Kappy Mather's Day,

From Ancient Greece and Rome the remote origins of Mother's Day are found in celebrations honoring mother goddesses. Christian Europe used it to honor Mary, mother of Christ, and also to honor a person's "Mother Church", the church in which they were baptized. It was then expanded to honor all mothers and would be a particular time when people traveled home where they would be able to visit both their "Mother Church" as well as their mothers.

St. Louis has a well-known quote about his "Mother Church". "I think more of the Church of Poisse where I was baptized than I do of the Cathedral of Rheims where I was crowned king. The latter I will lose at death, but the former is my passport to eternal life." (Saint Louis IX, King of France). St. Louis compares his baptism as more important than his being crowned as king, the thing that most people would envy him for or consider what he is most well known. What are important things in our lives that we might need to compare with our baptisms? Our careers? A particular skill or talent? Our wealth? Maybe your marriage or your family? We know that these things don't have to be in contradiction or competition with our faith. St. Louis demonstrated this in the way he lived out his role as king, yet we also have to consider what we truly value more. I think most of us are already reflecting about that on Mother's Day, just by taking the time and effort to recognize how important our mothers are to us. Hopefully as we celebrate our mothers today, it doesn't have to be in conflict with the great gift of our baptism, and of our faith, but rather for most of us it will be another aspect that we are grateful to our mothers for. I know I hear from many mothers that the one thing they want is for all of their children to live faithful lives. The following blessing is one way we will recognize that at Mass on Mother's Day:

Loving God,

as a Mother gives life and nourishment to her children, so you watch over your Church.

Bless these women,

that they may be strengthened as Christian Mothers.

Let the example of their faith and love shine forth.

Grant that we, their sons and daughters,

may honor them always

with a spirit of profound respect.

Grant this through Christ our Lord.

What's next for our Neophytes and Candidates?

We ask them, in various ways, how they have encountered God in their lives. Now that they have completed RCIA, it is time to strengthen their faith and continue to remain faithful. For everything that they learned through the RCIA process, there is still so much more to learn. "Personally, I have learned more about the Catholic faith after RCIA, than I did during the process and as a born Catholic. After RCIA, I was left with a thirst and a hunger to learn more. The more I learn; the more I want to know" were comments from our sponsors and new Catholics. We had a wonderful discussion last weekend on the mass and the communion of Saints. Rachel was saying how she felt such warmth and love during the Easter Vigil Mass when the Litany of the Saints was sung. How she felt that everyone in heaven, God, Angels, and saints were looking directly at her and praying for her. This happens at every Mass. One of the greatest things of the Catholic Church is the strong bond that we share together as Catholics. Cherish it.

From the Principal's Pen

TIMOTHY JOHNSON PLACES 9TH IN STATE CHESS TOURNEY

The Missouri Chess Association hosted the Missouri State Scholastic Chess Championship on Saturday at Battle High School in Columbia on Saturday, March 19th. Ranging from kindergartners to seniors in high school, more than 200 students from across the state dueled with chess pieces in-person for the first time since 2019. Winners of the fifth grade and under and the eighth grade and under divisions will represent Missouri in national chess tournaments. Timothy Johnson, Assumption 6th grader, placed 9th in the state for the 6th grade division.

METAMORPHOSIS: (in an insect or amphibian) The process of transformation from an immature form to an adult form in two or more distinct stages. Assumption Kindergarteners experienced a marvel over the last 3 weeks of school. Tiny black caterpillars arrived one day, and were placed inside a netted cage. Green leaves were placed in the cage, allowing the caterpillars to eat. In time, they were almost 2 inches long... changing colors to black and brown. Students watched in amazement as the creatures created a chrysalis ((moths have cocoons), hiding while their transformation occurred. Between 7 and 10 days passed, and the newly formed butterflies began eating the chrysalis for nutrition and this caused them to be free. As they came out with wet wings, they had to spread and move them to dry. Once they were dry, they were able to fly. Students placed orange pieces in the cage, so that the butterflies could eat the sweet nectar. Now the netted cage, has the butterflies and the old chrysalis which hangs from the side of the cage. Tomorrow, students are letting their butterflies fly free.

