

Hello,

I don't know if you saw this in the news last week, but they had what is being called the best shot-put competition in history. Not something that made the headlines, but for some reason I saw it on-line and it is incredible.



The winner, Joe Kovacs, had a throw of 22.91 meters, his personal best and the farthest throw recorded in 29 years. But what made it such a great competition wasn't just his throw, but there were also two others who happened to throw 22.90 meters each, or just 1 cm. short of the winner. And then there was another interesting track and field record set, the first marathon ever to be run in under 2 hours by Eliud Kipchoge. Actually, this run isn't going to be considered a record as a competition since it was a special run that he did on an especially flat course with other runners pacing him and allowing him to draft them throughout the marathon, but he still ran a marathon in 1 hour 59 minutes and 40 seconds.

I'm writing this on Monday night so I don't know if the Cardinals are still playing baseball this season or not, but it is interesting how much coverage we have seen about baseball last week or maybe hockey or football and yet I would bet most of us didn't even hear about these other two events. One was an undeniably incredible competition and the other an amazing performance pushing the limit of what man can physically achieve. You might say either because of where we choose to look for our sports news or because of what news sources choose to print is the reason we may have heard of these events or not.

Now instead of sports, imagine that we are talking about something much more important, like our faith. It can be very disappointing to see statistics that say a significant percentage of Catholics don't believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. But it is even more disappointing to see that many of those say they aren't even aware that the Catholic Church believes and teaches in the Real Presence. I wonder where they have been getting their information? This would be like the baseball fan not knowing the World Series is going on.

There are other issues that are also critical that some might not agree with, and others not even be aware of the Church's teachings. Consider such topics as marriage, that it is a lifelong commitment and the means by which the parties are to grow closer to God, or forgiveness, that God can and wants to forgive our sins but we need to realize that there is sin and to ask for forgiveness. What are the sources that people use for these topics? I know or hope that I am one, as I would believe are many of you. So how do we present the good news to those who are listening to us?

God offers us so much through our Church, lets try to share it.

We are in URGENT need of adding food volunteers to our lunch teams willing to make a side dish or dessert and bring it to the parish center on the day of the funeral.

What do I do? When you get a call from a team captain, make a side dish or dessert and deliver to the Parish Center on the day of funeral, usually by 10:30am

How do I know what to make? Your team captain will tell you what side dish/dessert is needed

How often do I do this? Assumption has 4-6 funerals a month. When our teams are at full capacity, you can expect to be called once or twice a month

How long is my commitment? We encourage new volunteers to try the ministry for at least a year. If you want to be called on more often, we can put you on multiple luncheon teams What skills are needed for this ministry? Compassion for the brokenhearted, ability to make a simple side dish/dessert, and the ability to deliver that dish on the day of funeral What if I'm not comfortable being at funerals or with people who are grieving? This is a behind-the-scenes ministry. You will not have to interact with bereaved families.

Something wonderful has been happening right here at Assumption Parish! God has been at work, doing what God does: calling people into a relationship with Him. Next weekend at the 8:00 A.M.

Mass we celebrate God's action among us with a ritual called the Combined Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens and Rite of Welcoming the Candidates for Full Communion.

So, we who are the people entrusted with their care and formation, this means that we accept them robustly today as children of God, that we live lives that permit the Gospel to shine through, and that we openly share with them our ministries, our faith in Christ and our prayer.

You might say our message from today's readings has everything to do with prayer. Could Jesus put it more clearly than He does at the beginning of the Gospel from Luke? "Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary." We may recall that St. Paul told us we needed to "pray constantly." Prayer should be at the very core of our faith lives, and it is the beginning point of living lives of stewardship. Jesus probably did not mean that we should always be on our knees with our eyes closed in prayer, but He did expect us to always be in what one might call the "spirit of prayer." Paul refers to this in 1 Thessalonians 5:17 when he says, "Pray without ceasing."

To be sure, prayer is not easy. We may, as the Lord says, sometimes "lose heart" in prayer, because it is difficult for us to perceive the answer or the response to our prayers. (The term "lose heart" is another translation of what was translated in the Gospel as "becoming weary.") Too often we use prayer as a last resort instead of a first resource.
