# Hello,

It is the third week of Advent and the candle for this week is the one we remember most; the pink, or rose colored, candle that means to REJOICE. This is also called Gaudete Sunday, which is simply that Latin word for rejoice. We know that we are still waiting, but the time is coming near so we rejoice in anticipation.

I think this is a very fitting thought to have after our previous two weeks of 'hope' and 'preparation'. Rejoice may seem to some to be a bit premature, since we are not at Christmas yet, but I consider that it takes the hope from the first week and gives it a firmness in our expectation. Not quite to the point of presumption, since we are doing our preparation still, but with maybe a little more trust that recognizes the blessings that God has given us up to this point and looks forward to what is to come. This doesn't deny our sin and our continued need for preparation, but it also doesn't just dwell on our sins either. The fact that Christians are meant to be a joyful people doesn't mean that we are perfect, or that we don't have need to still prepare, grow, and improve and be more open to God's help, but we prepare with eager anticipation for what is to come.

To think of it in line with some of our Christmas traditions that we may be doing now, consider how you approach buying Christmas gifts. Is it purely a burden and a labor or can it be joyful, in considering what gift might truly be appreciated for the person you are buying for; being glad for the opportunity we have to help them or to show them we care. If we are writing Christmas cards not only does it share a Christmas greeting, but hopefully, might share some joy you have had over this past year in words or photos and remind you of the blessing of this relationship.

Hopefully joy is a part of all of our continued preparation for the coming Christmas.



#### Veteran's Day - Remembering our Heroes

In 1954, President Dwight D Eisenhower signed a law passed by the Congress of the United States to mark November 11th as a legal holiday known as Veteran's Day to honor Veterans from all wars. This day was previously called Armistice Day. For much of the rest of the world and especially in Europe, they continue to celebrate Armistice Day, the day that marks the end of World War I. Why was November 11th chosen to honor our veterans? Because on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918 the armistice was signed signaling the end of WWI.

Our Prayer Service was developed by the 7th Grade Class (Mrs. Chassaniol's Homeroom). Veterans from our community were invited to attend, and two parent veterans were asked to speak, Colonel Compardo and Captain Baker with our students. There words were moving and highlighted the importance of honor and integrity in life.

7th grade students entered the church and processed in holding a sign with a name of one war fought for American freedom since the 1700s. As they entered, taps was played and students lined the steps of the sanctuary holding their posters. Other 7th grade students read petitions for current military men and women, for our country, and for those that lead us.

Colonel Compardo, who wore his uniform, read the military oath that he and other veterans have taken when they joined the armed forces:

I, (name), do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; and that I will obey the orders of the president of the United States and the orders of the officers appointed over me, according to regulations and the Uniform Code of Military Justice. So help me God.

# The Story of Mary, Mother of God

Mary's divine motherhood broadens the Christmas spotlight. Mary has an important role to play in the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. She consents to God's invitation conveyed by the angel (Luke 1:26-38). Elizabeth proclaims: "Most blessed are you among women and blessed is the *fruit of your womb*. Without naming Mary, Paul asserts that "God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law" (Galatians 4:4). Paul's further statement that "God sent the spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying out 'Abba, Father!'" helps us realize that Mary is mother to all the brothers and sisters of Jesus.

The precise title "Mother of God" goes back at least to the third or fourth century. In the Greek form *Theotokos*—God-bearer—it became the touchstone of the Church's teaching about the Incarnation. The Council of Ephesus in 431 insisted that the holy Fathers were right in calling the holy virgin *Theotokos*. At the end of this particular session, crowds of people marched through the street shouting: "Praised be the *Theotokos*!" The tradition reaches to our own day. In its chapter on Mary's role in the Church, Vatican II's *Dogmatic Constitution on the Church* calls Mary "Mother of God" 12 times.

**Reflection:** Other themes come together at today's celebration. It is the Octave of Christmas: Our remembrance of Mary's divine motherhood injects a further note of Christmas joy. It is a day of prayer for world peace: Mary is the mother of the Prince of Peace. It is the first day of a new year: Mary continues to bring new life to her children—who are also God's children.



<u>December 12, 2021 — Third Sunday of Advent</u> <u>ZEP 3:14-18A; IS 12:2-6; PHIL 4:4-7; LK 3:10-18</u>

We have arrived at Gaudete Sunday (Gaudete is the Latin word for "rejoice") this Third Week of Advent, and the Scriptures take on a joyful tone as we continue our preparations for the feast of our Savior's birth.

Our Second Reading gives us cause for joy as St Paul reminds us, "The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all...." Then he gives us a prescription for maintaining this peace: "In everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Paul's instructions for obtaining peace come as an early Christmas gift. They remind us that we can and should go to God with all our needs and present them to Him along with our thanks. This guidance calls to mind a vital aspect of a stewardship way of life: gratitude to God in response to His great love and countless gifts to us.

The Gospel passage, from Luke, shows us how to live out this sense of thankfulness, making our lives a "Christmas gift" to Christ in joyful response to His love for us. When the crowds hear John the Baptist's message that their Savior is coming, they ask him what they should do to prepare. He responds, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do the same." He tells tax collectors to stop collecting more than is prescribed and soldiers, to be satisfied with their wages. In other words, he tells them to be good and generous stewards of all God's gifts to them!

As the great feast of Christmas draws near, let us rejoice in Christ's extravagant love. Let's avail ourselves of the peace He longs to give us. And let's look carefully at our lives to make sure we are indeed making of them a gift fitting for Him.
