The Eucharist is the Wedding Feast of the Lamb

Jesus' Teaching on marriage today has prompted us to give an early Christmas present this year. Please pick up a copy (one/household) of Pope Francis' "The Joy of Love." It is a beautiful witness to the importance of the Sacrament of Marriage and family life as foundational to our life in Christ. It is our confidence in who we are in Christ which impels us to our love for one another and our evangelization of the world. The family, the domestic church, is a school of virtue which prepares us to love without fear, even to the ends of the earth. When God fashioned us in the Divine Image, male and female, He set us over all of creation as the pinnacle of God's glory revealed to the ends of the earth. Everything that God created is good. God first sought us to be in relationship with Him, sharing the very life of the Trinity. God created Eden for us, that man might have a safe and beautiful place to dwell. All of creation flows from God's love, through Christ, in the Holy Spirit and **FOR** us. Then God acknowledged, "It is *not good* for the man to be alone (Gn. 2:18)." From the beginning, God's poverty and humility are revealed; God's unconditional and surrendering love is made known. The Lamb of God is broken for us in the beginning. God admits that He himself is not a suitable partner for us. God then fashions a woman out of the man's suffering, dying, who is "at last, bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh (2:23)," someone for whom I can die. This is what it truly means to be formed in the image and likeness of God. The foundation of the Sacrament of Marriage is laid in the very beginning, the relationship of love which will be the meaning of human community and life in God. All other loves are grounded in this first love. And we will see in the third story of creation, the preamble of John's Gospel, that God's desire for intimacy with us continues to deepen; God's longing for us and God's plan for our salvation is fulfilled when the "Word becomes flesh." God becomes bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh for us. The beauty of the Sacrament of Marriage is fully revealed in Christ, in the Marriage of the Holy Spirit and Mary which brings new life in Christ to the whole world.

Fr. Nord and I will be at the Priests' Convocation Monday-Friday this week. We are grateful to Msgr. McCumber for his willingness to stay behind and be available for all the sacramental needs of the parish. Please pray for Fr. Nord and me as we take a few days of prayer and fellowship with Archbishop Carlson and other priests from throughout the Archdiocese of St. Louis.

RESPECT LIFE MONTH

Prayer

October is Respect Life Month, during which Catholics in the Archdiocese of St. Louis and around the nation come together to serve as witness to the dignity of every human life.

Parishes will kick off the month by marking Respect Life Sunday at Masses the weekend of Oct. 6 and 7. While the month of October is typically filled with events that promote the sacredness of human life, including the archdiocese’s annual Respect Life Convention, it’s also a reminder of the importance of promoting life issues as a way of life, throughout the year.

The U.S. bishops’ theme for this year’s Respect Life Month is “Every Life: Cherished, Chosen, Sent.”

Pope Francis wrote earlier this year that “Our defense of the innocent unborn . . . needs to be clear, firm and passionate, for at stake is the dignity of a human life, which is always sacred and demands love for each person, regardless of his or her stage of development.”

Karen Nolkemper, executive director of the archdiocesan Respect Life Apostolate, noted that the collaborative effort of the pro-life movement must continue forward, especially as momentum toward a Supreme Court nomination grows. People who work to build a culture of life must be prepared for the possibility of an overturn of Roe vs. Wade.

“We’re in this to change minds, save souls and heal hearts,” Nolkemper said. Through prayer, education, media and resources and support for pregnant women to help them choose life for their babies, all members of the pro-life movement play an equally important part.

“Sometimes the evil one wants to say one person’s role in this pro-life movement is more valuable than another, and that’s a way the enemy brings about division,” she said. “We have done a good job of uniting other pro-life agencies, but we want to go beyond and reach out to other pro-life folks within other faith backgrounds. Each organization has a very valuable role to play. It’s like an orchestra, where we need all of the instruments to play that beautiful music. We need all of the players to end abortion in our lifetime.”

The Respect Life Apostolate promotes four pillars in promoting a culture of life, with the end goal of making abortion unthinkable. The pillars are Spiritual, Pastoral Care, Education and Public Policy.



ONCE ONE CHOOSES TO BECOME A DISCIPLE OF JESUS CHRIST, STEWARDSHIP IS NOT AN OPTION

The Call

Stewardship is part of discipleship. But Christian discipleship begins with vocation, the call to follow Jesus and imitate his way of life. The letter therefore begins with vocation. Then it presents a very general overview of stewardship, considered in the context of discipleship, noting that people first of all are stewards of the personal vocations they receive from God. Discipleship and the practice of stewardship constitute a way of life that is both privileged and challenging.

Jesus' Way

Next, the pastoral letter focuses more closely on the idea of stewardship, relying on the teaching and life of Jesus to probe its meaning. It considers the implications for disciples of Jesus engaged in stewardship. One of these is that all are called to evangelize, to share the Good News with others. And what is the reward to which good stewards can look forward? The answer is perfect fulfillment in God's Kingdom—a kingdom already present, real but imperfect, in this world, which Jesus' disciples help bring to its full reality by the practice of stewardship.

Living as a Steward

Having reflected in general terms upon Christian life considered from the point of view of discipleship and stewardship, the letter turns to the content of this way of life. It considers the content of life in relation to two human activities that are fundamental to the Christian vocation. The first is collaborating with God in the work of creation. The second is cooperating with God in the work of redemption. Both lie at the very heart of Christian stewardship in its deepest meaning.

October 7, 2018 — Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

GN 2: 18-24; PS 128: 1-6; HEB 2: 9-11; MK 10:2-12 or MK 10: 2-16

Today’s readings give us a wonderful refresher on the Biblical origins of the Sacrament of Marriage, going all the way back to the second chapter of Genesis in our First Reading, and then reinforced by Jesus in our Gospel Reading from St. Mark.

Perhaps more than any other time in Christianity, marriage and family life are under attack right now. It is vital that we have a proper understanding of the Church’s beautiful and solid teachings in these areas. We call this type of knowledge, “Formation” and it is one of the pillars of a stewardship way of life. Solid formation in the faith not only strengthens us in our own walk with the Lord, but it allows us to pass on this knowledge to others who are thirsting to know the truth about the human person, and it also arms us to defend our beliefs, when necessary.

These readings also invite us to reflect on the reality that we are to be good stewards of the vocation the Lord has entrusted to us. If I am married, do I recognize that my spouse and my marriage are a gift from God that must be nourished, developed and tended? This brings to mind the stewardship aspect of “Time.” After time spent with God, my next priority of time should be for my spouse. Do I realize that at the end of my life I will have to give an account to God for how I cared for the gift of my spouse and marriage?
