Hello,

And Happy New Year! Liturgical New Year that is, as we begin Advent we begin our new year for the liturgical cycle. I think it is interesting that we wouldn't just start the new year with Christmas, with a big celebration and high point, but rather that we consider that we want to build up to that celebration, to prepare for it. This characteristic of our year I think really demonstrates that the purpose isn't just to celebrate those big days, but rather that we keep growing, from one year to the next.

In our parish this week we have a good example of that growth by a sacrament that our 2nd graders are celebrating, their First Reconciliation. All of the older students in day school and in our PSR program have had the opportunity to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation over the past couple of weeks. This is a common practice that many of us follow in the Advent season as a means to prepare for Christmas. We examine our lives, consider our sins, ask for God's forgiveness of them and help to overcome those temptations in the future. We could look at this and only focus on the sins that we've identified and only look at the sacrament in a fairly negative way (why we don't usually refer to it anymore simply as the sacrament of Penance), but we need to realize that we have recognized these sins in our life, and temptations that have led us to these sins, and not only is God forgiving them, but we are open to his help in overcoming those temptations in the future to build an even stronger relationship with God.

Consider the children receiving their First Reconciliation. They are first celebrating the sacrament now because they are just getting old enough to recognize right from wrong, to know what they are supposed to do and be responsible for their actions (in some situations). As they grow in their knowledge and abilities we desire that they also grow in their understanding of right from wrong, in their ability to recognize how their actions affect others, in their character, integrity, prudence, and many other virtues as they have the ability and opportunities to exercise them. Also, that they grow in their understanding that God is willing to forgive them and that he loves them. We know at such a young age they are growing in so many ways that we especially want to be sure they are growing in their virtues and their relationship with God.

We want these things for our children, and we want to continue to have and exercise them for ourselves as adults. Hopefully during this Advent, as we begin our new year, we look at it as one of promise and hope knowing that with God's forgiveness, with His love, we can and will all grow more toward who He created us to be in this coming year.

Feast of the Immaculate Conception 2022 – Holy Day of Obligation

December 8th is the *Feast of the Immaculate Conception* and a holy day of obligation. The Immaculate Conception means that the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose conception was brought about the normal way, was conceived without original sin or its stain—that's what "immaculate" means: without stain. The essence of original sin consists in the deprivation of sanctifying grace, and its stain is a corrupt nature. Mary was preserved from these defects by God's grace; from the first instant of her existence she was in the state of sanctifying grace and was free from the corrupt nature original sin brings. 

- 1. **Reserve your tax credit** of \$500 or more at https://treasurer.mo.gov/MOScholars/ReservationApp. Be sure to select Tomorrow Educational Foundation (TTEF) from the dropdown menu when asked which Educational Assistance Organization (EAO) you want to support.
- 2. **Submit your tax credit authorization, along with your donation,** within 30 days to TTEF. Upon receipt, they will send you a tax credit certificate for the full value of your donation.
- 3. When you **file your state taxes** for 2022, include the tax credit certificate you received to reduce your tax liability by the amount of the donation you made!

Gifts to the MOScholars program through the TTEF will be used to provide scholarships to students attending eligible Catholic schools, including Assumption, based on their family's income level or the child's learning requirements.

The Advent Wreath Tradition & Meaning

For many Christians, Advent wreaths are a favorite way to celebrate the month of December leading up to Christmas Day. Although Advent Wreaths are popular among Christians, many are not aware of the rich meaning and symbolism embedded in the tradition. If we learn this meaning, we can appreciate it all the more!

DARKNESS AND LIGHT

The Advent candles readily demonstrate the strong contrast between darkness and light. In the Bible, Christ is referred to as the "Light of the World" contrasted with the darkness of sin. Human history spanned long ages before our prophesied Savior would finally make his appearance, and God's promise to make all things new through him.

As his Advent, or "coming," draws nearer another candle is lit, with each candle dispelling the darkness a little more. Thus, the Advent wreath helps us to spiritually contemplate the great drama of salvation history that surrounds the birth of God Incarnate who comes to redeem the human race.

SHAPE, NUMBER, AND COLOR

SHAPE: The circular shape of the wreath, without beginning or end, symbolizes God's complete and unending love for us—a love that sent his Son into the world to redeem us from the curse of sin. It also represents eternal life which becomes ours through faith in Jesus Christ.

- NUMBER: The Advent Wreath traditionally holds four candles which are lit, one at a time, on each of the four Sundays of
- the Advent season. Each candle represents 1,000 years. Added together, the four candles symbolize the 4,000 years that humanity waited for the world's Savior—from Adam and Eve to Jesus, whose birth was foretold in the Old Testament.
- Some Advent wreath traditions also include a fifth white "*Christ*" candle, symbolizing purity that is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas day. Many circular wreaths can incorporate a white candle by adding a pillar candle to the wreath center.

COLOR: Violet is a liturgical color that is used to signify a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice and is used during Advent and Lent. Advent, also called "little Lent," is the season where we spiritually wait in our "darkness" with hopeful expectation for our promised redemption, just as the whole world did before Christ's birth, and just as the whole world does now as we eagerly await his promised return.

THE FOUR WEEKS OF ADVENT

During the first two weeks of Advent we light the first two purple candles. The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. On this day we celebrate that our waiting for the birth of Jesus on Christmas day is almost over. Rose is a liturgical color that is used to signify joy, so we light the single pink candle on the third Sunday of Advent.

Then on the fourth Sunday of Advent, the final purple candle is lit to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait expectantly for the soon-coming birth of the King of Kings.

Traditionally, each of the four Advent candles have a deeper meaning which is depicted in the lovely Four Weeks of Advent Pewter Wreath:

- The 1st Sunday of Advent symbolizes Hope with the "Prophet's Candle" reminding us that Jesus is coming.
- The **2nd Sunday of Advent** symbolizes Faith with the "Bethlehem Candle" reminding us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.
- The **3rd Sunday of Advent** symbolizes Joy with the "**Shepherd's Candle**" reminding us of the Joy the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus.
- The **4th Sunday of Advent** symbolizes Peace with the "Angel's Candle" reminding us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."
