Hello,

Last Monday we had Eucharistic Exposition and Adoration for our school children throughout the day in our chapel. We ended the day with bringing the Eucharist, in the monstrance, into the church for exposition and adoration with some of our students. We concluded with benediction. Our chapel (or the old church) has been a place where we have been able to keep accessible and yet secure so parishioners feel comfortable to enter at all times of the day to pray in front of the Eucharist. This is a great blessing for our parish, but one where some of our current practices are counter to Church instructions for adoration and exposition, and so a few changes are going to be made.

I first want to be clear that the intent is to keep the chapel open for Eucharistic Adoration at all times, but this may not include exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at all times. The distinction here is that the Eucharist is always reserved in the tabernacle in the chapel and thus we can practice Eucharistic Adoration by coming in and praying in the presence of the Eucharist. Currently, the Eucharist is reserved in a special tabernacle on the main altar with doors that can be opened to a glass window, allowing a simple manner in which the Eucharist can be exposed and visually seen. This allows us to view the Eucharist while we pray. The problem is that the Church instructs us in *Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside Mass* (HCW) that “The holy Eucharist is to be reserved in a solid tabernacle. It must be opaque and unbreakable.” (HCW, 10) Further explanations of this document and answers to specific questions specifically describe that this does exclude the use of tabernacles with windows. The use of a monstrance is prescribed for exposition.

Beginning June 1st we plan to use a monstrance for exposition of the Eucharist in our chapel, but that will require some organization and commitment. Ideally at least two people will be in the presence of the Eucharist during any period of Exposition, with at least one being required. If it is not possible to have an uninterrupted period of exposition because of too few worshipers, the Blessed Sacrament must be replaced in the tabernacle during the period which has been scheduled and announced beforehand. This reposition may not take place more often than twice during the day. (cf. HCW, 88) For these reasons we are planning to begin a schedule over the next month to determine whether we will be able to establish perpetual adoration (where someone has committed to be in the presence of the Eucharist each hour during the week) or otherwise have certain periods in which we can be assured that people will be present for exposition.

Susan Prinster has agreed to coordinate this effort and we are looking to use an online program that will help us with scheduling and getting substitutes when needed for adoration. We would also have a means for those not using computers to sign up and participate. Please consider if you will be able to commit to a holy hour of adoration, more information will be coming in the next month both in the bulletin and in the chapel. We hope to be able to continue and grow in our tradition of Eucharistic Adoration here at Assumption to give Him honor and praise and grow closer as His Church. Peace,





April 25, 2021 — Fourth Sunday of Easter

ACTS 4:8-12; PS 118:1, 8-9, 21-23, 26, 28, 29; 1 JN 3:1-2; JN 10:11-18

On this fourth Sunday of Easter, we hear that Jesus is the Good Shepherd and we are His sheep. Our readings today call us to reflect inward — do we allow Jesus to shepherd our lives?

In our Gospel Jesus reveals His radical love for us. He says, "*I will lay down my life for the sheep.*" Jesus tells us that we are His. We can compare this relationship to that of a loving parent to their child. The parent gives without much in return, and if any evil came near the child, the parent would do anything, even lay down their life for their baby.

We are Christ's, even more than a child is to a parent. He created us and sustains our lives each day. Evil persists in our world, so Jesus willingly laid down His life for us at Calvary for our salvation. He is our Good Shepherd, whether we remain in His flock or go astray.

But just as a baby is happiest in the arms of a parent, so too are we happiest in the flock of our Shepherd. And just as sheep go astray, we also stray from God, test our limits and even follow false shepherds.

Thankfully our Shepherd is a Good Shepherd, and He laid down His life for us knowing every sin we will ever commit. Therefore, let us examine our hearts and return to our flock. We don't even need to find the way. He is right there always waiting to guide us home.

Let us look inward this week and ask ourselves, '**who is my Shepherd?**' and '**have I gone astray?**' Name the areas in your life that you have neglected. Ask Jesus to bring you home. Pray for His mercy, seek His forgiveness in the sacraments and begin again.



Benefits of Assumption School

In a time where public school districts are cutting teachers from their ranks, Assumption continues to serve its student population by having small class sizes and instructional aides for all grade levels.

With the average class size of 23 students, we know our students by name, see them as individuals made in God's likeness, and work to help each become the person God intended by educating the whole person: mind, body and spirit.

Research continues to show that students who begin with a strong educational foundation develop confidence and pride. So, Assumption has created instructional aide positions across all grade levels and has expanded the Learning Consultant positions to include an Early Childhood consultant. To assist all students in the classroom, we provide instructional aides (formerly called teacher aides). We changed the name because the aide now works with the students while in the classroom. The Aides responsibilities could include small group activities or individual growth practices with a student. The teacher determines where the needs are on a particular day, and the instructional aide's work complements the teacher's plan.

Beginning in Pre-School, each class has an assigned full-time instructional aide. We currently offer both Pre-School (full time and part-time) for 3 year olds and also for 4 year olds – four (4) classrooms in all. In Kindergarten, their instructional aide is shared each day between both classrooms, and likewise for grade 1 and for grade 2. As students become older, more confident and capable, there is one aide shared for students of grades 3, 4 and 5; likewise one aide is shared for grades 6-8. To ensure that each student begins his/her formal education with a sound foundation at each grade level, we have an Early Childhood Learning Consultant (PreK -1st), a Lower Grade Learning Consultant (Gr.2-5) and a Middle School Learning Consultant (Gr.6-8). Each Learning Consultant has the responsibility to identify any issue a student might encounter in their learning process. If a student does have an educational difficulty, the Learning Consultant works with parents, teacher and student to address the needs. The Learning Consultant can also contact the local public school district to access testing for the child.

Through testing, we are able to identify what learning strategies are best for that child. Once testing and learning strategies for the child are determined, the Learning Consultant works inside the classroom with those students providing direct contact to the student while they are learning. In addition, the Learning Consultant can meet with students in her office, to help in Math or Reading, help a student learn study skills, provide extended time testing, or offer assistance in any other area of need.
