools do standardized testing each year. However, the exception for the entire US was 2020, due to COVID. Standardized testing gives results that compare students, classes, or schools from across the nation. The comparison can be done because all of the students at each grade level took the same test.

Results from standardized tests are called PERCENTILES and **are not like** a percent given on a test. In the graphs below, you will see each grade level at Assumption over three years, 2019, 2020, and 2021 in three subject areas, Math, Reading and Writing. Unfortunately, there was no testing in 2020 due to COVID, so there is no information to graph.

When looking at the graph the bars indicate the average PERCENTILE for the entire class during the specific year and subject. So, as an example, Grade 6 in Math for 2019 scored a 60 Percentile, that would mean that our 6^{th} grade class scored better than 59/100 schools in the nation.


Most importantly, you can see from year to year, the average growth for the same group of students in subject areas.

Lastly, our mission is to transform our students through the power of faith and knowledge, inspiring each to bring Christ to the World. We are continually reviewing and reevaluating to improve all aspects of our programs, hoping that with each change comes improvement.
