

Good News – Since the COVID-19 cases continue to drop in our area and more people are getting vaccinated the archbishop of St. Louis, Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski, is lifting the dispensation of the faithful to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation as of July 1, 2021. (Archbishop Rozanski has made a video inviting us all back to Mass in the following link: https://youtu.be/dCYuyopNEVM).

Please note that this does not mean that the dispensation does not still exist for those with special concerns. Parishioners who are sick, homebound, immunocompromised and gravely concerned for their health retain the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass, which has always been the case in normal times. Rather, the lifting of the specific dispensation is a recognition that for the general public these exceptions are no longer the case.

With the decreasing spread of the virus in our community we are also able to relax some of our precautionary practices at Mass. We have already incorporated these:

Those fully vaccinated are no longer required to wear masks in the church. Those not fully vaccinated are asked to please wear masks except for when they are receiving the Eucharist.

Part of the church will still have every other pew blocked to continue the full 6 ft. social distancing (for the rest of the church we ask that you still respect social distancing as much as possible with a 3 ft. minimum).

Additional relaxations:

Holy water fonts will be filled with holy water.

Hymnals/Missalettes will be available for use from a book cart in the narthex (we ask people to take one as they go in and please return it after Mass). (Readings and hymns will still be projected for Sunday Mass.)

Offertory baskets will be used again for collections at Sunday Mass (starting after July 1st).

Choirs will be returning within guidelines.

Restrictions remaining:

The distribution of the Chalice of the Precious Blood will not be reinstated at this time.

Eucharistic Ministers will continue to wear masks when distributing the Eucharist.

Please let me know if there are other changes that you think would help us gather to celebrate Mass. We are trying to provide an environment where all feel that they can gather safely without undue fear of contracting the virus, but also to allow us to unite in our worship.

<u>June 13, 2021 — Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time</u> *EZ 17:22-24; PS 92:2-3, 13-14, 15-16; 2 COR 5:6-10; MK 4:26-34*

As we enter back into Ordinary Time, our readings today remind us that heaven is our true home and that we cannot make it there without God's assistance.

In our First Reading, the prophet Ezekiel foretells the coming of the Kingdom of God. We can see that Jesus is the cedar that will become refuge for all people. He will humble the proud, lift up the lowly and produce good fruit in the weakened. It is God who does the wondrous works.

We often go through life wanting to be in control. We try to solve all our problems, as we think, "I can do it myself." We cling to our own ideas by putting certain events, future plans or even day-to-day moments into a perfect little box, "This is the way I want it." 
From the Principal's Pen

Assumption focus on Math in 2020-2021 Semester 1 (August – December, 2020)

Anyone in Education will tell you that they had expected a loss in "learning" between March and May of 2020. The question has always been, "How much of a loss has there been?" Unfortunately, in August, no actual data had been collected, so Assumption developed a "plan of action" during SEMESTER 1 (August- December, 2020). We weren't sure of our specific "loss" percentage, but Assumption determined that the focus on Math improvement was a continued necessity.

In August, all grades 1 through 8 were given a Math Assessment. This assessment was actually the "End of Year "test from the previous grade. In other words, our students in grade 4 took the end of year Math assessment from Grade 3. Why? Because that was the year those students had experienced the COVID-19 changes in education. We recorded the test data for each grade level. This data became our baseline for comparison for growth. Then, faculty of Assumption set forth on our plan of action for improvement.

In December, 2020 we administered the exact same assessment to our students. This gave us data which would show gains or losses in Math. Nationally, actual data on losses in Math across the United States, was on average about 7%. If we did not achieve about 7% increase in each grade level, we had not made the needed gains in learning – however, if we gained approximately 7%, we had achieved the needed gains. Of course, anything greater than 7% was to our student's advantage. Results:




Semester 2 (January – May, 2021)

Continuing the Action Plan, and to check for continued growth in Math understanding, Assumption administered the "END of YEAR" Math assessment for each grade level in January, 21. It is important to realize that this was a test that was normally given at the end of the year – but we chose to give it in January, 2021 (a full

semester early). By giving the test in January, 21 and again in May, 21, we would see how students had progressed in their understanding of Math during the semester of learning.

As you can see, growth continued throughout the second (2nd) semester, ranging from a 7% increase for grade 1 to a 36% increase in grade 4.



Kudos to our faculty and staff, who provide and support our efforts each and every day! In that same vein, thank you for sending your children to Assumption. They do light up our life each and every day.

There will be Christmas Trees set up in the Narthex and Parish Center Lobby (Church basement) the weekends of: June 27th, July 4th and July 11th.


