### Hello,

It is not surprising that in graduation season we have numerous things going on in the parish that have to do with completing one part of preparation and considering how this will be lived out in the future. So I would like to tell you about a few of them that aren't typical school graduations.



The first one is the ordination next weekend of our parishioner, Bob Hennekes, as a deacon. Next Saturday morning at 10am, Archbishop Rozanski will ordain him a permanent deacon at the Cathedral Basilica, for which he has been preparing for over five years. He will be assisting and preaching at the Sunday evening Mass on June 5th to give thanks for his ordination and afterwards we will have a reception to celebrate with him. He has also discerned over the last year, with the support of the archbishop, to enter the seminary next fall, to prepare for ordination as a priest, God willing, three years from now.

Second, last week we had four parishioners complete a three year lay formation program: Harry Partl, Doug Prize, Lisa Prize, and Marsha Whitehead. They have been active in the parish in various ways in the past and have devoted these past three years to grow and see how Christ may be calling them further to serve him, and particularly in our parish over the next three years.

Third, our parish council has approved our Parish Pastoral Strategic Plan for 2022-2024. We have been working together on this from our Vision Zoom meetings, parish surveys a year ago, and to our four commissions taking that information to define actions we can take to use the strengths we have to achieve the aspirations we identified. The Mission Statement below, established as we began this task, will help guide us to stay focused in our efforts.

And fourth, we have received the results of our Disciple Maker Index Survey that 796 parishioners completed to help with the archdiocesan pastoral planning efforts titled *All Things New*. It is a lot of information. I will be reviewing it with five Key Parish Leaders who have volunteered to assist in this process along with our parish staff to incorporate the results into our parish plans and to share the information with you.

All of these things have taken much effort and preparation to get to where we are today, but are also just the start of great things to come, of continuing to be open to and hear God's call as individuals, as a parish, and as an archdiocese. I hope this and other information we will be forwarding will help all of us to be open to how God might be calling each of us as his disciples.

ACTS 1:1-11; PS 47:2-3, 6-9; EPH 1:17-23 or HEB 9:24-28; 10;19 -23; LK 24: 46-53

On this Feast of the Ascension, we celebrate Christ's triumphant return to the Father after perfectly accomplishing His mission on earth. But we also can also view this Feast as a celebration of the "launch day" of our commissioning as Christ's disciples.

Today's Gospel draws our attention to the clear instructions that Jesus gave His disciples (and to us) just before ascending to the Father: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer

### ASSUMPTION STUDENTS HONOR FAMOUS MISSOURIANS WITH 'LIVING HISTORY WALK'

When it comes to learning about Missouri history, third-grade students at Assumption School in O'Fallon continue to bring history to life through the art of storytelling. The "Famous Missouri Wax Museum" is an annual living history walk that has been a part of the school's curriculum for decades.

The history assignment: research a famous Missourian of their choice, and on the day of the wax museum event, highlight the celebrity through a short, third-person presentation while dressed in costume and using props.

This year's celebrities consisted of singers and dancers, actresses, Major League Baseball players and even a saint. The stories told included those of Chuck Berry, Jessie James, Betty Grable, Walt Disney, Rosie O'Neill, Yogi Berra, Josephine Baker, Becky Sauerbrunn, Daniel Boone, Rose Philippine Duchesne, Charles Lindbergh, Lori Chalupny, George Washington Carver, Andrew Taylor (A.T.) Still, Harriett Woods, Vice President Harry S. Truman, Sacagawea, Harriett Woods, Laura Ingalls Wilder, Stan Musial, Helen Stephens, Pat Maroon, Jane Froman, Ginger Rogers, Thomas Hart Benton, and Curt Flood, Molly Brown and Ralph Barrale.

When Jim and Marcia Higgins, president and curator of the St. Charles County Veterans Museum, found out that Vincent Wilmoth was interested in portraying their friend and famous Missouri veteran Ralph Barrale, they were inspired to attend.

Ginevra Barrale, a local U.S. Army veteran who served in the Military Police and won four Bronze Stars and the Good Conduct Medal, was a well-known veterans advocate. Dedicated to recognizing veterans in St. Charles County, his projects included the renaming of the north service road in O'Fallon to Veterans Memorial Parkway, the naming of the Veterans Memorial Bridge on Highway 364, Veterans Memorial Park in Lake Saint Louis, and St. Charles County Veterans Museum in O'Fallon.



"Marcia and I were excited when Vincent came into the museum and decided to go with Ralph's story," says Jim Higgins, President of the St. Charles County Veterans Museum. "Ralph passed away just three weeks prior to receiving the keys, and his dream was to get the kids involved."

Vincent Wilmoth, dressed in green army fatigues, stood proudly under the covered walkway between the chapel and the church as he and the other students told the story of each famous Missourian. The living history walk was available for visitors for one hour. This popular school event is anticipated to take place again next year.


