John The Baptist

The people journey out into the Desert to hear John preach; many of them also submit to his baptism of repentance.

Then they ask, "What should we do?" It seems a glimpse of what we will see when the rich young man approaches Jesus later in the Gospel, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" (Lk 18:18). People are drawn to John the Baptizer in a similar way as we are drawn to Christ. We know John has good news for us and we know he will challenge us in ways we could not by ourselves. And we, too, may mistake John, or other prophets in our lives, for the messiah. Yet John invites us to keep moving; one more step into Jesus' embrace. We would not make the journey if our hearts, minds and bodies were not ready to follow our souls and spirit into relationship with Jesus.

And just when we are ready to jump into his arms, we learn that there is this baptism in the Holy Spirit and in fire. We can do this. The chaff has been strangling the wheat in our hearts long enough. The doubt and fear have clouded our mind long enough. Our bodies are groaning with all of creation to be truly formed anew into the very image of God. Bring it all.

When John the Baptist first heard Mary's greeting of Elizabeth, he leapt in his own mother's womb in the exact same way David danced and leapt before the Lord in the Ark of the Covenant (cf. 2 Sam 6:16 and Lk 1:44). John's whole life was spent pointing to and rejoicing in Jesus. We can do the same. Jesus has the power to free us from an ounce of chaff in our bones, from every lie we ever believed, from every sin and even from death itself. In this Advent season we choose to open our hearts to a relationship with Jesus, knowing our lives will never be the same, simply more free, more honest, more loving and more eternal.

What might this look like in our everyday experience? I encourage us to be more available in our relationships with one another. Holy conversations can open us to the abundance of God's grace which is always close and ready to be poured out. Here is a beautiful poem, from Dinah Maria Mulock Craik, which captures the message of John the Baptist and the desire of our hearts:

"Oh, the comfort, the inexpressible comfort of feeling safe with a person; having neither to weigh thoughts nor measure words, but to pour them all out, just as they are, chaff and grain together, knowing that a faithful hand will take and sift them, keep what is worth keeping, and then, with a breath of kindness, blow the rest away."

Let us follow Mary in her mission of bringing Christ to the world.

Hospitality

No Room at the Inn?



"There was no room for them in the inn" (Lk 2:7) when Jesus was born on the first Christmas. Mary and Joseph went off to a stable or cave, off by themselves, off alone. No space was reserved for Jesus when he came. There was no hospitality, no welcome. There was severe overcrowding in and around Bethlehem, and the local residents and visitors alike were unwilling or unable to receive Jesus when he was born.

The lack of room for Jesus is an age-old problem. There still is severe overcrowding. Our minds are overcrowded with news and information, our hearts are overcrowded with innumerable concerns, our schedules are overcrowded with things to do, the malls are overcrowded with shoppers, the highways are overcrowded with traffic, the airwaves are overcrowded with noise, electronic devices are overcrowded with messages. With so much overcrowding, we run the risk of not having enough room in our *personal "inn"* to receive Jesus this Christmas.

If we want to have the best Christmas ever, the most important thing of all is to make room in our hearts to receive Jesus. No matter how busy we may be, no matter how much hustle and bustle may exist, no matter how many distractions and mental preoccupations may swirl about our minds, we need to set aside time and space to welcome Emmanuel, our Savior.

Spiritual balance is crucial. It is beneficial to go off alone to meditate and pray, to converse with our Messiah and Lord in silence and solitude, to ponder the profound mystery of the Incarnation, *to offer hospitality and welcome to Jesus*. Moments of private prayer are an urgent necessity.

Liturgical, communal prayer is also indispensable. We should plan to attend Mass on Christmas Eve, at midnight, or on Christmas day. If this is a new beginning for you, beautiful! We are glad to have you back! The Mass is a beautiful way to welcome Jesus into our hearts, to receive his word in Scripture and his Body and Blood in the Eucharist. Jesus is the true gift of Christmas.

After making space for Jesus, then it is time to make space for others. The greatest gift we can offer anyone is to bring Jesus to them, to be like the Blessed Mother Mary, to be Christ-bearers, to give the present of Christ's presence.

December 16, 2018 - Third Sunday of Advent

ZEP 3:14-18A; IS 12:2-6; PHIL 4:4-7; LK3:10-18

We have arrived at Gaudete Sunday (*Gaudete* is the Latin word for “rejoice”) this Third Week of Advent, and the Scriptures take on a joyful tone as we continue our preparations for the feast of our Savior’s birth.

Our Second Reading gives us cause for joy as St Paul reminds us, “The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all....”

Then he gives us a prescription for maintaining this peace: “In everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.” Paul’s instructions for obtaining peace come as an early Christmas gift. They remind us that we can and should go to God with all our needs and present them to Him *along with our thanks*. This guidance calls to mind a vital aspect of a stewardship way of life: gratitude to God in response to His great love and countless gifts to us.

The Gospel passage, from Luke, shows us how to *live out* this thanks, making our lives a “Christmas gift” to Christ in joyful response to His love for us. When the crowds hear John the Baptist’s message that their Savior is coming, they ask him what they should do to prepare. He responds, “Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do the same.” He tells tax collectors to stop collecting more than is prescribed and soldiers, to be satisfied with their wages. In other words, he tells them to be good and generous stewards of all God’s gifts to them!

As the great feast of Christmas draws near, let us rejoice in Christ’s extravagant love. Let’s avail ourselves of the peace He longs to give us. And let’s look carefully at our lives to make sure we are indeed making of them a gift fitting for Him.

Gaudete Sunday
Third Sunday of Advent

In many Latin American communities, today is the beginning of Las Posadas— reenactments of the Holy Family's journey to Bethlehem. Posadas are celebrated in Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador and other Latin American countries. Usually neighborhoods get together to reenact the pilgrimage of Joseph and Mary before the birth of Jesus as a way to prepare their hearts for the nativity of our Lord. They go from house to house singing traditional Advent and Christmas carols or villancicos, knocking on every door, but everyone turns them down until they find one house that gives them shelter. Some parishes in the United States also celebrate this tradition as a way to pass on this tradition to young children. They are celebrated starting December 16.


