Hello,

This last week I have been holding some town hall meetings to inform parishioners about what I have heard through the surveys that were returned, to give some of my observations or thoughts for the future so far, and to listen to more comments. This week and in future bulletin articles I will be sharing some of this information along with some of my thoughts on the topics.

The most common remark on the surveys was related to how welcoming people feel that our parish is. Many, myself included, were happily surprised to find this especially for a parish that is larger than we were used to. Credit for this goes to the parish as a whole but also in particular to the Ushers/Greeters at our Sunday Masses, who are some of the first people encountered when coming to our parish. This is also a good strength and value of our parish to keep in mind when addressing some of the other topics that often require a balance.

A comment that was repeated at least 24 times in the surveys was concern over how some people were dressed at Sunday Mass, that they didn't feel the attire was appropriate. While societal norms on dress have changed drastically over the last few decades, becoming much less formal than it had been, it is still a manner in which we show respect and reverence to God, and consideration to others gathered to worship. I have seen some people dressed in a manner that I would have preferred to be more formal, but I have not seen anyone dressed in a manner where I would not be welcoming of them and I was always glad that they came.

A more specific example of this is that many of the comments were regarding the attire of some of the ministers who assist in the distribution of the Eucharist. I strongly agree that if one is assisting in a ministry at Mass they have a greater obligation to dress accordingly than if they were not, but I also am grateful for those who have accepted the invitation to assist us in this ministry because we were in need. Our Eucharistic Ministers are not scheduled and instead volunteer at each of our Sunday Masses. It is not unusual that we need to ask people who had not expected to be ministering to help us at a Mass, especially in the summer months when many regular ministers may be on a vacation. While this has resulted in occasions when I consider a person was not dressed as I would desire for this ministry, I have always been impressed with the reverence and demeanor of our Eucharistic Ministers in their service. In two weeks we are having a workshop for various ministries and the concerns regarding attire will be shared. Recognizing that this is really of greatest concern when we come into the summer months a reminder will be made at that time as well.

Thank you again for your responses in the survey, participation in the town hall meetings, and the great welcome I have felt since coming here this summer. I pray we can continue to build up God's church here in O'Fallon.

Our hope for the short term is to get the balance of the fund to at least \$25,000 before the end of 2020 to allow us to receive our first distribution in the summer of 2021. Although this seems to be a long time from now, the end of 2020 will be upon us more quickly than we expect! Our long-term hope is to grow the fund to completely cover all of the expenses of the Chapel through current and memorial gifts.

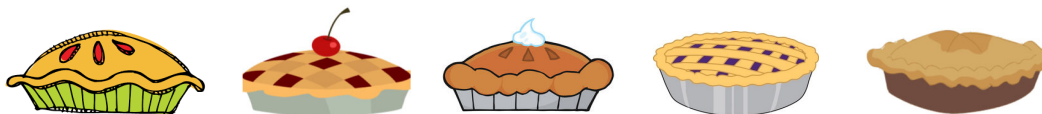

Thanksgiving Day 2019

Let’s begin by celebrating Thanksgiving together! Join us on Thursday, November 28, and we will once again have a special Eucharistic celebration at 9:00am. It is special in several ways. First let this day be a reminder that “Eucharist” means “thanksgiving”. Taking part in the Eucharist on Thanksgiving Day is a beautiful way to begin celebrating this holiday--we hope that you will join us.

We also invite you to bring gifts for the poor. These can be money or the usual items you bring for the St. Vincent de Paul Society. On this day, please *DO NOT* leave them at the St. Vincent de Paul Society Depository but bring them to your pews. At the time of the Presentation of the Gifts, instead of the ushers/greeters passing the baskets, you will be asked to bring your own gifts forward to bins that will be provided as a sign for us to see. The St. Vincent DePaul Society & Ushers/Greeters will be there to assist you.



Finally, you are invited to also bring something that you will be using at your own Thanksgiving Dinner or taking to someone else’s. Let it be anything--cooked or uncooked, that you can handle easily. Again, bring this to your pew with you. During the Intercessions, you will be asked to hold up these items to be blessed. After Mass take them home with you to be used for your meal. We hope that this will help to make a connection between the Lord’s Table and your own feasting table. In this way you are bringing God’s blessing to your own table and might even use this item to focus your meal prayer that day.

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 MC 7:1-2, 9-14; PS 17:1, 5-6, 8, 15; 2 THES 2:16-3:5; LK 20:27-38

Today's readings challenge us to focus on the "why" of stewardship. Why embrace this challenging way of life when it seems hard enough just to meet the demands of our daily lives and responsibilities? Because this life is not all there is. While we cannot earn our way into Heaven, what we do now with the life God has given us has eternal consequences. Stewardship

living helps us to keep focused on our hoped-for destination in the choices we make each day.

In our Gospel passage from Luke, Christ reminds us we were made for more than just this life, and our choices have eternal consequences. In this passage our Lord corrects some Saducees for their mistaken notion that there is no resurrection. He instructs that "those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead... can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise.

Stewardship is not about the particular amount or kind of time, talent and treasure that we offer. It is about the conviction that everything we have is a gift from our loving God. Revisiting these three aspects of our lives on a regular basis, prayerfully discerning the best use of our gifts, and putting this down in writing clarifies and strengthens our conviction to put God first.

That is the "why" of stewardship.

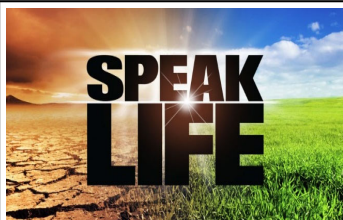

Rev. James W. Sichko is a priest of the Diocese of Lexington, KY. Fr. Jim is the youngest of five children. He was ordained to the Ministerial Priesthood of Jesus Christ on May 23, 1998. Fr. Jim studied theology at Sacred Heart School of Theology and before that, completed his undergraduate work at New England Conservatory of Music in Vocal Performance.

Known for his story-telling, Fr. Jim weaves everyday life experiences with the rooted messages which lie within the Gospel. Fr. Jim currently serves as Pastor of St. Mark Parish in Richmond, KY which includes an Elementary/Middle School, Hispanic Ministry and a Newman Center on the campus of Eastern Kentucky University. Fr. Jim is also the assistant to the Bishop for Special Projects, Episcopal Vicar for the Bluegrass East Deanery serving the Bishop on the Presbyteral Council and formerly was the Spiritual Director for the Cursillo Movement.