Recapping our School Improvement Planning Process

Every seven (7) years, Assumption goes through a formal process known as a Non-Public School Accreditation. This requires the school to develop three (3) committees to review our current policies and practices, then each committee to develop a goal to be addressed within the next seven (7) year cycle. The committees include members of the Board of Education, faculty, staff, maintenance, parents and parishioners and are referred to as: the Catholic Identity Committee, the Educational Issues Committee, and the Institutional Issues Committee. Between now (spring 2022) and January 2023, these committees will collect data through surveys and potential focus groups, review handbooks and policies, analyze data and policies, then create a final report with their identified goal for the next cycle. In spring, 2023, a group of educators from the St. Louis Metro region will visit the school, review our records and data and make a recommendation to the state for accreditation or non-accreditation.

The Missouri Nonpublic School Accrediting Association is affiliated with the National Federation of Nonpublic School State Accrediting Associations, which is recognized by the United States Office of Education and CASE (Council for the Advancement and Support of Education).

Our last visiting team came in April, 2016 and recommended full accreditation for Assumption. The goals that were then identified by our committees were:

- 1.Students will increase their knowledge of the six domains expressed in the 5th-8th grade ACRE Exam, which has been accomplished.
- 2. Students will increase their knowledge of the Church's Social Justice Teachings. Teachers will develop a resource and programs to further student reflection about themselves as a witness for Christ. We have achieved this goal through resources on Social Justice and increasing, across all grade levels, understanding of Social Justice Issues. In addition, several opportunities are offered for our students to help with social justice projects throughout the school year.
- 3. Assumption School Faculty will improve teaching and learning through the emphasis and implementation of "Differentiated Instruction" such that the needs of all students are more fully met. If you come into any of the classrooms, you will see many styles of learning – large group, small group, 1-1 teaching, teaching with technology and other resources.

As we progress through this and next year, we will keep you posted on information and goals. In addition, we will be asking parents, faculty and staff to complete surveys or be part of focus groups to gather information.

We will begin our surveys of parents in August at our Sunday, Open House and Book Day.



Learn to Hear with Your Heart

Acts 13:14, 43-52 Revelations 7:9, 14b-17 John 10:27-30

Words are spoken by a voice. Some voices are shrill

and high-pitched, while others are warm and soothing. The words spoken by that voice communicate meaning as well as emotion. We sense the emotion through the speed and intensity of the words used, not to mention non-verbal body language.





All this lead up is simply to ask one question: what does Jesus' voice sound like to you?

There are many voices that call for our attention throughout the day. We find ourselves being pulled in hundreds of directions trying our best to give our full attention to those voices and addressing their needs. Jesus' voice is that tiny, still voice that speaks in the silence of the heart, which is the organ to hear his voice, not the mind and not the ears. It does not demand our attention, but patiently waits for our attention to be given. His voice speaks nothing else but love, but our hearts drown out his voice because the other voices are clanging and clamoring, and our tendency is to go where the volume is loudest because it is certain, not where the volume to softest.

As one matures in the spiritual life, they discover the voices that call for our attention can be whittled down to three: the voice of the world, the voice of the Evil one, and the voice of God. It takes time to learn how to discern between these, but this skill is of utmost importance in order for us to navigate through the complexities of the modern world and of our daily lives. Having regular faith conversations with a men's or women's sharing group is certainly helpful, as is seeing a spiritual director regularly. But most importantly, this skill is learned in mo-

ments of personal prayer. For it is in these moments, when the heart finally seeks the Lord, He will speak. When you've listened, then act. Do what He tells you. Follow the example of Jesus who did the will of his Father. ~ Br. John-Marmion Villa




