## Hello,

Today we begin National Vocation Awareness Week. The Bishop's Conference (USCCB) specifically intends this to be a week to promote vocations to priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated (religious) life. I usually get a bit upset when people only consider clergy and religious when they talk about vocations, since the majority of people have a vocation to married life and others to single life. I also realize the necessity to give greater attention to clergy and religious life when it may not be something people are as familiar with and so they might not be able to recognize if they are being called to it.

When I was growing up we had sisters teaching in my school as in many other schools, so it was not only a way that you could see a part of what their lives were at class, but also just have the ability to see them as people too, with individual personalities and characteristics. Most children grow up today, even having gone through Catholic schools or active in their parish throughout their childhood, and may never get to know a woman in religious life.

One of my uncles was a Capuchin, which is an order of Franciscan priests. I didn't see him that often as he served in different places such as Nicaragua, an Indian reservation in Montana, and for years in Saudi Arabia. As a child I remember him being very good at Ping-Pong and knowing a few magic tricks, but also being a very kind, soft-spoken, and humble man. I also learned the difference between religious and diocesan priests in that he didn't own anything himself but the priest at our parish did, (I think we might have gotten him a black umbrella for Christmas more than once). I got to know some other Capuchins I met through my uncle as well as a full variety of our parish priests from childhood on. I guess this gave me a little idea of what it would be like to be a priest, but just as important was to recognize the wide variety of people I knew who had been called to be priests and so when I thought I might be called it was something that I might also be called to even if I wasn't exactly like a certain priest.

"Jesus has a specific task in life for each and every one of us. Each one of us is hand-picked, called by name by Jesus! There is no one among us who does not have a divine vocation! Some are called audibly by God, but the usual kind of call is internal, through the inner working of the Spirit." ~Homily by Pope Saint John Paul II

As we celebrate National Vocation Awareness Week I hope we all are open to how God might call us, and realize that however that may be, we are meant to have joy in that calling.

## Becoming Catholic RCIA Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

For those of you who did not attend the 8:00am Mass last weekend, an explanation of the Rite should be explained more in depth.

PRIEST: Catechumens, I ask your sponsors to sign you with your new way of life as catechumens (those to be baptized) Candidates will receive from your sponsors the sign of your life in Christ (already baptized).

PRIEST: Catechumens receive the sign of the cross on your forehead. It is Christ himself who now strengthens you with this sign of his love. Learn to know him and follow him. Candidates receive the cross on your foreheads as a reminder of your baptism into Christ's saving death and resurrection.

PRIEST: Receive the sign of the cross on your ears, that you may hear the voice of the Lord; Receive the sign of the cross on your eyes, that you may see the glory of God; Receive the sign of the cross on your lips, that you may respond to the word of God; Receive the sign of the cross over your heart, that Christ may dwell there by faith; Receive the sign of the cross on your shoulders, that you may bear the gentle yoke of Christ; Receive the sign of the cross on your hands, that Christ may be known in the work which you do. Receive the sign of the

cross on your feet, that you may walk in the way of Christ. From the front of the church the celebrant then makes the sign of the cross over all the catechumens and candidates saying:

PRIEST: I sign you with the sign of eternal life in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

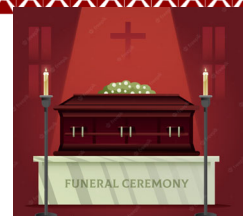
### 'Celebrating Catholic Funeral Rites Not Wrongs'

Planning a funeral should not be seen as a burden, but rather as a gift to the person who dies. Please join Monsignor William McCumber, as he presents, *Funeral Rites Not Wrongs*, Thursday, November 10, at 7:00pm in Hall A of the Parish Center.

As expressed by Cardinal Benno Gut of the Congregation of Divine Worship, the Order of Christian Funerals has been the practice of the church not to simply commend the dead to God, but to raise high the hope of its children and to give witness to its own faith in the future resurrection of the baptized with Christ. Msgr. McCumber will discuss this pastoral expression in relation to the funeral rites of the Catholic church which include the vigil, liturgical celebration, and burial committal. Pre-planning of funerals, choosing readings, hymnody and discussing how family and friends might be involved in the funeral liturgy also will be discussed.

