Hello,

We have a big Saint's day this week, and I don't mean St. Patrick. Nothing against St. Patrick, but he wasn't the spouse of Mary, and didn't help raise Jesus, and didn't get this year named in his honor. (Pope Francis announced this year as the Year of St. Joseph, in honor of the 150th anniversary of the saint's proclamation as patron of the Universal Church.)

The Year of St. Joseph runs from Dec. 8th, 2020 through Dec. 8th, 2021 (Dec. 8th 1870 is the day Pope Pius IX declared St. Joseph patron of the Universal Church). But this week, on March 19th, we get to celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. While we don't know many facts about Joseph there are a few that the Gospels give us to be aware of. First we hear of the genealogy of Jesus through "Joseph, the husband of Mary." (MT 1:1-16) This seems kind of strange to us since we know that he is not the biological father of Jesus. But Joseph will not only raise him as his son, but he also claims him as such. This meant at the time that Joseph had legal paternity and Jesus could be recognized as of the race of David through him. Joseph is also told by an angel that he is to name his son Jesus. In naming the child his paternity is also established.

Probably our most important understanding of Joseph is as a protector of both Jesus and Mary. We realize from the beginning that he considered, and could have easily divorced Mary because of where they were in their betrothal process when she became pregnant. Even when he considered divorce, he was being kind in considering a way that Mary would not come to the harm that she might. Instead, he would stay with her, protecting Mary from what could have happened to her. We realize that Joseph was protecting her and Jesus at the message of an angel, as they would then go into Egypt to avoid Herod's search for him.

This role of protector is one that is interesting when we consider he is protecting Jesus, who is God and man, and also Mary, who was specially chosen by God and without sin. What a trust in man that God puts in Joseph, to care for these two that so much will depend upon. That is why his title of Protector of the Church is important not only for us to recognize, but also to be encouraged by it. If Joseph can do this, then we can stand up for our faith and our Church when it is challenged. Not only for honor of God, but also for the concern and care for others to find God through the Church. And in return, we also have a title of St. Joseph as patron saint of the dying. As he protected and cared for Mary and Jesus, so they would care for him at his death, and he is known as the patron saint for a happy death.

As we are also one year into our COVID restrictions, and hopefully getting hope and a vaccine to overcome this pandemic, let us ask for St. Joseph's help as we continue practices to protect one another.

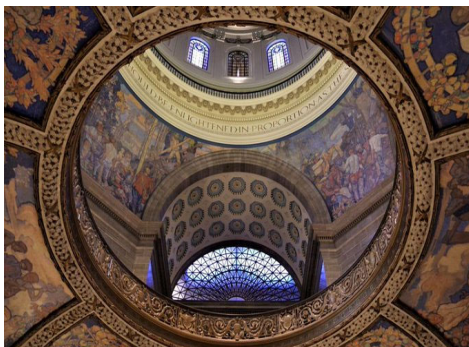

Catholic School Tuition and Tax Credits: Missouri House Passes Historic Bill! (House Bill 349)

Proponents of a measure allowing students in the St. Louis area to draw scholarship funds in order to attend the school of their choice (Catholic Schools) won a narrow victory in the Missouri House on Wednesday (February 24), sending the proposal to the Senate for debate. The measure survived on an 82-71 vote, winning the minimum number of "yes" votes necessary to advance to the upper chamber.

The proposal, sponsored by Rep. **Phil Christofanelli**, R-St. Peters, establishes the "Missouri Empowerment Scholarship Accounts Program."

It would allow private donors to give money to nonprofits that in turn would provide the scholarships, which could be used to pay for private school tuition, transportation to school and other education-related expenses. Donors to the program would get state tax credits equal to the amount they give.



Missouri House of Representatives

"This is a huge win for the many children in Missouri who need and deserve a learning environment that can best meet their needs," he said in a statement. "These scholarships will empower parents and give them options that will open the doors of opportunity for their kids. I want to thank all of my colleagues who supported this transformative piece of legislation that is focused on

doing what is best for our children," Vescovo, R-Arnold, said.

