Hello,

As we began our parish pastoral planning, the highest aspiration and area of concern from our parish visioning nights and also from our parish survey, was to reduce our debt. The figures from our last fiscal year are now available, and I thought I would inform you about our debt and how it fits into our overall parish finances. (Another one of our aspirations is financial transparency.)

Our current parish debt is \$1,327,000. This is the remaining amount we owe the archdiocese on a loan that was taken out in 2013 to pay for an expansion to our school building. The school expansion was needed based on the decision in 2011 to add Pre-K classes to our school. The existing day school facilities would not accommodate the additional classrooms needed, so it was decided to build an addition to the current school facilities. In the interim, the Pre-K and kindergarten classrooms were housed in trailers on the school lot. In 2013 at a cost of \$5.2 million, a nine room addition to the school was begun. This provided space for a pre-school along with other additionally needed office and room space. (It should be noted that before 2013 there had not been any significant facility upgrades to our school buildings since 1960, a period of some 53 years.)

Of the \$5.2M, \$1.9M was paid off during construction by our 'For Our Children' capital campaign. A 15-year loan was taken out from the archdiocese to finance the \$3.3M remaining cost of construction, with the final monthly payment forecasted for 2028. As of last

month, the outstanding balance due is \$1,327,000 (25% of the initial cost). Our projected last monthly payment of \$20,900 will be in August of 2026 (2 years ahead of schedule). The addition has not only allowed us to have a preschool, a significant addition to help form our youngest children and to attract families to our K-8 program, but has also provided necessary space for the rest of our school.

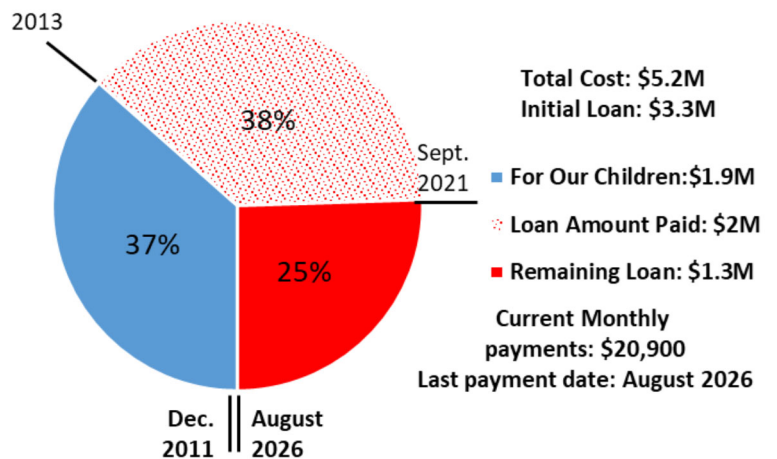

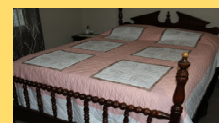

October 10, 2021 Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

WIS 7:7-11; PS 90:12-17; HEB
4:12-13; MK 10:17-30 or MK

Part of the beauty of stewardship spirituality is its simplicity and practicality. It can be summed up in the simple phrase, "*All I have is a gift from God and I must make a grateful return to Him for all He has given me.*"

So simple that even our youngest parishioners can grasp the concept. Simple, however, does not necessarily mean easy. Simple also does not mean shallow.

Today's readings invite us to look into the depth of a stewardship way of life. And they reveal that it requires the commitment of our whole being to God. It is anything but easy or shallow. It points us to seek after higher things — the wisdom of God and Heaven itself.

Our Second Reading, from the Letter to the Hebrews, shows us a way to obtain such wisdom — it is available to us right in the Scriptures, which are the living word of God. Every time we approach them in a spirit of prayer, they will speak to us. God's wisdom is right there for us. All we need to do is commit some daily time to seek it.

Our Gospel Reading from Mark is one of the better-known passages in the Gospel — the story of the rich young man. In response to the man's question on what he must do to obtain eternal life, Jesus tells him to keep the commandments. The man replies that he has always done this much. But he rightfully suspects there is more to being a disciple of Jesus than just following the external rules.

We are called to be so much more than rule-followers; we are called to be Christ followers. A stewardship way of life frees us to follow Christ with all of our being and so to find eternal life.

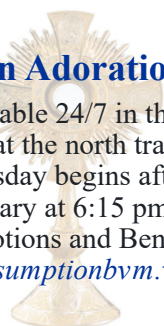

From the Principal's Pen



Athletics, of course! BUT... what other EXTRA-Curricula are offered?

There is no doubt that Assumption Athletics offer wonderful sports opportunities for our students from Pre-K through 8th grade. But, often times, people are unaware of other extra-curricula that we offer to students.



Two years ago, we piloted an afterschool **High School Spanish I class** to our 8th graders at St Dominic High School. The program continues today, with 8th graders learning Spanish I from a SDHS Spanish teacher. At the end of the year our students can take the final exam, and if they pass, they begin St. Dominic as a 2nd year Spanish student!

Our **Mad Science afterschool program** offers interactive science experiments that foster creative thinking and problem solving. This STEM program covers a wide range of science topics and provides students with the opportunity to experience hands-on science.



The Rosary Club also meets afterschool for all interested students. Run by Mrs. Davis, this club meets weekly to pray the rosary and discuss Mary, Mother of Jesus.

Our youngest students have afterschool **Ballet, Building Blocks Baseball, and Karate** to choose from. Learning agility, balance, and skills in these activities expands the horizons of our little ones.



Hip Hop Dance and **Yoga** are two more of our afterschool programs, with our grades 2-5 students hip-hopping to music and flexing to the sounds of birds and wind.



Our **Crayola World of Design** after-school art program lets students use art concepts and techniques as a way to interact with and learn about the world. Kids learn many art different techniques, like sculpting, illustration, painting, and textile artistry.

We continue to offer **Robotics** to many of our grade levels after school. For the youngest of our students, the FIRST Lego League is the name of their program, while our older students participate in the FIRST Competition league. I'll have more information on our Robotics Program in a future article.



Lastly, Assumption's **Student Council and National Junior Honor Society** develop leadership skills for Middle School students and continue our mission of "Bringing Christ to the World", through outreach to community programs including St. Vincent de Paul. Most recently, for an 8th grade Prayer service, students were asked to bring canned goods for our St. Vincent food pantry. Within days, our students brought in hundreds of canned goods, filling box upon box for our neighbors.
