## Merry Christmas!

OK, we aren't quite there yet, but this will be the last bulletin before Christmas. While we are still in the Advent season I would ask you to consider the many readings we have in Advent from Isaiah and one of the images that we are given is that of the peace and paradise that God desires for us:

*Then the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid;*

*The calf and the young lion shall browse together, with a little child to guide them.*

*The cow and the bear shall be neighbors, together their young shall rest; the lion shall eat hay like the ox.*

*The baby shall play by the cobra's den, and the child lay his hand on the adder's lair.*

*There shall be no harm or ruin on all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be filled with knowledge of the Lord, as water covers the sea.*

(Isaiah 11: 6-9)

The reason we are given this image during Advent is the expectation of what the Messiah will be bringing. When we read it now, as they thought when it was written, it is hard to imagine that things could actually be that peaceful. It is strange that our country is not even at war, and yet some would say they feel less at peace than ever. The added stresses brought on by isolation, illness, and death from the pandemic only appear to make this more difficult. I think these images of peace from Isaiah help remind us that it does take God's help to achieve such peace, but it also takes our hope, faith, and cooperation for it to happen.

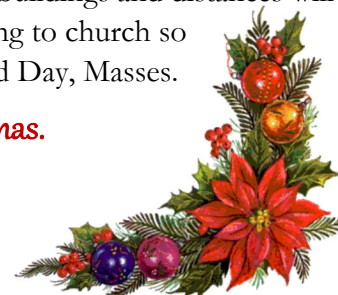
As we come to the last week of this Advent we need to recognize the challenges we have in our lives, but also know that God is there to be with us. He came to us on Christmas in the form of a child, and wants that peace that we think of on that silent night, to be ours. Let us continue to work towards it, and believe that this is what God wants for us.

I hope that you will be able to come and celebrate Christmas Mass with us this year, but with social distancing required our capacity in Church is only a fraction of its capacity other years. We have added another Mass in our chapel (10:15pm Christmas Eve), we are having our parish hall set up with the Mass streamed from upstairs and Eucharistic Ministers coming down to distribute Communion for all Masses, and I would ask that you please consider not all coming at the 4:00pm Christmas Eve Mass. This Mass is normally packed even without our social distance requirements so please consider one of the other Christmas Eve or Christmas Day Masses. Masks are required for all in the buildings and distances will be maintained. I realize some will still not feel safe coming to church so we are livestreaming all of our church, Christmas Eve and Day, Masses.

## The Story of Mary, Mother of God

Mary's divine motherhood broadens the Christmas spotlight. Mary has an important role to play in the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. She consents to God's invitation conveyed by the angel (Luke 1:26-38). Elizabeth proclaims: "Most blessed are you among women and blessed is the *fruit of your womb*. Without naming Mary, Paul asserts that **"God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law"** (Galatians 4:4). Paul's further statement that *"God sent the spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying out 'Abba, Father!'"* helps us realize that Mary is mother to all the brothers and sisters of Jesus.

The precise title **"Mother of God"** goes back at least to the third or fourth century. In the Greek form *Theotokos*—God-bearer—it became the touchstone of the Church's teaching about the Incarnation. The Council of Ephesus in 431 insisted that the holy Fathers were right in calling the holy virgin *Theotokos*. At the end of this particular session, crowds of people marched through the street shouting: "Praised be the *Theotokos*!" The tradition reaches to our own day. In its chapter on Mary's role in the Church, Vatican II's *Dogmatic Constitution on the Church* calls Mary **"Mother of God"** 12 times.

### Reflection

Other themes come together at today's celebration. It is the Octave of Christmas: Our remembrance of Mary's divine motherhood injects a further note of Christmas joy. It is a day of prayer for world peace: Mary is the mother of the Prince of Peace. It is the first day of a new year: Mary continues to bring new life to her children—who are also God's children. ~Excerpts taken from *Franciscan Media*

2 SM 7:1-5, 8B-12, 14A, 16; PS 89:2-5, 27, 29; ROM 16:25-27; LK 1:26-38

There are just five days left until the celebration of Christmas begins. Let's live these last days of Advent well.

We read in today's Gospel passage from Luke the wonderful words of the Blessed Mother's "fiat," her "yes" to God's plan. *"Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word."* These are among the most beloved words in the Gospel. But the next sentence is also important for the Christian steward.

After Mary's fiat, we read, *"Then the angel departed from her."* Our Blessed Mother was left with a lot of unexplained details about God's plan for her! Yet, she followed God's will perfectly. She gave herself and her life fully to God as a gift. She was the first disciple. We are called to follow her example today.

This Christmas let us resolve to make our whole life a gift to the One Who has given us everything. He will give us all the help and strength we need.

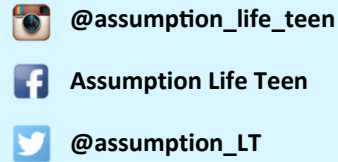

# 150<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY PARISH



A little walk down memory lane with some of our long-time parishioners who have themselves, as well as their family history, has been with Assumption from either the beginning or for many, many years. We presented some questions to long time parishioner, **Ruth Rothermich** who has a long family line and history here at Assumption. Enjoy reading...

## 7. What was your most enjoyable event in the parish or school?

I guess the parish picnic, a big even where Civic Park is at present, with fried chicken dinner, music, dance and much more. Another event I should mention – 1 day a year for 3 or 4 years a social was held on the parking lot with lights strung, tables and chairs set up and a dinner with wine. Entertainment and we served tables. Many, many people came. It was such a fun time. School – the school picnic, school plays, and the day we got Coca Cola and more.

## 8. What was the most impactful spiritual moment you experienced in our church and school?

First Communion, May Crowning, 40 hours devotion where every class prayed a holy hour during the day, no school and most walked to church. Corpus Christi procession outdoors: 4 people carried a religious artful canopy over the priest carrying the Monstrance, same one we have now, containing the Blessed Sacrament, stopping 3 times for prayers – 1<sup>st</sup> at the convent across the street at the former beautiful sunken garden, the 2<sup>nd</sup> stop was at the Altar in the cemetery and the 3<sup>rd</sup> at the front porch of the old rectory. My grandma, Catherine Katie Prinster, lived directly across the street. Several men, including my dad, took her carpet and laid it on the porch. She decorated the Altars with her flowers and Altar linens. I got to be with her a few times. Grandma was also the permanent sacristan. I would get to go with her and I vividly remember her telling me not to touch the chalice and paten because only the Sisters did that. It made me realize how sacred the vessels were and Holy Communion so very special.

## 9. What ministries do you participate in?

Well, we didn't have what we call "Stewardship" today, people just volunteered for what was needed and no committees. Had Lady's and Men's societies, CYC-Catholic Youth Council. All well attended. 3 ladies cleaned the church several years and I joined them around 1982, 38 years ago. Little did I know that I would eventually hold the title of "Chairman of Church Cleaners" because I formed teams around 1999. Sang on the church choir in 1946, taking some time off for raising my children; taught Sunday School, singing and Physical Education at Assumption School.
