Hello,

Last Tuesday we celebrated the Feast day of St. Vincent de Paul



(a co-patron of our archdiocese). He is of course known through the St. Vincent de Paul Societies that are active here and throughout the world to help the poor as well as the founder of the Congregation of the Missions (the Vincentians) and the Sisters of Charity.

I know I have been aware of the St. Vincent de Paul Societies my whole life, as my Dad was president of my home parish's (SVDP) before I was even born. Here in St. Louis we are proud to be the founders of the St. Vincent de Paul Societies in the United States, which was founded in 1845, only 12 years after it was founded in Paris.

Also in St. Louis, I was fortunate to attend Kenrick Seminary which was run by Vincentian priests up until 1995. Kenrick still had Vincentians there when I started the following year, and also had one of the Sisters of Charity teaching also. With all this connection to St. Vincent you would think I would have known about his having been on a ship that was attacked by pirates, after which he was a slave for two years before escaping. Even if this is only a legend (as some say) it certainly makes a good connection with his great concern for the poor and those in need.

His concern for the poor and the means by which this has been carried out through St. Vincent de Paul Societies, seems to be a way that many can identify with. I have been fortunate that at every parish I have been assigned to, we have had a strong St. Vincent de Paul Society. Not only have I seen the great good that they do in serving the poor, but it is also impressive to see the good they do in forming the people involved. They don't just serve those in need, and doing this with respect and care, but they also grow in faith, prayer, humility, and community. I have been impressed not only in the way that these Societies indiscriminately strive to serve those in need, but also in the way that so many different people are attracted to donate and serve through these Societies.

St. John Paul II made popular the phrase "preferential option for the poor". While these words were not always used, Christ obviously demonstrated this in his actions and his teachings that while we may not be able to help everyone, we are all called in some way to help those in need. St. Vincent de Paul not only did this himself but also instructed and inspired others to do so in a way that has only grown over the centuries. May we continue to be inspired by him to show our love for God and one another by our treatment of those in need.

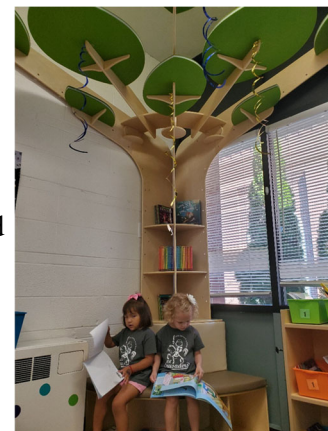

Pre-K 3 experience X-STREAM Lab

The STREAM Lab allows students to flourish in an environment where they tinker, create, invent, build, and interact with each other within the Assumption curriculum. Students build confidence in their capabilities and explore the world they live in, they develop an attitude to fix, make, modify, and customize their world.

To the right are pictures of Mrs. Burbridge's PreK 3 class, while in the X-STREAM Lab. Remember that STREAM is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Reading, and Math. So the stations that students visit are designed with a specific purpose. Each teacher designs the lesson plan for her students in each subject area, then the STREAM teacher aide (Bailey Hughes) works with those students helping them as they progress through the curriculum plan.

Our Music teacher, Mrs. Hanson, provided a maraca to each of Mrs. Collier's PreK 3 students. 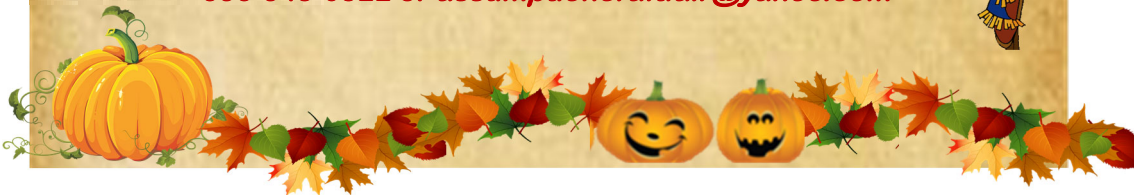

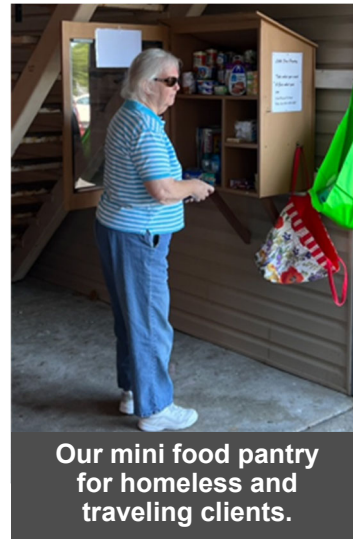
After a slow recovery from Covid, this year has already been extremely difficult with rising gas and food prices. Local residents are also still dealing with the flooding and clean up issues and many of them with the loss of their homes. We are often asked how someone could help during the year, and not just during the holidays. Apartments and motels are booked with displaced clients and homeless. We have been giving out more tents, sleeping bags and supplies this year than ever before.

Food cards and gas cards have also been in short supply, as many clients cannot afford gas to get to their jobs, or some are living in their vehicles and gas cards have been used to run a/c and heat in the winter. If you would like to help your local Neighbors in Need and homeless clients, we greatly appreciate any and all donations. Below are some of our most desperate needed items:

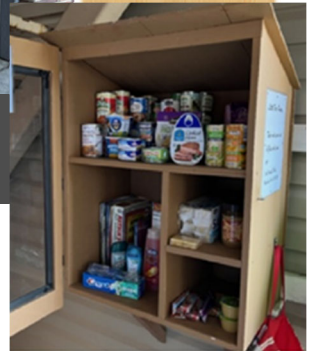
- Small 1-2 person tents (inexpensive on Amazon or Walmart)
- Small battery operated fans
- Batteries
- Sleeping bags
- Pillows
- Gas gift cards (for getting to work or living in their cars)
- Food gift cards (for non refrigerated food items)

- Small battery lanterns
- Styrofoam coolers or any small new or used coolers
