

Hello,

Did you know that last Friday was the feast day of St. John Paul II? He died in 2005 and was canonized in 2014. He was pope for over 26 years, most of my adult life. If you have been in a role for that long, especially in a position of great public attention, you should expect to have some people who think you are great, and probably others that don't exactly see eye to eye with you. Especially with many people referring to him as 'The Great', you know that he has his supporters, but someone will always be able to find something you did wrong. We need to be able to accept that other than Mary, I think all of our saints were also sinners. It made me think about how many of our popes have been declared saints.

Out of 266 popes, 81 have been declared saints. Actually, out of the first 52 popes (up to the year 498), only 2 have not been named saints, and of the first 31, 28 died as martyrs. (Maybe not the easiest way to become a saint, but it can overcome some of your detractors.) After that, we would have a few of the popes named saints in each of the following centuries up to the 9th century. After that there would only be two more in the 10th and 11th centuries, and from 1085 through 1903, only one of the popes from that era would be named a saint. He was St. Pius V who issued the Roman Missal after the Council of Trent. Now, in the last century, four of the eight popes have been named saints.

So, did we not have many saintly men to be popes for that millennium? I don't think that is the right conclusion. Actually, our last three Popes have canonized a total of about 1,400 saints. This exceeds the number canonized before then since 1588, was when we first established a formal process to canonize saints. Pope Francis actually canonized around 800 in his first canonization that involved that many Italian martyrs. So what was going on then?

John Paul II was noted as promoting a theme from Vatican II of the universal call to holiness. It isn't just for popes from centuries ago, or for distant people that we could never be. We are all called to be saints. One of the ways he and his successors have demonstrated is to go through the process of identifying saints from all walks of life, not just popes. As we approach All Saints Day and All Souls Day, we need to remember that just because the Church hasn't declared someone a saint doesn't mean that they aren't one. And we need to be inspired by all of these people, and recognize that we are also each being called to be saints ourselves. It doesn't mean that we will never sin again, or that someone won't disagree with us, but hopefully it will help us to realize we can and should continue to try to live holy lives each day.