March 14, 2021 — Fourth Sunday of Lent

1 SM 16:1B, 6-7, 10-13A; PS 23:1-3A, 3B-4, 5, 6; EPH 5:8-14; JN 9:1-41

Our readings today identify the most unlikely individuals for the most extraordinary tasks. These individuals are examples to us in our lives.

In our First Reading, the Lord appoints Samuel to declare the next king of Israel. The Lord's words to Samuel about who should become king cut right to the heart of what matters in God's eyes, "*man sees the appearance, but the Lord looks into the heart.*" We often embrace the misconception that things like status and appearance are what carry importance in life. Yet, God clearly states that it is what is in our hearts that matters most. So how do we cultivate hearts worthy of God? It starts in prayer — giving God undivided attention each day. Through this time set aside for our Lord, He will work on our hearts so that they will become more like His.

Our Gospel resounds what was proclaimed in our First Reading, "*not as man sees does God see.*" Jesus heals a blind man who people assumed was born blind as a punishment from sin. Yet, Jesus says, "*Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him.*"

Jesus often worked through the most vulnerable people to show His greatest works. Like the blind man, we must recognize our need for healing and give God the authority to work through us. During these final weeks of Lent, let us ponder God's words, "*not as man sees does God see.*" May we become dependent on our Lord so that He might work through us and transform us.

He answered, "Whether he is a sinner I do not know.
One thing I do know, that though

I was blind, now I see."

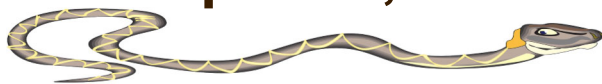

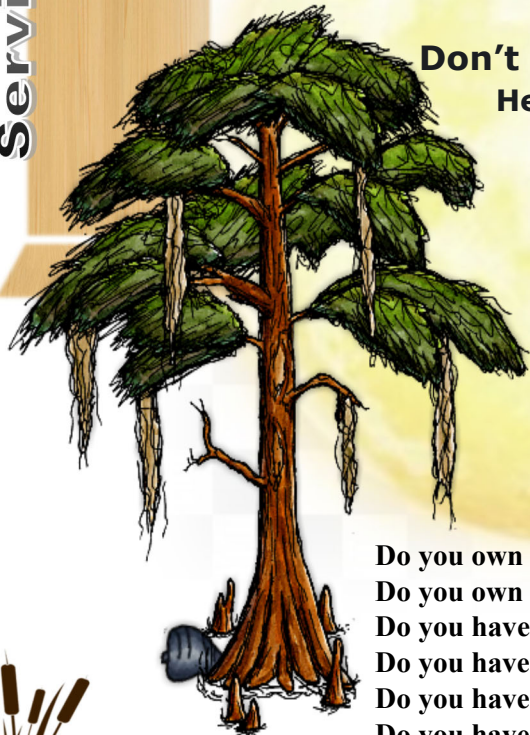

Because by Your Holy Cross, You have redeemed the world!

One of the most important reasons for praying the Stations of the Cross is that it is a powerful way to contemplate, and enter into, the mystery of Jesus' gift of himself to us. It takes the reflection on the passion out of our heads, and makes it an imaginative exercise. It can involve our senses, our own experiences and our emotions... to the extent that - we come to experience the love of Jesus for us.



How might the Scrutinies of the RCIA process help the parish as a whole?

On the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays of Lent we participate in the Scrutinies. The universal Church hears the stories of the Samaritan woman, the man born blind, and the raising of Lazarus. These readings were chosen to be the driving force of prayerful introspection, surrender, and conversion. They offer powerful images of surrender, sin, conversion, faith, and healing. (Note: the readings for the Scrutiny are always taken from Cycle A, regardless of the current cycle of readings being used. Each parish has the option of using these readings for all Masses, or only for the Masses where the elect are present. We will hear these readings only at 8:00 am Mass.)

What is the Presentation of the Creed for those in the RCIA process, and when does it occur? This Rite, which can be done at Mass or during an

RCIA session, entrusts the words of the

Creed to those seeking to enter the Catholic Church. Last weekend we presented and discussed The Apostles Creed, preparing for Reconciliation and spiritual reflections on *The Woman at the Well*.
