Hello,

In case you hadn't noticed we are in an election year and Election Day is coming up in just a few weeks. Archbishop Rozanski had an article in the Review the other week you can still reference on-line that I thought was very good addressing how we need to form a Catholic conscience in preparation to vote. A tool to help us with this is the document the US bishops update and publish every four years called ***Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship***. (To find these and other sources go to Archstl.org/vote.)

The fact that the US bishops consider they need to update this document every four years makes me consider that there may be both some different areas of concern that I hadn't considered before, and also some different thoughts about them. Same sex marriage and embryonic stem cell research are just two topics that I know I never thought about when I first voted but have become significant concerns over the last decades. Racism has been a concern for much longer than I have been voting, but how we talk about it, the understanding of what can and needs to be done, and its effects on society have all been constantly changing.

Even if everything around me stayed unchanged through the years, I do not doubt that there are places where I could use changing. I know there are people who I consider both intelligent and very moral Catholics who have very different opinions on some political topics, and even on who they may vote for. If this is the case, I think I need to be open to hear these perspectives if I am going to properly form my conscience. Listening to others not only allows me to grow in my understanding and the forming of my conscience, but also allows me to better inform others.

Even if I do not change my mind, how can I ever expect someone else to change their mind if I don't take the time to listen and discuss our differences. Obviously whatever has been said before has not worked, but maybe something new will. We realize Jesus was often getting criticized for eating and associating with sinners, but he knew these were the people he needed to talk to, to offer forgiveness, to be open to accept their change. If I never spend time with anyone who doesn't agree with me how will I ever be able to convert them from their errors, and how will I ever have the opportunities to convert from my errors? A little humility is needed by each of us if we are going to be open to hear one another, it is also needed if we are going to be open to hear God.

As part of a conclusion, we will process to the cemetery after the closing prayer. As part of our procession this year, we will have luminaries to light our way.

As the month of November approaches, please know that we will be praying in a special way for all of our loved ones who have died. There will be sheets of paper at the doors on which we encourage you to write the names of family members and friends who have died. These sheets will be collected into our Book of Remembrance, and brought forward at Mass on All Souls Day, Monday, November 2nd so that we may pray for them with devotion, and remember them with love.

October 25, 2020 — Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

EX 22:20-26; PS 18:2-4, 47, 51; 1 THES 1:5C-10; MT 22:34-40

Today's readings are all about the radical love of God for His people and the radical love we are called to live out in response. The stewardship way of life is nothing more and nothing less than the practical application of loving God and neighbor in our daily lives.

Jesus sums up the message of all the prophets, as well as the purpose of all God's laws, in today's Gospel passage from Matthew. It is a message we have likely grown up hearing — but it is so beautiful and so challenging, it bears repeating again and again. It is Christ's response to a question about which commandment is greatest. His answer reveals both the greatest and the second greatest commandments.

He says, "*You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind...* The second is like it: *you shall love your neighbor as yourself.*"

How is the second like the first? What do the two commands have in common? Love.

Love God first and love neighbor as self. This is the heart of the stewardship way of life — simple enough for a child to understand, challenging enough to be the life's work of every "grown-up."



Something wonderful has been happening right here at Assumption Parish! God has been at work, doing what God does: calling people into a relationship with Him. This weekend at the 8:00 am Mass we celebrated God's action among us with a ritual called the Combined Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens and Rite of Welcoming the Candidates for Full Communion.

This ritual involves us all. Seven have come to this community of faith, seeking God. Over many weeks they have met Jesus the Christ, whom we know to be God's revelation. They have heard Christ's stories, and have felt the Spirit move them to respond to his call to leave old ways behind and to come and follow him. They know only some things about Christ and the Church. But this they know: they are ready to follow Him and to learn how to do that as Roman Catholics.

So, for we who are the people entrusted with their care and formation, this means that we accept them robustly today as children of God, that we live lives that permit the Gospel to shine through, and that we openly share with them our ministries, our faith in Christ and our prayer.

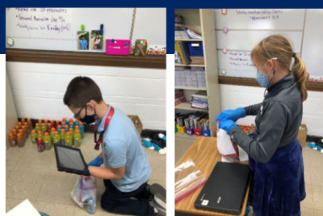

From the Principal's Pen Blessing Bags

During the past weeks, our 4th grade classes have been discussing service and how to help others, during Religion classes. Students and teachers brainstormed some ideas on ways they might help others in our community. "Blessing Bags" were decided upon, which required the students to bring in donations. Within days, our students had donations of toothpaste, deodorant, socks, and snacks.

Since these items were going to another group of people, students wore masks and gloves and assembled over fifty (50) hygiene bags and over fifty (50) snack bags! These bags will be handed out, by a volunteer, to the homeless in downtown St. Louis. I am so proud of the hard work and compassion our Assumption 4th graders displayed and the generosity of their families in donating items for our bags. As St. Francis said, "It is through giving that we receive", and our students live their faith giving generously and without expectation.



Adoration and 1st Graders

Pope Benedict XVI recommended that children be taught to appreciate spending time in the presence of the Eucharist as part of their preparation for First Communion. Likewise, Pope Francis has used Matthew's verse, "Let the children come to me and do not stop them; for it is such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs", (Mt 19:14) to promote having children attend Eucharistic Adoration. The first week of each month our students attend Eucharistic Adoration. Of course, this year is a bit different, so last week students watched a video that explained what Adoration is and why it is important for the faithful to adore the Blessed Sacrament. Then, today students from each grade level went to the Chapel for adoration for children. Adoration prayer can be done in several ways: Meditative Prayer, Contemplative Prayer, and silent conversation with Jesus are common practices, as is saying the rosary. But Eucharistic Adoration can also be as simple as just sitting and soaking up God's love in the presence of Jesus.

They began with the weather person, a little girl, walking to the window and explaining what she saw. The teacher, Officer Carlsen, recorded the information using her pictures of sun, blue sky, and wind. Then, the calendar person, stood and was asked to identify what month it was, what day it was (Monday, Tuesday, etc.) and lastly, what the date for today was. As the student spoke, the others, seated in a group, listened and watched as the officer pointed to the month name, day, and date.

Because this week is "People who help the Community Week", Mrs. Deanna Carlsen, our new part-time Pre-Kindergarten teacher, chose to introduce the week's activities by dressing as a police officer. As the day progressed, students learned about the police, talked about how they help our community, and how important they are to all people.

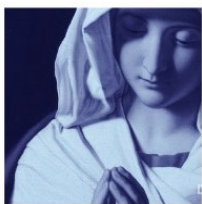
