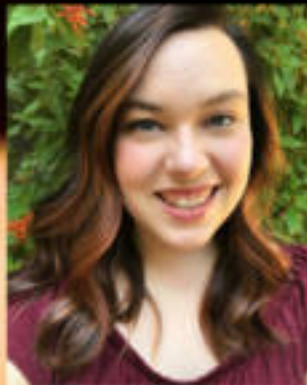

I thought for Thanksgiving I would give you a summary of the many ways parishioners have financially been generous to different charitable causes through collections here at Assumption during the last year. (Specifically from 11/1/20-11/1/21.) As you know with all of the special collection envelopes we receive each month, you can see by the table below there are many different needs out there. I am proud to see how we've responded to them.

One of the charities that has always been strong here at Assumption has been our support for the St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) Society and their work to help those locally who are in need. As you can see, we have donated almost \$70,000 through our parish (and other money is donated directly) to our SVdP Society along with food and other goods throughout the year and especially in the Giving Tree over the next few weeks.

Other support can be seen as going towards a variety of missionary works, education of clergy, communications, disaster relief and other needs. Like our support of SVdP, I realize many of you are also supporting these and similar causes directly and this is only a small portion of the generous sharing of your gifts

Every year our parishioners also support the general work that our archdiocese does through our Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). This year we donated a total of \$160,635 to the ACA that helps support Education, Social Responsibility, help for the poor, and help to keep our faith growing in our archdiocese.

Recognizing the gifts that we have received, and sharing those to help others, is a key part of stewardship and of giving thanks to God for all he has done for us. Thank you again for your generosity not only to our parish, but also to so many others throughout the year. May you and your families have a Happy Thanksgiving.

Our theme this year is Prepare your heart... a retreat of waiting. Lord, Am I at the right place? Will I try to give myself time and space for silence so as to savor the mysteries of Christmas? Do I pray? Real wisdom is to know what God's gifts to us are for. We have to be alert and watchful for all the ways he comes to change our image ourselves. THANKSGIVING DAY 2021

Let's begin by celebrating Thanksgiving together! **Join us on Thursday, November 25,** and we will once again have a special Eucharistic celebration at **9:00am**. It is special in several ways. First, let this day be a reminder that "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving". Taking part in the Eucharist on Thanksgiving Day is a beautiful way to begin celebrating this holiday--we hope that you will join us.

We also invite you to bring gifts for the poor. These can be money or the usual items you bring for the St. Vincent de Paul Society. On this day, please **DO NOT** leave them at the St. Vincent de Paul Society Depository but bring them to your pews. At the time of the Presentation of the Gifts, you will be asked to bring your own gifts forward to bins that will be provided as a sign for us to see. The St. Vincent DePaul Society & Ushers/Greeters will be there to assist you.

Finally, you are invited to also bring something that you will be using at your own Thanksgiving Dinner or taking to someone else's. Let it be anything--cooked or uncooked, that you can handle easily. Again, bring this to your pew with you. During the Intercessions, you will be asked to hold up these items to be blessed. After Mass take them home with you to be used for your meal.

We hope that this will help to make a connection between the Lord's Table and your own feasting table. In this way you are bringing God's blessing to your own table and might even use this item to focus your meal prayer that day.

There are several ways that you can get involved to help those who greatly need our assistance this holiday season.

GIVING TREE GIFTS Our Giving Trees will be up till the end of November and filled with gift needs.

STOCK THE HOUSE Neighbors in Need shopping day - This will take place on December 11th.

Our Neighbors In Need lack the necessities that we often take for granted. When they pick up their items from the Adopt-A-Family or Giving Tree, they are invited to walk through the hall and choose a gift for themselves and/or one to give. If we have enough donations, they are able to pick up other *needed* items. Below are some ideas of items to help our *Neighbors in Need*.

Our Annual Stewardship Renewal 2021!

During the month of November we kick off our parish Stewardship Renewal. Over the remaining two weeks, please pray about your role in our parish. This week is our **Ministry Festival – “Taste & See”** and each parish family is asked to make commitments of **time, talent and treasure. (Commitment Cards will be available this weekend November 20 & 21, 2021!)**

How can I fill my Stewardship Commitment Card?

After walking through our Ministry Festival and reading through our new Ministry & Membership Directory... please pray through these areas and consider making commitments:

In the category of Time, you can make commitments to spend more time with God in prayer. Prayer is the most important part of being a good steward, because when our relationship with God is strong, we are much better able to use our gifts and resources to help our parish and The Church.

In the category of Talent, you can either re-commit yourself to your current ministry/s, or sign up for new ones. Our goal is for each of us will use our gifts and skills in service for others.

In the category of Treasure, we are asking everyone to commit to giving a specific percentage of their income to the offertory each week or month for the next year. We are asking everyone to commit to giving half of their tithe— 5% of income—to the parish. If this is something new to you, pray with your family about what you **can** do.

St. Theresa of Avila says: *“Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours.”*

Maybe our own reflection from St. Theresa’s message is telling us that we are called to be ministers of the Lord’s love and mercy. We are called to recognize how the Lord is blessing us. We are called to live out those gifts and not let them lay dormant yet be alive and active and that our prayer must also be alive and active! Recognizing that our Lord gives us every moment, every breath... and we are to live those *for* Him.

It is so important right now more than ever for us to be disciples of Jesus Christ – to be on fire here at Assumption parish. How could we not continue to build up our own family here and then set our community of O’Fallon on fire, our Archdiocese, our state, our nation! It begins with a single yes to our Lord. Jesus is calling us to be His disciples. He is calling us to be His stewards of His many graces and blessings.
