Hello,

This weekend our 2^{nd} graders will be receiving their First Communion. Going through practices with them on how to hold their hands, what do they say, and why we do



these things as we receive the Eucharist is always a good reminder for ourselves of the same things. The USCCB describes the posture, the manner, and the reasons for them in their document on The Reception of Holy Communion at Mass: (and we also have our COVID safe practices that we have to incorporate this year).

The General Instruction [of the Roman Missal] asks each country's Conference of Bishops to determine the posture to be used for the reception of Communion and the act of reverence to be made by each person as he or she receives Communion. In the United States, the body of Bishops determined that Communion should be received standing, and that a bow is the act of reverence made by those receiving. (your mask should also be taken off at this time so you will be able to consume the Eucharist)the significance of unity in posture and gesture as a symbol of our unity as members of the one body of Christ should be the governing factor in our own actions.

Those who receive Communion may receive either in the hand or on the tongue, and the decision should be that of the individual receiving, not of the person distributing Communion. (Although during the current pandemic it is strongly recommended that you receive in the hand. If you are receiving on the tongue you need to receive in the center aisle from the presider.) If Communion is received in the hand, the hands should first of all be clean. If one is right handed the left hand should rest upon the right. The host will then be laid in the palm of the left hand and then taken by the right hand to the mouth. If one is left-handed this is reversed. It is not appropriate to reach out with the fingers and take the host from the person distributing.

The person distributing Communion says audibly to each person approaching, "The Body of Christ." This formula should not be altered, as it is a proclamation which calls for a response of faith on the part of the one who receives. The communicant should audibly respond, "Amen," indicating by that response his or her belief that this small wafer of bread, the wine in this chalice are in reality the body and blood of Christ the Lord.

St. Cyril of Jerusalem describes the manner in which we hold our hands to receive the Eucharist by saying, "as befits one who is about to receive the King." I hope we can take this opportunity of witnessing the children of the parish receiving their first, or second, or third Holy Communion as an opportunity for each of us to be reminded of the incredible gift we also receive each time we receive the Eucharist.

What is next for those who entered the Catholic Church this Easter? We have reached the 4th period of the RCIA process, which is the neophyte year. All who were baptized and received into full communion are called neophytes in this period, until the anniversary of their initiation next Easter. It is a time for deepening the Christian experience, especially in appreciation for the sacramental life, for spiritual growth, and for entering more fully into the life and unity of the Catholic community. The neophytes now share with Christ, and his Body in the parish community, the intimate communion of the Eucharist. Now they have access to all the means of sanctification. Divine Mercy Sunday – April 11, 2021

We all receive the special graces of Divine Mercy Sunday promised directly by our Lord through St. Faustina in the 1930s! Even though you may not be able to go to Confession and receive Holy Communion, you can receive these special graces this Sunday, April 11, on Divine Mercy Sunday.



As many have been unable to come to church to celebrate Confession or receive Communion over the last year, if they are quarantined because you have the virus or you need to in order to avoid the virus we can still avail ourselves to God's graces.

Do these three things on Divine Mercy Sunday with the intention to turn away from sin in your life:

1. Make an Act of Contrition

Since you are unable to get to Confession, make an Act of Contrition, instead. As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states, "Among the penitent's acts contrition occupies first place. Contrition is 'sorrow of the soul and detestation for the sin committed, together with the resolution not to sin again''' (1451). You will be completely forgiven of all sins, even "mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to have recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible" (*Catechism*, 1452).

2. Make a Spiritual Communion

Since you may not be able to receive Holy Communion, make a Spiritual Communion instead, asking God to come into your heart as if you received Him sacramentally — Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. For instance, you can say this:

Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Blessed Sacrament.

I love You above all things and I desire You in my soul.

Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally,

come at least spiritually into my heart.

As though You were already there,

I embrace You and unite myself to You;

permit not that I should ever be separated from You.

Amen.

Again, do this act of trust with the intent to return to the sacrament of Holy Communion as soon as possible. **3. Say a prayer like this:**

"Lord Jesus Christ, You promised St. Faustina that the soul that has been to Confession [I'm unable, but I made an Act of Contrition] and the soul that receives Holy Communion [I'm unable, but I made a Spiritual Communion] will receive the complete forgiveness of all sins and punishment. Please, Lord Jesus Christ, give me this grace."

Finally, please remember that this extraordinary promise of Divine Mercy Sunday is for everyone. Tell your non-Catholic friends about it. Everyone can ask Jesus to forgive their sins. Everyone can make a Spiritual Communion. And everyone can ask for this grace to completely wipe their slate clean of not only all sin, but all punishment due to sin. Normally, the punishment is not remitted unless one has absolute perfect

contrition. And unlike a plenary indulgence, there is no requirement of having perfect detachment from sin. In other words, as long as we have a desire for this grace and intention to amend our lives, we can be completely cleansed with grace similar to our original Baptism. It is a way to really start over in our spiritual life! Jesus told St. Faustina, "Divine Mercy is mankind's last hope of salvation" [see Diary, 998].

From the Principal's Pen



It is hard to believe that we are already in April with less than 7 weeks of school left! Our Easter break just ended (literally) and we return to school Monday with so much more to teach and learn.

Currently, our faculty is reviewing our curriculum (all subjects) to ensure we are meeting the Missouri Learning Standards and also, the Catholic Learning Standards. Recently, the Archdiocese of St. Louis developed a curriculum guide which infuses Catholic faith and traditions in the curriculum of all subjects. This stems from the original document created by Cardinal Newman Center called, "National Catholic Benchmarks and Standards".

Our specific focus this year has been Mathematics, and in May we will do a re-assessment of learning – investigating the improvement in understanding Math at all grade levels. This was done back in December to look making up "lost time" while we were virtual from March through May in 2020. (i.e. assuring that students were at grade level in Mathematics)

We are in the process of re-registration and currently have 10 new families in K-8. Our Prekindergarten enrollment is moving up in the numbers and by May, I would anticipate enrollment to be about the same as this year. To promote our school, we recently sent postcards to

Assumption parishioners who have prekindergarten children. We have conducted tours of our PreK-8 campus for over 30 new families on either weekends or during the school day. By summer will know if all chose Assumption as their school of choice.

Our Mission Day is scheduled for this coming Friday, the 16th. Our donations


will be sent to Heifer International, whose motto is "Everyone deserves a life free from hunger and
