Hello,

This week we celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, and the full title is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. I make that distinction because it is not unusual for people, when they hear about the Immaculate Conception to think we are talking about Jesus. (That is the Feast of the Annunciation – March 25th – nine months before Christmas.)

Unlike us, who by baptism have the stain of original sin removed, for Mary original sin was excluded from her soul from the moment of her conception. That makes her one of four people that we consider were conceived without original sin: Adam, Eve, Mary and Jesus. Sometimes this results with Mary referred to as the New Eve, (and Jesus as the New Adam) (this is even stated in the Apostolic Constitution *Inefffabilis Deus* in which the dogma of the Immaculate Conception was officially declared by Pope Pius IX).

I like this description and comparison of Mary as I think it gives me more hope for all of us. If we just think about Adam and Eve succumbing to temptation even though they were completely innocent and did not have the stain of any sin, things can seem pretty hopeless for us being able to resist temptations. But Mary, facing many temptations and challenges in her own life, managed to stay without sin. I don't consider that this means I will be without sin, but it does give me more hope that with the grace of baptism and the other sacraments I can resist temptations. I don't expect it to be perfect, but it encourages the effort and provides more hope that I am not just destined to sin. With Adam and Eve we see succumbing to temptation, but with Mary we saw the overcoming of temptations.



The image of Mary with her foot on a snakes head is a good reminder to us of the New Eve conquering over temptation and sin. Hopefully it can inspire us to be open to God's graces to overcome the temptations in our lives.

Feast of the Immaculate Conception 2022 – Holy Day of Obligation

December 8th is the *Feast of the Immaculate Conception* and a holy day of obligation. The Immaculate Conception means that the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose conception was brought about the normal way, was conceived without original sin or its stain—that's what "immaculate" means: without stain. The essence of original sin consists in the deprivation of sanctifying grace, and its stain is a corrupt nature. Mary was preserved from these defects by God's grace; from the first instant of her existence she was in the state of sanctifying grace and was free from the corrupt nature original sin brings. We will celebrate Mary's state of being "immaculate" and "full of grace" with Mass times listed here:

Assumption Robogirlz Robotics Team

During our Faculty meeting on November 11th, the Assumption RoboGirlz team presented (as a practice run) information on their project during this semester to the faculty. Their hope was to win the competition on the next day at the First Lego League Missouri Qualifying competition. The presentation included information on their self-sustaining hydroelectric generator: what it would do and why it was beneficial to the environment.

For the competition, they were required to do a presentation in front of the judges on their specific project and were given points, which then would be combined with points from their competitions. This would give them their final score.

The Robo Girlz took 2nd place in a field of 20 teams at the First Lego League Missouri Qualifier competition on November 12. As part of the competition, Addison Markelz, Charlotte Thomas, Danica Willis, and Claudia Woodside created a working, self sustaining hydroelectric generator that wowed the judges during their presentation. The girls also performed very well in the robot challenge missions where they built, programmed and piloted their robot to complete seven unique missions related to this year's "Supercharged" energy theme. 
Robo Girlz were one of three teams that qualified to advance to the Eastern Missouri Regionals competition in late January. Congratulations and best of luck at Regionals!


