



Hello,

I was reading the letters from the sponsors of those who are in our RCIA program, and I thought they were the perfect way to start off Lent. They told about each of the individuals and how they have gotten to where they are today. Some have been coming to Mass



for years with a spouse who is Catholic, others exposed to the faith in high school, the challenges and difficulties in their lives that they have faced, and the accommodations that they have had to make in order to go through the RCIA program, each a different journey. This is an encouraging example of faith, but especially as we begin Lent, is an encouraging example for me of being willing to make some changes and sacrifices in my life to grow in my faith this Lent.

It is good, and we are encouraged to look at the lives of the saints as examples of how to live our lives faithfully, but even the most recent ones can be a little distant at times. Looking at people in our lives who we recognize are facing daily challenges faithfully, can be an inspiration and the examples we may need to make changes in our lives. Fasting, praying and alms giving are three things we are all encouraged to do in Lent, just consider an example of someone you know who can help inspire you to do these.

Fasting – Of course for this one we have some specific ways in which we are obligated, fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and abstaining from meat on these days and other Fridays in Lent. Most of us can also usually find something else we can fast from throughout Lent. Most of us have more than plenty of examples around us of things we could give up, that we know others who have or are doing so, or things that can also be healthier for us. Other times it can be more severe such as trying to overcome an addiction. But sometimes it might just be a luxury, something we enjoy that we know we don't need. Foregoing it for Lent is a reminder of what the things are that we truly do need and the things we don't. Recognizing others we know who have made major changes in this way for various reasons, from health to the health of someone in their family, can be good examples to follow.

Praying – We can always do more prayers, and sometimes this is what we need. The ultimate desire should not be just to say more prayers, but to really be open to hear and follow God's will. Maybe a good way to start out Lent would be to think of someone we know who we consider more attuned to hearing and following God's will in their life, and consider what seems to be different about them that might lead to this. Many times it may not be the number of prayers, but often a quietness or just an openness to listen.

Alms Giving – I think most of us are bombarded constantly with opportunities to give to those in need and no matter who we are, we can't respond to all. Maybe we hear of one or two good charities that we could help and then look at our lives and expenses. It is easier and always possible to see someone who has more that we would like. Instead, consider some we know who have less, to help us recognize a luxury that we might forego during Lent to help others. I think we can always find more to want, but consider what is something I don't need? If all that fails you might just read through the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1-12, 'Blessed are they...'), then consider someone we know living one of those out pretty well, and think about how you might also become more open to God's blessings this Lent.



Starting with Ash Wednesday we begin our Lenten journey and The Purification and Enlightenment period. This weekend we celebrate the Rite of Sending. So what does this mean?

The Rite of Sending/Election formally concludes this part of their journey and begins a new period. Normally, men, women, and sponsors of RCIA within the Archdiocese celebrate the Rite of Election at the Cathedral with the Bishop. God is choosing those, who are able, to be disciples of Jesus. Those chosen are expected to be initiated into a life in Christ. The godparents present their testimony to the Bishop that these men and women are ready to continue their journey to receive sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Their names are presented and accepted by the Bishop. Unfortunately, since the pandemic we will celebrate this Rite at Assumption during the 8:00am Mass instead. In the bulletin this week, prayer cards are provided. These are for you to tear out and spend Lent praying for your individual(s). In addition, we will have prayer cards in baskets in the Narthex for you to take. Each

man, woman and child are invited to take multiple cards and journey with them through your prayers to the Easter Vigil. As a family, have your children draw pictures for them, write prayers, welcome them to our community. We need these returned by April 3. There will be a box in the Narthex marked RCIA Prayer Cards. The cards are given to them on our spiritual retreat day on April 10th. Again, please continue to pray for us as we pray for you.

You might wonder what Cotillion is, and why we would offer this program each year to our graduating class. The 8th grade cotillion supplements Assumption's efforts to instill respect and responsibility in each child. The skills taught assist students as they prepare to transition to high school, including skills necessary for interviewing and attending high school and beyond.

The purpose of Cotillion is that our students become more at ease with adults, their peers, and most importantly, themselves, after learning to blend manners and etiquette with dance. Melenie and Sarah Broyles of Etiquette Saint Louis teach the nationally recognized etiquette program to our 8th graders and have been featured in the St. Louis Review and have been regular guests on Fox 2, KSDK, KMOV, 550 AM.

Ladies wore a dress or skirt of appropriate length (2-3 inches above the knee, max), dress shoes and covered shoulders. Young ladies who wore sleeveless, strapless or spaghetti strap dresses were required to wear a sweater or jacket during the entire event. Gentlemen wore dress pants,

collared dress shirt, tie, and dress shoes. Jackets were desired but were not required.
