

Hello,

As we get into Lent one of the things that can often be a question is how we are approaching it, should we do something or give up something? Sometimes the same action can be described either way –

You shall not lie – Always say the truth – but even in this we realize the positive might be asking just a little more of us. I think we need to be aware of that in this Lenten Season.

Consider what you are doing in both ways. Maybe you keep the promise of not eating candy or some other snack. In addition, you might decide to try and eat something you really don't want to but you've heard might be good for you, and so you will at least give it a try. Or, perhaps you are determined to not say anything bad about someone who really gets on your nerves regularly, maybe try to also say something nice.

A challenge here is that we are always called to avoid evil and so hopefully we work at that diligently. We know there are so many needs and causes out there that we can't do every good, so we can lose focus about doing any. We need to realize that it isn't just a bonus to do good, it is necessary.

We look at the lists of the 10 Commandments and most of the laws on how to live in Exodus, Leviticus, or Numbers, and we realize the vast majority seem negative, about the things we shouldn't do or punishments if we do certain things. We need to observe those to avoid sin. At the same time, God doesn't want us to spend our lives just avoiding sin. We realize Jesus gave us the two

commandments, love God and love your neighbor (also in a form in the OT, Lev 19:18) When Jesus talks to the man who asks what they should do and they are following all the commandments, He says give up all, then follow me (MT 19:16-22). When He separates the sheep from the goats, (MT 25:31-46) the one set being condemned hasn't done anything wrong, but they haven't helped anyone either, so they haven't shown love.

As we go through Lent we often think about overcoming a bad habit, getting rid of a vice, focusing on sin. But it can also be an opportunity to develop a good habit, a virtue, to consider love. This Lent consider how we can not only avoid evil, but also do good.



March 13, 2022 — Second Sunday of Lent

GN 15:5-12, 17-18; PS 27:1, 7-9, 13-14; PHIL 3:17-4:1 or PHIL 3:20-4:1; LK 9:28B-36

In last week's Gospel, we followed Jesus into the desert where He fasted and prayed. This week, He leads us up a mountain to witness His Transfiguration. Why both experiences?



Jesus perfectly understands our humanity. He knows we need desert experiences — times of self-denial and testing — to arrive at mountain-top moments when we see and feel His glorious presence in our lives. The purpose of these two types of experiences is summed up in the description of the Apostles who were with Jesus at that mountain-top experience in today's Gospel: "Peter and his companions had been overcome by sleep, but becoming fully awake, they saw his glory...."

The reason for all of our fasting and prayer and almsgiving during lent is to be reawakened to all God has done for humanity, and to all that He has done for each of us personally. It is all too easy to get lulled into complacency in our daily routines, to "sleepwalk" through life, getting up and getting ourselves out the door, going to work, returning home for dinner and dishes, meetings, or sports activities, and finally flopping on the couch to watch TV until bedtime. While there is nothing inherently sinful in this routine, as Christian stewards, we are called to so much more!

This Lent, let us train ourselves, or more precisely, allow Him to train us to say "Yes" to His will and to offer our lives back to Him in gratitude. In so doing, we, too, will become "transfigured." This is what it means to live fully awake; this is a stewardship way of life and it is glorious indeed.

The Rite of Sending and The Rite of Election that was celebrated last Sunday formally brings to an end the cate-chumenate period, the time that these individuals have spent exploring church teachings and reflecting on the Word of God. Did you notice that only certain people signed the Book of Elect? According to the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, in the combined rite for sending catechumens and candidates (530-546), it is clear that only catechumens sign the Book of the Elect even when candidates participate in this combined rite of sending/election.

For those of us who are baptized (Candidates), we can recall that it is God who first chose us, and we responded by professing our faith and entering into the waters of baptism. In the same way, it is God who first called and chose the catechumens (unbaptized). Their signature, then, is not just a sign of their commitment to be faithful to the God who chose them; it is a sign that God has placed their names onto the roll of those who will put their lives on the line, first by dying in the waters of baptism, then by sacrificing themselves and living as resurrected people every day after.


