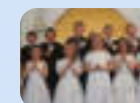

Hello,

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of another Lent. This is always a good time to evaluate where I am in my relationship with God and how I might improve it. A tool that might help to determine where you are at and to also identify what some things are that might help improve that relationship is the **Disciple Maker's Index (DMI)** Survey. The Archdiocese is asking all of us to complete the DMI as a part of the "All Things New" initiative. It should also help us as a parish, and as individuals, to consider where we are today and what we can do to make us better disciples.

The survey asks questions about the practice of your faith and your beliefs, about how the parish is doing, and how it could improve in helping you to grow your faith. All responses will be confidential and the parish will only receive information about the community responses as a whole. This information will be invaluable to our archdiocese as well as for **our parish** and our various ministries as we proceed with our strategic pastoral plans for the future of Assumption and the Archdiocese of St. Louis. We will receive the results in the late spring / early summer at which time we will share what we have learned with the entire parish.

The survey will be available from March 2nd through April 4th. I am asking you to please help and participate by completing this 10-15 minute survey as soon as possible.

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows: Ash Wednesday (March 2, 2022), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 15, 2022) are **days of abstinence** (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, **fast**, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

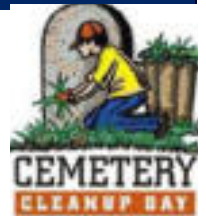

Ash Wednesday takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday, and is chiefly observed by Catholics, although many other Christians observe it too. Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us.

The Ashes

The ashes are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration of the previous year. The ashes are christened with Holy Water and are scented by exposure to incense. While the ashes symbolize penance and contrition, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts. His Divine mercy is of utmost importance during the season of Lent, and the Church calls on us to seek that mercy during the entire Lenten season with reflection, prayer and penance.

Robo Dragons

The Assumption Robotics team, the Robo Dragons, participated in their regional competition this Saturday. Because of the snow the event was moved to virtual and we competed from the robotics room in the rectory.

To get to Regionals they participated in a qualifier in which they won the Robot Performance award and the Robot Design award. They also finished the day with the top score in the robot game! With the robot game win, as well as their project presentation, they were selected to advance to the regional competition. For the virtual event they were able to do their project presentation, robot presentation and field a variety of questions from the judges. After that they then ran their robot 3 times while the judges watched and inspected the field before and after each run. The Robo Dragons top score in the 2min. 30 sec round was 405! With that they finished 5th out of 28 teams. There were only 6 teams that finished in the 400s.

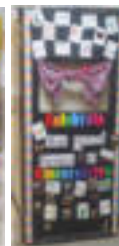

All teens are invited to join us for snacks, coffee shop style drinks, and fellowship as we take a look at the upcoming Sunday's readings.

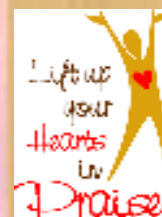

February 27, 2022 — Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

SIR 27: 4-7; PS 92: 2-3, 13-16; 1 COR 15: 54-58; LK 6: 39-45

Today's readings exhort us Christian disciples to form ourselves — mind and heart — in imitation of Christ so we can better reflect His goodness in our daily lives.

The first reading from Sirach offers timeless counsel: *"the fruit of*

a tree shows the care it has had: so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind. Praise no one before he speaks." Jesus uses the very same analogy in today's Gospel reading from Luke: *"A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit."*

Everything we have is a gift from God to be used for His honor and glory. This includes the gift of speech and, even more broadly, all forms of modern-day communication — email, text, Twitter, Facebook, and the rest. What comes forth from our mouths, or keyboard, or phone, reflects what is in our minds and hearts. Our ability to communicate with each other is itself a gift which we must steward well.

In the same Gospel passage, Jesus reminds us, *"No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher."* The more time we spend with Jesus, our teacher, through regular prayer and a strong sacramental life, the more we will become like Him. Then all that we do and say (and tweet and post) will bring others closer to Him. This is the life's work of the Christian steward. It is privileged work indeed.
