

Happy Mother's Day,

As it is Mother's Day today I thought I would share some of Pope Francis's comments in his Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation "On Love in the Family". This document can help us see the ideal that God hopes for all families, and hopefully helps us challenge ourselves and one another to strive for all that God wants for us and for us to be. In the following paragraphs he talks about the special gift of mothers to their children and to all of society from the section on "The love of a mother and a father" (p 172-177).

We acknowledge as legitimate and indeed desirable that women wish to study, work, develop their skills and have personal goals. At the same time, we cannot ignore the need that children have for a mother's presence, especially in the first months of life. Indeed, "the woman stands before the man as a mother, the subject of the new human life that is conceived and develops in her, and from her is born into the world". The weakening of this maternal presence with its feminine qualities poses a grave risk to our world. I certainly value feminism, but one that does not demand uniformity or negate motherhood. For the grandeur of women includes all the rights derived from their inalienable human dignity but also from their feminine genius, which is essential to society. Their specifically feminine abilities – motherhood in particular – also grant duties, because womanhood also entails a specific mission in this world, a mission that society needs to protect and preserve for the good of all.

p174. "Mothers are the strongest antidote to the spread of self-centered individualism... It is they who testify to the beauty of life". Certainly, "a society without mothers would be dehumanized, for mothers are always, even in the worst of times, witnesses to tenderness, dedication and moral strength. Mothers often communicate the deepest meaning of religious practice in the first prayers and acts of devotion that their children learn... Without mothers, not only would there be no new faithful, but the faith itself would lose a good part of its simple and profound warmth... Dear mothers: thank you! Thank you for what you are in your family and for what you give to the Church and the world".

p175. A mother who watches over her child with tenderness and compassion helps him or her to grow in confidence and to experience that the world is a good and welcoming place. This helps the child to grow in self-esteem and, in turn, to develop a capacity for intimacy and empathy.



Mission Day is an annual event sponsored by Mrs. Ryan and our 8th graders. This year, the mission's focus was "Heifer International", an organization whose goal is to end poverty and hunger. "Heifer" works toward their goal by asking businesses, organizations, schools and individuals to schedule some activities or a drive to raise money. This money is sent to "Heifer" where pigs, cows, alpaca, chickens, etc. are purchased for

families in 21 countries around the world. In addition, "Heifer" educates the families about taking the animal resources to feed themselves (eggs, milk, etc.) and also develop a small business where selling eggs, milk, wool, etc. will help them sustain their livelihood.

This entire week, our students were educated through prayer services

organized and lead by our 8th graders, through movies from "Heifer" and lesson plans about the 21 countries and families from around the world, and through Ac-

tivities on Mission Day: Pin the tail on the Heifer, Lasso the Heifer, and creating Heifer Masks to wear. Our students on Friday the 16th had Jog-A-Thons and raffles to help raise monies for the program.

Thanks to our students and their families, we raised \$3,164.



The Ascension of the Lord – May 16



A Reflection on Jesus' Ascension ~ by The Word Among Us

On the feast of the Ascension, we are called to rejoice both in Jesus' victory over sin and death and in the glorious life that he has secured for us. We pray that we would experience the new life that is ours in Christ.

Three aspects of that new life stand out in the Second Reading for the feast: "May you know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power in us who believe" (Ephesians 1:18-19). As Christians, our hope is secure because it rests in Jesus' death and resurrection. Because Jesus has overcome sin forever, we can live in freedom and peace, no matter what situations we may face. We have been reconciled to God. We are no longer strangers. Every day, we can live in confidence, knowing that our God is with us to strengthen and comfort us.

Our hope is also founded in the inheritance Jesus won for us—none other than being with our Father forever, knowing him intimately, in all his splendor and beauty. In his ascension, Jesus has opened the door for us. Though we are sinners, we have been forgiven and redeemed. We are now fully loved and accepted as God's children, and we will live with him forever.

As we live every day in the hope of our eternal inheritance, however, we can begin to taste these blessings here and now. This is part of the "immeasurable greatness of his power in us who believe."

Before he returned to his Father, Jesus promised his disciples that anyone who believed in him would be able to cast out demons, heal the sick, and perform signs and wonders in his name (Mark was Pry the power of the Hely Spirit, who lives incide of us. The same Spirit who reject Legus from the

16:17-18). How? By the power of the Holy Spirit, who lives inside of us. The same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead is in our hearts, inviting us to yield to him and empowering us to live in the victory of the resurrection. No challenge is too great for a child of God!

Points for Meditation:

As the disciples watched Jesus being lifted up to heaven, do you think that they would have been tempted to feel abandoned and panicked about their risen Lord leaving the earth?

Think of a time in your life when you felt as if Jesus had abandoned you. How can Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:5,8) bring you comfort at such a time?

Exercise your hope today by calling to mind Jesus' death and resurrection and the salvation he won for you on the cross. How can you more fully place your hope and confidence in these truths?

Have you "tasted" the blessings here and now of your eternal inheritance? Ask God for a powerful outpouring of his Spirit so that he can manifest his power in your life.

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, we rejoice in your ascension to the Father's right hand. Thank you, Lord, for offering us a share in your heavenly life. By your Spirit, help us to lay hold of our inheritance in you—the hope, the glory, and the power that are the right of every child of God.