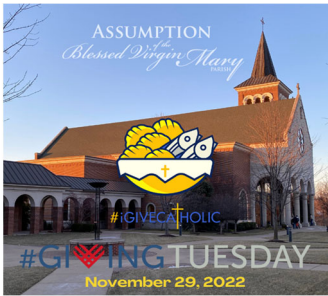

### ASSUMPTION ENRICHMENT PROGRAM – Grades 2-5

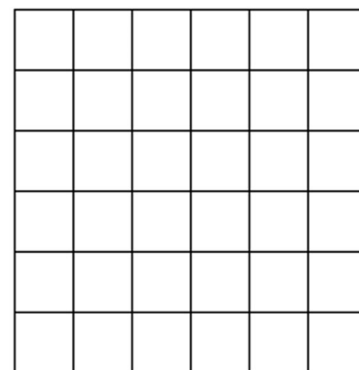
Again, this year, Assumption will offer an Enrichment Program for students in Gr. 2-5. This program is run by Mrs. Tere Bowman, Learning Consultant each week for 20 minutes per grade level. The criterion used to pick which child would be asked to participate was based on ITBS Testing and teacher recommendation.

Most of the activities used are puzzles and games that rely on critical thinking skills and math. The Salamander Line-up involves placing salamanders on a square grid so that no salamander is in the same row or column as another salamander.

It is a good puzzle for developing logical and reasoning skills.

**This is an example of a Grade 4 exercise:**

Place the 6 Captain Salamanders in the squares on the board so that no captain is in the same line (either horizontal, vertical or diagonal) as another.

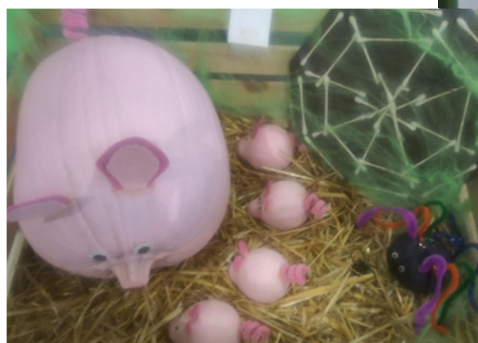

**THANKSGIVING DAY 2022~** Let's begin by celebrating Thanksgiving together! **Join us on Thursday, November 24**, and we will once again have a special Eucharistic celebration at **9:00am**. It is special in several ways. First, let this day be a reminder that "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving". Taking part in the Eucharist on Thanksgiving Day is a beautiful way to begin celebrating this holiday--we hope that you will join us.

We also invite you to bring gifts for the poor. These can be money or the usual items you bring for the St. Vincent de Paul Society. 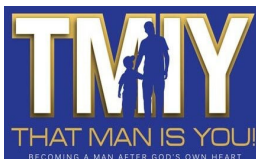

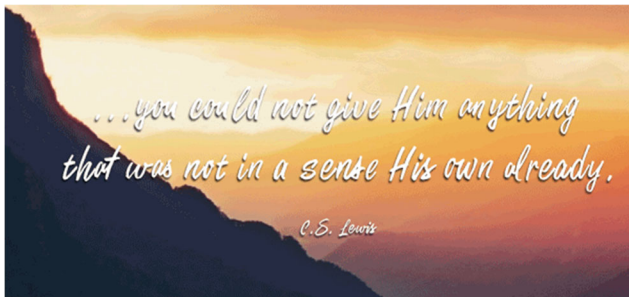

### November 6, 2022 Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 MC 7:1-2, 9-14; PS 17:1, 5-6, 8, 15;  
2 THES 2:16-3:5; LK 20:27-38

Today's readings challenge us to focus on the **“why”** of stewardship. Why embrace this challenging way of life when it seems hard enough just to pay the bills, take care of our loved ones, meet the demands of our jobs, and fall into bed at the end of each full day? Because this life is not all there is. We were made for more — for eternal happiness in union with God. While we cannot earn our way into Heaven, what we do now with the life God has given us has eternal consequences. Stewardship living helps us to keep focused on our hoped-for destination in the choices we make each day.

In our Gospel passage from Luke, Christ reminds us very clearly that we were made for more than just this life and that our choices in this life have eternal consequences. In this passage, our Lord corrects some Saducees for their mistaken notion that there is no resurrection. He instructs that **“those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead...can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise.”**

Stewardship is not ultimately about the amount or kind of time, talent, and treasure we offer. It is about the conviction that **everything we have is a gift from our loving God whom** we can never truly repay and with whom we want to live forever. Revisiting these three aspects of our lives regularly, prayerfully discerning the best use of our gifts, and putting this down in writing clarifies and strengthens our conviction to **put God first**. It is a clear guide and a powerful aid in living out this conviction in concrete ways day-by-day.

***That is the “why” of stewardship.***
