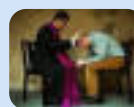

Hello,

I've been talking about our **Pastoral Planning** and our upcoming **Vision Planning 2025** for the last few weeks and describing a different one of each of the four pillars we will be discussing and this week I will address our third pillar, **Worship & Prayer**. But before getting into that pillar I wanted to mention how this planning process is particularly appropriate to be doing during Lent, which starts this Wednesday.

In Lent we usually try to get a good idea of where we are in our faith life and look at how we would like to improve. The Lenten practices we do will hopefully help us along that path. Sometimes they are things we might do every Lent. That could be a problem if it is truly something bad we do and are just taking a break from it during Lent with the intent to start it up again once Easter comes. But it could be a good practice if it allows us to better examine our lives so we can see what is going well, what not so well, and what are the hopes and aspirations for how I may improve over the next year. Our Visioning is the first step in assessing where our current strengths are, and looking towards our hopes and aspirations for the future as a parish.

Worship & Prayer, our third pillar, is one I think is a little clearer to understand what belongs here. The three main subcategories we have for this pillar are the Eucharist, other Sacraments, and other aspects of our prayer life. How we celebrate Mass as a community involves everything from the priest to the pod-casters. Music is often an area we all have an opinion on but it shouldn't just be about whether we like the style or not, but does it help us pray, participate in prayer, and fit with the readings for the Mass and the different parts of the Mass? Do we need to really work on getting greater participation at Mass, or maybe just greater attendance? And how do we celebrate the other sacraments? The preparation for the sacraments is more appropriately found under the pillar of **Formation**, but the actual celebration of them is definitely **Worship & Prayer**. And then what about the rest of our prayer lives? It shouldn't just stop with the sacraments. We have our prayer tree where we pray for others, our prayer team ministry where we pray for and with others, the rosary and other devotional prayers we might pray together or independently. Are these being done well and open to all or do we need to change or add other practices?

Obviously Lent is a great time to consider this pillar, not only being aware of how we celebrate and participate in the sacraments but also other prayer in our lives. And the pandemic is giving us an even greater awareness as we have to modify some of our practices, like the imposition of ashes this week being 'sprinkled' on our heads instead of making a sign of the cross on our foreheads.

I hope you have a good start to your Lent. And I'll see you Wednesday.

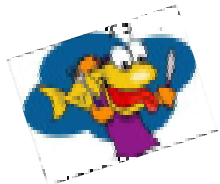



Easter in January: Follow-up -AMAZING results

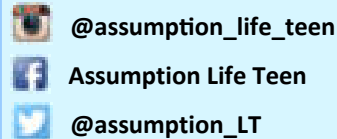

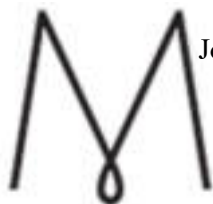

February 14, 2021 — Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time

LV 13:1-2, 44-46; PS 32:1-2, 5, 11; 1 COR 10:31-11:1; MK 1:40-45

Today's readings prepare us for the penitential season of Lent.

In our Gospel, a leper knelt before Jesus and said, "If you wish, you can make me clean." Jesus reached out and touched this diseased man and healed him. He then encouraged the man to show himself to the priest and offer himself a cleansing, referencing what was commanded in the Law of Moses. By completing these rituals, this man might be reinstituted into the community.

Let us approach this holy season of Lent like the leper. By our faults, we have distanced ourselves from God and His community. The leper reminds us Who to go to so that we might be healed. Let us approach the Lord this season on our knees asking for forgiveness and healing from our offenses, saying, "If you wish, you can make me clean." There is no doubt that, if we have a contrite heart, Jesus will stretch out His hand in forgiveness and His mercy will touch our lives.

And like the leper, we too should go forth from being healed with a commitment to cleanse ourselves from the lasting effects of sin. Lent is a time to offer acts of reparation through Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving so that we might be purified in all areas of our life and walk with the Gracious Healer, Who sacrificed His life for our sake.

This holy season of Lent is an opportunity to be healed and cleansed on our journey as *Disciples of Christ*. Let us consider what we can do to offer acts of reparation so that we might be purified and one day partake in the resurrection of Christ.
