

Hello,

Yesterday our parish 8th graders received the Sacrament of Confirmation at the Cathedral. When I was confirmed in Milwaukee we didn't receive the sacrament until we were in high school, requiring us to attend religion classes at our parish for Confirmation whether we were attending public or Catholic high schools. Other dioceses have Confirmation for their children as early as 2nd grade. So what is best and why?

Actually the why is where you should start when discussing the proper age for Confirmation. Canon Law tells us that "at about the age of discretion unless the conference of bishops has determined another age." (Canon 891) In the United States it ranges from 2nd grade through early high school. The difference being if there is a greater emphasis on maintaining the proper order of the sacraments, in which case you would receive Confirmation before your First Communion as the completion of your sacraments of initiation, or should we delay this until 8th grade or high school in order for the children to be better prepared?

The sacrament originally was celebrated with baptism, which is still the case for most Eastern Catholic Churches. When a child is baptized they will be Confirmed and also receive their First Communion. In the Latin Catholic Church we have separated these sacraments. A child is to be baptized within the first few weeks after birth, or as soon as possible if they are in danger of death. Since the bishop couldn't possibly be present for this throughout his entire diocese, and the proper minister for Confirmation is the bishop, Confirmation was celebrated later when the bishop would be able to come to each parish. Once they were separated, other reasons than just waiting for the bishop started to be considered. We describe the age when a child can receive their First Communion as the age of reason and the child can understand what they are doing to some degree. For Confirmation the person is to be able to renew their baptismal promises themselves, as opposed to just having their parents or godparents say them. This is a logical distinction, if we can wait, why not wait until the person can do this for themselves? And yet this can lead to a different problem.

If we start focusing too much on what the individual can do, it can begin to seem like they have earned or deserve the sacrament because of something they did. The sacraments are gifts from God that we are to be open to their graces. When we are better prepared we are hopefully more open to these graces. As we get older and more independent we definitely can be more in need of graces, but we don't want to start thinking that by doing so many service hours and passing certain tests that we have earned or achieve these graces.

The sacrament of Confirmation strengthens the gifts of the Holy Spirit that we received at our Baptism. It also more firmly obliges us to be witnesses and defenders of our faith. From this description, I think 8th grade sounds like an appropriate time to receive this sacrament. We should keep those who have received the sacrament in our prayers. But maybe it is most important for us who have received the sacrament is to be reminded and encouraged to live it out, as witnesses and defenders of the faith in our lives.

May 16, 2021 Ascension of the Lord ACTS 1: 1-11; PS 47:2-3, 6-9; EPH 1:17-23; MK 16:15-20

Today, we celebrate the great feast of the Ascension of our Lord, that glorious moment when Jesus, 40 days after

His resurrection, was lifted up — quite literally— into heaven, as the apostles watched in stunned amazement. It is recounted in our first reading from Acts. It must have been an extraordinary thing to witness.

But the first reading tells us that the apostles were not permitted to simply bask in the moment for very long. "While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?'"

In other words, "Don't just stand there, do something!"

This verse is a call to each one of us Christian stewards this very day. We have been given every grace and blessing through the Mass and all of the sacraments, through the Word of God, the rich teachings of our faith, and even our talents and our material possessions

And like those first apostles, we are not meant to just stand here, but to do something with these gifts — in love and gratitude to the One Who gave them to us. We are called, just as much as the first apostles "to be [His] witnesses... to the ends of the earth," not with our own power, but through the power of the Holy Spirit in us.

We are so proud of our NJHS members for their hard work and dedication to service, making the community a cleaner, healthier place to live!




2nd graders took a nature walk on Monday to discover all that they could see, hear, taste, touch, and smell among nature. Then they chose one of these items to write more about, using beautiful wording

to express themselves as young poets!





To celebrate Poetry Month, April, every 2nd -5th grader created a poems after studying cinquain, haiku, acrostic, concrete, free form and many other forms of poetry. Each student picked a poem they had written and designed a leaf with their poem. All of the leaves (poems) are displayed on the Poet-Tree located in the main hallway for all classes to see.



Most everyone, young and old, enjoys consuming gummy bears. They are chewy, juicy and sugary sweet! And speaking of sugar, each and every gummy bear is packed full of energy. Just how much can be qualitatively

demonstrated by "The Exploding Gummy Bear" or more accurately by "The Rapid Oxidation of Sugar", which Assumption 8th graders accomplished in Science class.

First, students needed to understand the use of Bunsen Burners in Science class by learning the parts of the burner, safety measures and how to light the burner. Each of the students were able to earn a Bunsen Burner License. A gummy bear is dropped into an ignition tube containing a small amount of molten potassium or sodium chlorate. The gummy bear is rapidly consumed in a ball of fire liberating a lot of smoke in the process.

(Yes, we did have smoke in our hallways, but NO fire!!!)


