Hello,

As we particularly remember those who have died and gone before us this month of November, I thought I would talk a little about purgatory. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) states that at the time of our death we face a particular judgment regarding our immortal soul: either entrance into the blessedness of heaven through a purification, or immediately, or immediate and everlasting damnation, a state of definitive self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed that is called "hell" (CCC 1022 and 1033). The purification that is mentioned if one does not immediately go to heaven is referred to as purgatory. The Catechism defines this as a state of final purification after death and before entrance into heaven for those who died in God's friendship, but were only imperfectly purified; a final cleansing of human imperfections before one is able to enter the joy of heaven. These beliefs are supported by a variety of Scripture passages (most often cited is 2 Maccabees 12:38-46) and have been further understood and explained through the doctrine of the Church.

A challenge we face when talking about purgatory, or heaven, or hell, is that we are limited in our understanding and description to images in this physical world of time and space. So when people ask how long one is in purgatory they might refer to 'years', or some comment about 'in an instant', but any temporal comparisons are only attempts to understand and describe this state that many go through to get to heaven. Similarly, the image of fire has often been used with purgatory, but this again is simply an image that we can understand of something being purified where impurities are burnt away. The image is painful, as is any giving up of attachments. This is a process by which the stains of our sins, our final attachments that may keep us from the purity of heaven, need to be severed or purged.

Our prayers for those in purgatory are meant to help them through this period of suffering and to be open to all of God's grace. Fortunately for those in purgatory this is only a temporary status that always leads to heaven. May we always support one another with our prayers.

Becoming Catholic

RCIA Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Last weekend our catechumens and candidates celebrated the Rites of Acceptance. One of the most effective rituals in the Rite is the signing of the body. The signing is a direct response to the affirmation of the seekers to follow the gospel. At the beginning of the rite, the presider asks the seekers why they have come and what they are seeking. The presider then confronts the seekers with the paschal mystery. In the

section of the rite titled ‘Candidates’ First Acceptance of the Gospel, Catechumens received the sign of the cross on their forehead. It is Christ himself who now strengthens them with this sign of his love.

Candidates received the cross on their foreheads as a reminder of their baptism into Christ’s saving death and resurrection.

The signing of the cross takes place on these parts of their body by their sponsors while the celebrant speaks these words:

- Ears:** See the glory of God
- Lips:** Respond to the word of God
- Heart:** Christ may dwell
- Shoulders:** Bear the gentle yoke of Christ
- Hands:** Christ may be known in the work which you do
- Feet:** Walk in the way of Christ

After the signing took place and before they were dismissed, their Sponsors gave them a Bible.



The celebration for the Feast of All Saints' Day stems from the belief that there is a powerful spiritual bond between those in heaven and those who are living. In our Catholic theology, we commemorate all those who have attained the beatific vision in Heaven. The current date of November 1 was established by Pope Gregory III during his reign (731-741 AD) when he dedicated a chapel in Rome's St. Peter's Basilica in honor of all saints. At that time, only Rome celebrated this Feast. In 837 Pope Gregory IV ordered the official observance of All Saints Day every November 1 and extended its celebration to the entire Church. Our Assumption celebration included our 1st graders dressing as their Saint of choice, which included St. Patrick, St. Gianna, Mary, and St. Joseph.



Costume Day for Faculty and Staff

The last day of school before Halloween, the faculty and staff dress in costumes to "trick" our students, which are our "treats".
