

## Hello,

This last week on October 4<sup>th</sup> we celebrated the feast day of one of my favorite saints, St. Francis of Assisi. While people remember him for the blessing of animals on his feast day as he is the patron saint of animals, and you see statutes of him in gardens with birds and bunnies around, I thought I would take a little space to just point out a few other facts about him that can help us see why our pope might have chosen his name.

Francis had a conversion in his life that caused him to forego any material wealth or possessions in order to follow Christ. Unlike other religious orders of monks at the time whose primary focus was to grow in their spiritual advancement by removing themselves from the world in a life of liturgical and monastic observances, Francis was still very much of the world. He would walk the streets preaching, serving the poor and the sick. At the very beginning of his ministry he admits that he had a particular aversion or fear of lepers, but was able to overcome this and would personally assist and care for some with this disease in his area. He is known for having heard God's instruction to "rebuild my church", and considering that this was meant in a very physical way started to rebuild a chapel that was in ruin. As history can show us though with the many who would soon follow Francis in the religious order he founded and the many others they touched in their ministry he learned that he was helping to rebuild not just a building but the entire Church in a more important and lasting way.

One simple way in which most of us still yearly follow the example of Francis is in the tradition of having a Christmas crèche or nativity scene in our homes at Christmas. Some claim he originated this practice, but others simply state he popularized Christmas crèches when in 1223 he constructed a living nativity scene to excite the inhabitants of the town of Greccio, Italy in their commemoration of the nativity and celebration of Christmas.

Francis is also remembered for the stigmata which he experienced. Physically the marks of the wounds of Christ's passion appeared on his hands, feet and side, causing him both bleeding and pain. Known for his humility he tried to keep these hidden but their existence still became widely known and was well documented.

It is also particularly appropriate to remember Francis this weekend when we have our collection for the permanent diaconate as Francis himself was ordained a deacon and chose not to be ordained a priest. A great model and example of the diaconate, he preached Christ's words and humbly cared for the poor. We are fortunate to have two deacons serving us here at Assumption, Deacon Fred Volansky and Deacon Richard Tadlock, with Deacon Bill Walbridge retired in our parish and Bob Hennnekes in formation to become a deacon. Please consider a contribution to the permanent diaconate program, an envelope for this donation is in the monthly ones mailed to parishioners, this donation helps to prepare those who are planning to humbly serve us as deacons in the future.

#### **Funeral Meals**

#### Be a Part of a Legacy of Love – Feeding the Brokenhearted

Enduring for decades, whenever our facilities allow, Assumption provides a simple meal to families after the funeral of a loved one. Our After Funeral Lunch ministry is Christ's love in action, a meal of hope for those whose hearts are crushed by grief.

We are in URGENT need of adding food volunteers to our lunch teams willing to make a side dish or dessert and bring it to the parish center on the day of the funeral.

What do I do? When you get a call from a team captain, make a side dish or dessert and deliver to the Parish Center on the day of funeral, usually by 10:30am

How do I know what to make? Your team captain will tell you what side dish/dessert is needed

**How often do I do this?** Assumption has 4-6 funerals a month. When our teams are at full capacity, you can expect to be called once or twice a month

How long is my commitment? We encourage new volunteers to try the ministry for at least a year. If you want to be called on more often, we can put you on multiple luncheon teams What skills are needed for this ministry? Compassion for the brokenhearted, ability to make a simple side dish/dessert, and the ability to deliver that dish on the day of funeral What if I'm not comfortable being at funerals or with people who are grieving? This is a behind-the-scenes ministry. You will not have to interact with bereaved families.

#### October 6, 2019 Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time HAB 1:2-3; 2:2-2-4; PS 95:1-2, 6-9; 2 TM 1:6-8, 13-14; LK 17:5-10

Our readings today show us that living a stewardship way of life — a life focused on serving God and His Kingdom — is not easy. They also show us that our lives belong

to God, not to us, and that God will indeed bring about the fulfillment of His kingdom. We just need to have faith that He can do it and commit to our small part in His grand design. This is both our privilege and responsibility as Christian stewards.

Jesus makes this privilege and responsibility clear in today's Gospel passage from Luke. When the apostles ask the Lord to increase their faith, He tells them that even a mustard seed-sized faith is all that is needed to move mountains (because it is God who does the heavy lifting). We need only take the tiniest step forward, and He will do the rest.

But living our lives in His service is also very much our responsibility, as Jesus explains through the parable of the unprofitable servant later in this passage. Our Lord describes a scene in which a servant has just come in from tending to the master's affairs and asks whether it would be reasonable for the master to begin waiting on his servant. Of course, it would not be reasonable! The servant would be expected to continue to serve his master until he has completed the work the master has given him that day. Jesus says we should have this same attitude before God.

The time, talents, and treasure entrusted to us are all God's. Our very lives belong to Him. Whatever we do on God's behalf with our lives and our gifts is simply our God-given responsibility.
