- The Archdiocese of St. Louis is in the beginning stages of a strategic pastoral planning initiative to examine all of its parishes, schools, ministries and agencies, evaluating our effectiveness as a local Church in proclaiming the Gospel and identifying opportunities for improvement and renewal.
- · The goals are:
- o To "make all things new" by Gospel renewal in our parishes, schools and other ministry efforts
 - o To enhance our evangelization efforts to those on margins of society
 - o To secure a vibrant future for the Church in St. Louis
- This initiative is in response to the call of our Lord to be missionary disciples, and to the Church's desire to "make all things new" by the Power and Joy of the Gospel.

WHY ARE WE DOING THIS? WHY NOW?

- The Church and its people continue to evolve as society evolves.
- The landscape of Catholic faithful in our archdiocese looks different today than it did even a few decades ago.
- This process will allow us to move our ministries forward to meet people where they are--spiritually and geographically--while remaining constant in mission and rooted in faith.

WHAT WILL THIS ENTAIL?

This process will affect the entire archdiocese. We are in the beginning stages of the process, which begins with prayer and listening, while also collecting data and feedback from various stakeholders--including our priests, deacons, lay leaders and faithful--which will inform the rest of the planning process.

WHAT IS THE TIMELINE?

This is a multi-year project. We are in the beginning stage of discernment, which is guided by prayer, listening, and collecting information from various stakeholders. From there, we will develop options for a strategic plan, and ultimately, we will implement a plan throughout the entire archdiocese. The information we are collecting now will help inform the plan and timeline.

PARISHES AND SCHOOLS? IF SO, HOW MANY WILL WE CLOSE?

We are in the beginning stages, so we are still collecting data and feedback from various stakeholders—including priests, deacons, lay leaders and faithful -- which will guide the planning process for evangelization. While we are not yet in a place to make any decisions regarding structures, we anticipate a significant impact on our current blueprint and will address immediate needs as they arise.



February 6, 2022 — **Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time** IS 6: 1-2A, 3-8; PS 138: 1-5, 7-8; 1 COR 15:1-11 or 1 COR 15:3-8, 11; LK 5: 1-11

Our readings today remind us of the great privilege we have in calling ourselves both children and disciples of the Most High God.

The First Reading from Isaiah describes a vision of the prophet in which angels surround the Lord proclaiming, "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!" Our God invites us to such deep intimacy and friendship with Him that sometimes we can forget just how majestic and unspeakably holy He truly is.

In the Gospel passage, from Luke, Jesus instructs Simon to lower his nets for a catch despite an unsuccessful night of fishing. Peter is skeptical but obeys and is amazed at the catch of fish that he makes. He kneels down before Jesus in astonishment.

This sense of awe and reverence before God should motivate us to deepen our stewardship way of life. As we contemplate the holiness of

God, we come to a heightened awareness of what a privilege it is that He has chosen to include us in His work of spreading the Gospel to others through the grateful sharing of the gifts He has given us. Aware of this privilege, we will then make the words of Isaiah our own: "Here I am Lord, send me!"
