Hello,

This week I am providing a summary of our financial history over the last four years. You might recall that the COVID-19 pandemic began in the beginning of 2020. This drastically affected our means of worship and schooling, as well as some of our related income and expenses. Fortunately, with a government funded forgiven PPP Loan and education grants, with archdiocesan grants, conscientious budgeting, and continued generosity from our parishioners through this period, we have come through with our finances close to where we had started, but having paid down our loan some and reestablished some operational reserves.



As we go forward, we recognize that over the last year inflation has been affecting all of our budgets, and while last year we were able to keep our expenses under control, this year will be a little different. Throughout the archdiocese and our parish the standard raise entering the 2022-23 year was 3.2%. Some of our contracted service expenses have gone up significantly more than this, and current projections, along with our loan interest rates, continue to go up. Our loan balance for the school addition should go below \$1,000,000 this December, but we still have a few more years until it is payed off.

With these considerations, and hoping that many of our parishioners are also getting some increase in their incomes, we are budgeting for \$2,000,000 in our offertory next year (roughly a 5% increase from last year, but also less than a 5% increase from where we were in 2018-2019, prior to COVID). I know it is easy to just continue to support your parish at the same amount as before, especially for our most faithful supporters who have regularly scheduled donations, but I would ask you to consider increasing this amount. For those who may not have donated regularly in the past, know that we do have a need, and to continue to operate as we are an increase in the offertory is necessary.

One sign that we are past the worst impacts of COVID was the successful Fall Festival last weekend. That helps us not only in our bottom line as a fundraiser, but also brings so many of us together socially and volunteering to support and be an active part of our parish. Next week we should have some preliminary numbers for you on the financial side. For now, I want to thank Larry & Donna Johnson, Russ Schaller, and all those who lead, supported, and participated in the Festival. It is one way that we not only live as a parish, but hopefully also invite and attract others to be with us, so we may build up the Body of Christ.



5. Additional lighting in the parking lots and walkways

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults makes clear in nearly 20 different paragraphs that the process of initiation takes place within the larger community of the faithful. It also places the celebrations of the rituals in the context of Sunday Mass—unless there are pastoral reasons not to do so—in order to assure that the entire community participates (see Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults 31).

We encourage you to extend your hands over the group during the Rite as well as any prayers for them during Mass. ALL SAINTS DAY – Tuesday, Nov. 1st
Holy Day of Obligation

Catechism of the Catholic Church says this about: *The Communion of Saints* – Paragraph 5. (Profession of Faith)

#946 After confessing "the holy catholic Church," the Apostles' Creed adds "the communion of saints." In

a certain sense this article is a further explanation of the preceding: "What is the Church if not the assembly of all the saints?" #479 The communion of saints is the Church. #947 "Since all the faithful form one body, the good of each is communicated to the others. . . . #948 The term "communion of saints" therefore has two closely linked meanings: communion in holy things (sancta)" and "among holy persons (sancti)."

Sancta sanctis! ("God's holy gifts for God's holy people") is proclaimed by the celebrant in most Eastern liturgies during the elevation of the holy Gifts before the distribution of communion. The faithful (sancti) are fed by Christ's holy body and blood (sancta) to grow in the communion of the Holy Spirit (koinonia) and to communicate it to the world.

*Come and celebrate Mass with us surrounded by our parish saints... and the saints that are even walking among us. **Monday, Oct. 31st 5:30pm (Vigil). Tuesday, November 1st – 6:30am; 8:00am; and 7:00pm.**

ALL SOULS DAY – Wednesday, November 2nd

All Soul's Day is a Roman Catholic day of remembrance for friends and loved ones who have passed away. All Saints' Day, together with All Souls' Day is known collectively as Hallow tide. All Souls' Day remembers all those who have died, not just the great and the good, but the ordinary person on the street. **At the 7pm Mass** on November 2nd we will bring forward our Book of Remembrance to honor your family and friends who have gone before us. As part of a conclusion, we will process to the cemetery after the closing prayer. As part of our procession this year, we will have luminaries to light our way.

Community Helpers and Fire Prevention Week for our Pre-School Classes

When instructing our PreK students about "Community Helpers", our teachers make it a mini-experience. Teachers begin by explaining that there are many community helpers and some of them are **construction workers, dentists, librarians, grocery store workers, and even teachers**. She shows a picture for each type of community helper, asks students if their parents or grandparents are community helpers, and then asks students what each of these community helpers do.



In order to make this a true experience, on Tuesday, October 11th, the O'Fallon Fire Department came to teach our preschool students about fire safety and prevention. Students listened, saw the Fireperson put on the fire coat, hat, mask and oxygen tank. The fireman got close to the students, so they could touch the uniform, hat and oxygen tank.

Then, everyone went outside to see the Fire Engine and listen to how the engine works. As part of the experience, each child was able to enter the cab of the engine and pass through it to the other side. They loved every minute.

Lastly, during centers time, all students had an opportunity with DRAMATIC play, to become a fireperson with hat, first aid kit, and hose. The teacher created a "burning" building out of refrigerator boxes, with paper flames. Each of the children took turns being a fireperson and being the people saved! This was a great experience for all.


Life Night: Aesthetic – God in Media ~ 6:30 - 8:30pm in Parish Center

We are so thankful to share with you that, a beautiful, healthy baby girl came into this world as a child of God.
