Hello,

It is that time of years again, yes Lent, and also tax season. I'm bringing up taxes because I think it is on many of our minds now and there are a few parallels that might help us with Lent.

First of all, I don't think anyone would want me to be filling out their taxes for them. It's not that I don't know the basics of what I need to do, but my attitude on deductions isn't exactly what most people would want their tax person to have. Most people want to get every deduction they can, and might even get a little "creative" at times. Some would consider me lazy or dumb for not taking some deductions that I can. These are some business or other expenses that I could quantify and justify, which I know are deductible, but some may be too much work for the amount you actually get back. Other deductions can fall into a category that I realize may be legitimate deductions and would be legal. Some of these, I might have questioned whether I would have made it a deduction if I were writing the law, or others that I don't want to minimize a certain contribution in my mind by taking it as a tax deduction. As I said, you wouldn't want me to do your taxes.

But the big reason why I'm OK with paying more taxes than I absolutely have to is I value the goods and services that our government provides and the society it allows us to live in. Is it perfect? Of course not. Are there things that I strongly disagree with? Yes. I think there are means by which I can try to address those things. I do feel the government is a good and necessary part of our society, not something I need to do everything possible to be sure I don't give them any more support than I absolutely am required.

So what does that have to do with Lent? Throughout all of the year, but especially during Lent, Catholic's have certain practices that they are expected and even required by Church law to do. Fasting and abstinence on certain days, attending Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation, and so on. How we look at these can be how we look at taxes sometimes, I'm not going to do anything more than I absolutely have to do. Or, the only reason I'm doing this is to fulfill the law so I won't go to jail in the cases of taxes, or I won't go to hell in the other case. A question I have heard numerous times that can demonstrate when we are falling into that type of mindset is "How late can I come to Mass and still have it fulfill my obligation?" That is one thing to ask if you were late and are concerned if you have fulfilled your obligation or not, and another thing to ask when you are looking towards the future and planning on how late you can be.

Unlike taxes, I hope we all approach our faith and the Church a little differently. That we definitely see God's laws as good, and the laws that are manmade we recognize as trying to help us live as a society to grow closer to God. So the requirements it places on us are not just burdens to minimize, but a means for ourselves and others to live as we should as individuals and a community.

I'm hoping you don't owe too much in taxes, and praying you are having a fruitful Lent.

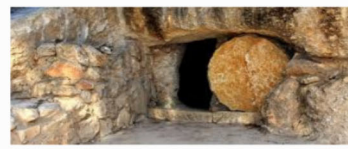

Assumption Begins Accreditation Process

Every seven (7) years, Assumption goes through a formal process known as a Non-Public School Accreditation. This requires the school to develop three (3) committees to review our current policies and practices, then each committee to develop a goal to be addressed within the next seven (7) year cycle. The committees include members of the Board of Education, faculty, staff, maintenance, parents and parishioners and are referred to as: the Catholic Identity Committee, the Educational Issues Committee, and the Institutional Issues Committee.

Between now (spring 2022) and January 2023, these committees will collect data through surveys and potential focus groups, review handbooks and policies, analyze data and policies, then create a final report with their identified goal for the next cycle. In spring, 2023, a group of educators from the St. Louis Metro region will visit the school, review our records and data and make a recommendation to the state for accreditation or non-accreditation.



The Missouri Nonpublic School Accrediting Association is affiliated with the National Federation of Nonpublic School State Accrediting Associations, which is recognized by the United States Office of Education and CASE (Council for the Advancement and Support of Education).

Our last visiting team came in April, 2016 and recommended full accreditation for Assumption. The goals that were then identified by our committees were:

1. Students will increase their knowledge of the six domains expressed in the 5th-8th grade ACRE Exam, which has been accomplished.
2. Students will increase their knowledge of the Church's Social Justice Teachings. Teachers will develop a resource and programs to further student reflection about themselves as a witness for Christ. We have achieved this goal through resources on Social Justice and increasing, across all grade levels, understanding of Social Justice Issues. In addition, several opportunities are offered for our students to help with social justice projects throughout the school year.

3. Assumption School Faculty will improve teaching and learning through the emphasis and implementation of "Differentiated Instruction" such that the needs of all students are more fully met. If you come into any of the classrooms, you will see many styles of learning – large group, small group, 1-1 teaching, teaching with technology and other resources.

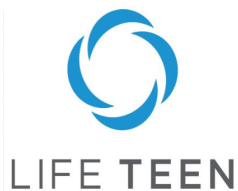
As we progress through this and next year, we will be working to identify our needs for the future. To identify needs, we will be asking parents, faculty and staff to complete surveys or be part of focus groups in August at Open House/ Book Day.

Once we have identified our needs, we set goals, then begin developing our plan of action for the next 5 years. This plan outlines our timeline of tasks which, ultimately, guide us to achieving the goals set.

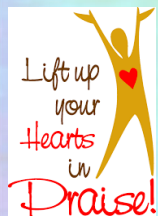

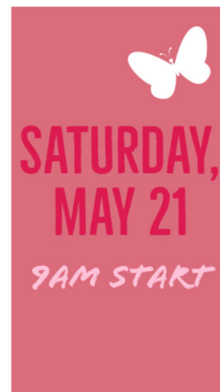

We have had a SMALL response for prayer cards for our RCIA group. Please remember to take several home with you and have the family pray over them. You will find the prayer cards in the Narthex and a basket to return them by next weekend.. It is so important that our group know that you have been praying for them during their journey.

Each week that we celebrate the Rite of Scrutiny, as we have for the past two Sundays during Lent, we are invited deeper and deeper into a great mystery that affects all people. Our world is thirsting, we are thirsting, and Jesus brings us living water. Our world is blind, we are blind, and Jesus opens our eyes. This weekend at the 8:00 am Mass we hear the story of the raising of Lazarus. We will name what keeps us, our communities, and our society from life and the true freedom of the children of God. Our Lenten preparation calls us to name what keeps us enmeshed in death and to bring it to prayer. Each reflection and celebration of the Scrutinies is designed to draw forth a progressively deeper awareness of the mystery of sin and grace, week by week. They not only open up what is sinful in our lives but also what is good in our lives. As we celebrate the last of the Scrutinies and Cycle A readings we look forward to our Spiritual Retreat Day scheduled for next Sunday.

Here at Assumption parish we celebrate a “combined Rite” with our elect (those unbaptized) and our Candidates (those already baptized). This is an intensive period of preparation for initiation of both. We pray for our Candidates who celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation this past week. They prepare for full initiation into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil.
