
Well... Fall has started, and I have noticed as I get older, more people I know (who are also getting older) say that Fall is their favorite season.

St. Francis . . . Pillar of Prayer



"For thus savs the Lord: When you call Me, and come and pray to Me, I will listen to you. When you look for Me. you will find Me. Yes, when you seek Me 0 with all your heart, I will let you find Me ... " Jeremiah 29:10-13



Sunday, October 31st at the 8:00 am, Mass we will celebrate God's action among us with a ritual called the Combined Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens and Rite of Welcoming the Candidates for Full Communion.

This ritual involves each of us. Eight people have come to this community of faith, seeking God. They have heard Christ's stories, and have felt the Spirit move them to respond to God's call to leave old ways behind and come and follow Him. Some of them are not yet baptized. Others have already become members of the Christians through the waters of baptism.

God has called them and we have the privilege of introducing these people to the one we call Lord: Jesus Christ and to you, the assembly. We share the good news, and uncover God's action in our lives. For some, this leads to a remarkable beginning, a new life. For others, this deepens the relationship they already have with Christ.

This will mark the first public declaration of God's call to follow Christ. It also marks those previously baptized first public declaration of their wish to live as Roman Catholic Christians. Many things have already changed for these people. This Rite marks that change. We now know these men, women as belonging to God and to God's people gathered here in our parish. The unbaptized have a unique relationship, and a special name: catechumens. They are entrusted to this faith community to nurture in this journey of faith. The already baptized are known to us as candidates. All are signed with the sign of our faith, the sign of the cross. They will commit to begin to follow Christ deliberately as Roman Catholics do, and to learn what that means from us, through our prayer, our Scripture and Tradition, our works of charity and justice and our lives as holy, different people.


