## Hello,

Tonight someone told me their child asked them what was in the little triangle thing under our altar in the church. She wasn't sure, but she guessed it was a relic, and she was right, actually nine of them. In the Roman Missal, which is the universal instruction in the Catholic Church for the celebration of Mass, it states, "The practice of the deposition of relics of Saints, even those not Martyrs, under the altar to be dedicated is fittingly retained. Care should be taken, however, to ensure the authenticity of such relics." (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, # 302)

This practice started in the very early church when early Christians celebrated memorial Masses in the catacombs, on the top of the tombs of the saints. I know when I visited Rome and toured some catacombs just a few miles outside of town you could see the places where this was done. This practice was continued when churches were built and Masses could be celebrated publicly by transferring some relics to the newly constructed altars. Actually, this practice can be traced back to Scripture where it says in Revelations 6:9, "When he broke open the firth seal, I saw underneath the altar the souls of those who had been slaughtered because of the witness they bore to the word of God." Thus, while the sacrifice of Christ is made present on the altar during Mass, we also see under the altar the example of those who followed His example and were raised to heaven through His sacrifice.

Some churches actually have the remains of some very well-known saints visible through glass. I know St. Vincent de Paul and Catherine LaBoure are both in chapels fairly close to each other in Paris, France, and St. Bernadette can be found in Nevers, France. Closer to home we have St. Rose Philippine Duchesne here in St. Charles. Her remains are at the Academy of the Sacred Heart and had been transferred from their original resting place in the ground to a shrine in the 19th century. After she was beatified her remains were transferred again, and while her relics can't be seen, she was placed under an altar there.

We have relics of numerous saints under our altar that the child noticed in our church. Actually there are relics from St. Clement of Rome, St. Ireaneus, St. Liberatus, St. Monica, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Clare of Assisi, St. Vincent de Paul, St. Louis IX, and St. Rose Philippine Duchesne (only a small relic as opposed to what is at the Academy of the Sacred Heart). Three of these relics, the early martyrs St. Clement of Rome, St Ireaneus, and St. Liberatus, are encased in an altar stone. There are also documents with the individual relics declaring their authenticity and one on the altar stone for the three included there. If you want, you can listen to Fr. Patrick describes these relics (besides the ones in the altar stone) in the following videos he made for our school kids when everyone was remote learning 18 months ago.

In the category of Time, you can make commitments to spend more time with God in prayer. Prayer is the most important part of being a good steward, because when our relationship with God is strong, we are much better able to use our gifts and resources to help our parish and The Church.

#### Hands on Science is essential in Assumption's Curriculum.



The term "science" encompasses a broad world of events such as weather, the solar system, animal and plant life and more. And while students will explore these niche aspects of science as they mature through the grade levels, it is at the elementary level that the job of the teacher is to introduce science and some of its categories to the students. It is best done through visual, hands-on activities that allow students to observe and analyze a particular phenomenon, while at the

same time getting some entertainment out of it.

Assumption uses the NGSS (Next Generation Science Standards) to guide our science curriculum. These new standards represent a significant shift in teaching and learning—a shift from memorizing facts to focusing on thinking, meaning making, and deep conceptual understanding. Next Generation Science Standards and State Standards work together to provide students with engaging and enriched learning experiences.




