Hello,

Yesterday, May 21st, we celebrated the feast day of St. Christopher Magallanes and his companions, martyrs. I think it is amazing that for saints who lived so close (in Mexico) and so



recently (they died last century between the years of 1915 and 1937) that I know so little about them, almost nothing at all until very recently.

St. Christopher is honored as a martyr in the Catholic Church for dying for his faith, but he also died for his country. The period over which these martyrs died, 1915-1937, is referred to by some as the Cristero movement, and by others as the Cristero War. How ever it is referred to, we recognize that the purpose, as in most conflicts within a country, is not to destroy the country but rather to change it. Instead of moving somewhere else where they thought they would be able to freely practice their faith they desired to stay where they were and do what they could to allow them and others to continue to practice their Catholic faith there. This was in response to restrictive laws on the practice of Catholicism even to the point that the celebration of Mass was banned in some areas. When being put to death without a trial, St. Christopher is reported to have said, "I die innocent, and ask God that my blood may serve to unite my Mexican brethren," seeking an end to conflict and a freedom to practice their Catholic faith in Mexico.

I think the story of St. Christopher and his companions is also important for us to recognize, not just because it was so recent and so close, but also because it was in a country we normally just assume as mostly Catholic. Recognizing that even when something is supported by a majority, even if something is right, it doesn't mean it will be allowed or enforced. Sometimes we are called to act and sacrifice for such causes. The movie "For Greater Glory" was released in 2012 and is about the Cristero movement. As in all movies and books it presents a dramatic presentation of the events that different people have different perspectives on. It can encourage us to learn more about St. Christopher, his companions, and to consider what we would do if our freedom to practice our faith was challenged.

The Ascension of the Lord – May 29

A Reflection on Jesus' Ascension ~ by The Word Among Us

On the feast of the Ascension, we are called to rejoice both in Jesus' victory over sin and death and in the glorious life that he has secured for us. We pray that we would experience the new life that is ours in Christ. Three aspects of that new life stand out in the Second Reading for the feast: *"May you know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasura-*

ble greatness of his power in us who believe" (Ephesians 1:18-19).

As Christians, our hope is secure because it rests in Jesus' death and resurrection. Because Jesus has overcome sin forever, we can live in freedom and peace, no matter what situations we may face. We have been reconciled to God. We are no longer strangers. Every day, we can live in confidence, knowing that our God is with us to strengthen and comfort us.

Our hope is also founded in the inheritance Jesus won for us—none other than being with our Father forever, knowing him intimately, in all his splendor and beauty. In his ascension, Jesus has opened the door for us. Though we are sinners, we have been forgiven and redeemed. We are now fully loved and accepted as God's children, and we will live with him forever.

As we live every day in the hope of our eternal inheritance, however, we can begin to taste these blessings here and now. This is part of the "immeasurable greatness of his power in us who believe." Before he returned to his Father, Jesus promised his disciples that anyone who believed in him would be able to cast out demons, heal the sick, and perform signs and wonders in his name (*Mark 16:17-18*). How? By the power of the Holy Spirit, who lives inside of us. The same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead is in our hearts, inviting us to yield to him and empowering us to live in the victory of the resurrection. No challenge is too great for a child of God!

Points for Meditation:

As the disciples watched Jesus being lifted up to heaven, do you think that they would have been tempted to feel abandoned and panicked about their risen Lord leaving the earth? Think of a time in your life when you felt as if Jesus had abandoned you. How can Jesus'

- promise of the Holy Spirit (*A cts 1:5,8*) bring you comfort at such a time?
- Exercise your hope today by calling to mind Jesus' death and resurrection and the salvation he won for you on the cross. How can you more fully place your hope and confidence in these truths?

Have you "tasted" the blessings here and now of your eternal inheritance? Ask God for a powerful outpouring of his Spirit so that he can manifest his power in your life.

Lord Jesus, we rejoice in your ascension to the Father's right hand. Thank you, Lord, for offering us a share in your heavenly life. By your Spirit, help us to lay hold of our inheritance in you—the hope, the glory, and the power that are the right of every child of God.

Using Science and Social Studies, students in 6,7 and 8th were faced with a pretend situation: a fire burned down the library. Based on collected evidence, which included interviewing people (like the principal, teachers and secretaries), taking fingerprints, using the science lab and comparing this information to the known facts, students identified who they believed was the arsonist: Mrs. Sheri Cronin.

Like everything in the initiation process, mystagogy is the work of the Spirit. But we can collaborate with the Spirit to help our neophytes sharpen their vision. We can do this by asking and reflecting on mystagogical questions with the neophytes. What begins with the Easter Vigil, darkness and light is carried with each of us in order to understand more deeply the Paschal mystery. Ask yourself what it all means:

- How can we keep the flame of faith alive in our hearts?

When you can see the deeper significance of the symbols of our rites in this mystagogical light, you will begin to see everything around you as a reflection of Christ the Light. And you yourself will grow more and more into a mirror that increases that life-giving light for others. From Team RCIA

Saint Paul reminds us that just 'as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life'. (Romans 6:4) During the Easter season, the newly baptized reflect on what it means to 'walk in the newness of life' in the Risen Lord. The concept of hospitality is fundamental to a stewardship way of life. When we envision hospitality, we naturally think of offering a sincere and warm welcome — to those new to our parish, for in-

stance. We picture inviting them in and making them feel at home and at ease in our presence, communicating to them that they are highly valued.

Today's Gospel reading from John invites us to think of hospitality in a slightly different way. In it, we hear Jesus speaking this to his disciples: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him."

Jesus is asking that we permit the *Blessed Trinity* to come and dwell within us. This is a stunning request. It tells us that our first and most privileged form of hospitality should be directed towards God Himself.

How does one show hospitality to God? How do we make God "at home and at ease" within us? How can we communicate to God that He is "highly valued" by us? Jesus tells us how: we are to keep His word, to follow HIs teachings.

To keep His word, we must know His word. This takes discipline and effort on our part. We must make the study of Scripture and Church teaching a priority in our daily lives.

If we want our parish to be a place of genuine Christian hospitality, we must be sure that our own hearts are hospitable dwelling places for the Blessed Trinity. Then our smiles and words, our greetings and ministries will radiate with the warmth of God's love. And our parish family will become at least a little bit like Heaven on earth. This is the simplicity and glory of a stewardship way of life.
