Hello,

Do you remember the Pharrell Williams song from a few years ago titled 'Happy?' It is a fairly simple song with simple lyrics but with a very happy beat and attitude. One of the best things about the song is if you watch the video they pretty much just have many different people dancing around to the music being happy. You can watch the standard version that goes for four minutes, or you can watch an extended version that actually has 24 one hour videos of different people dancing around to the song. I have to admit this is one of my YouTube favorites that I will go to if I'm seeing too many serious or depressing things.

Some might say this is just avoiding the situation around me, which it could be used in that way if it was out of denial or desperation. Ideally it is used as a conscious choice, not denying the reality that I am living in, but choosing how I wish to live it.

I think this example is worthwhile to consider because too often we can forgo control and also responsibility for ourselves by blaming everything on the world around us. I did this... because he did that, I feel this way... because they did this, blaming the situation we find ourselves in for everything and denying the freedoms God gave us.

The most important response like this we need to consider is love.

We know Jesus told us to love God, to love our neighbor, even to love our enemy. That last one can be especially hard, but even the first can be challenging if we are suffering and going through difficult times. We might be questioning how God could let us go through this, doesn't He love us?

And yet we know that marriage is a vow to love one another through good times and bad, sickness and health. This love is to be unconditional. That can be very difficult at times, and the choices that are made out of love may not even seem to be that way by the other party, such as when someone is addicted and they could harm themselves or others. Such choices can be very difficult, but that doesn't mean we can't make them out of love.

I used the example of being happy because I think it is a little easier, maybe simpler to experience this choice, and also one that might be useful for many of us. We are meant to be a joyful people if we truly believe in God and His love for us. So while we are working on that love for God and everyone else, we might just start with intentionally trying to be happy sometimes when that might not be our first feeling.

Thanksgiving Day 2020

Let's begin by celebrating Thanksgiving together! **Join us on Thursday, November 26**, and we will once again have a special Eucharistic celebration at 9:00am. It is special in several ways. First let this day be a reminder that "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving". Taking part in the Eucharist on Thanksgiving Day is a beautiful way to begin celebrating this holiday--we hope that you will join us.

We also invite you to bring gifts for the poor. This can be money or the usual items you bring for the St. Vincent de Paul Society. The St. Vincent DePaul Society and Ushers/Greeters will be there to assist you on where to place/drop off your food donation. (*Safe distancing measures will be in place.*)

Finally, you are invited to also bring something that you will be using at your own Thanksgiving Dinner or taking to someone else's. Let it be anything--cooked or uncooked, that you can handle easily. Again, bring this to your pew with you. During the Intercessions, you will be asked to hold up these items to be blessed. After Mass take them home with you to be used for your meal. We hope that this will help to make a connection between the Lord's Table and your own feasting table. In this way you are bringing God's blessing to your own table and might even use this item to focus your meal prayer that day.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION, that means you are not in Compliance with the Archdiocese, so please go back into your P/P account and double check your requirement checklist to see what needs to be completed and submitted. From the Principal's Pen

Pumpkin Palooza Party in Grade 4

Around Halloween, our 4th graders experienced a Pumpkin Palooza Party learning Math, Science, and other subjects by simply using a pumpkin. Students worked in groups with their pumpkin on several newspaper pages.

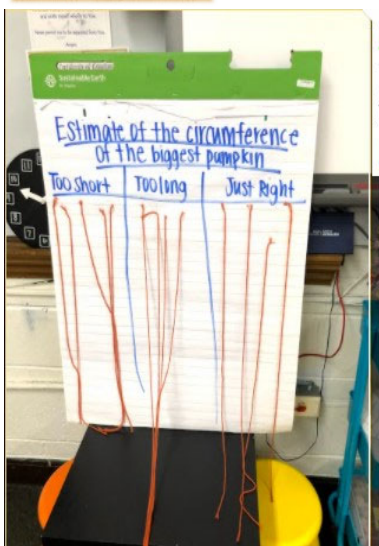
They began by measuring the circumference and height of their pumpkin, and also weighing their pumpkin. Once each group had their "answers" the entire class organized the data to determine shortest to tallest, using mixed fractions (like 10 and $\frac{3}{4}$ inches); then organized circumference measurements. The teacher then provided a worksheet and students had a short exercise on adding fractions.

Next, groups worked to dissect their pumpkin in the name of learning – yes, it's a mess, but boy, did they have fun. Scooping out the seeds (and slime), caused "eek and yuk" noises and some laughs and smiles as well. No, they didn't throw those seeds away – they were separated from the "slime" and sent home to roast. Before they were taken home, they weighed the contents of their pumpkin for comparisons. It is amazing how little the contents weighed in comparison to the actual pumpkin rind.

From an art perspective, students went to our outdoor classroom and looked at our small pumpkin patch, where we had the blossoms ready to burst forth with their pumpkins. They then drew these plants – using colored pencils. Once inside they studied the science of the **pumpkin anatomy** and learned that a pumpkin is a fall fruit! They also learned the pumpkin parts: the top or lid, the bottom called the blossom end, the tendril, the male and female flowers, stem, leaves, root, and seed – and could identify them in their drawings.

They read about pumpkins in books like, *It's not about you, Mr. Pumpkin!* (Soraya Coffelt). This book shares both the religious and historical background of the holiday. Sharing their stories with one another was humorous and informative. Students were reminded that All Hallows' Eve is a time in the liturgical year dedicated to remembering the dead, including saints (hallows), martyrs, and all the faithful departed.

Of course, there were several other activities to finish the Pumpkin Palooza and ultimately, the day is a wonderful success of learning and fun.
