## Hello,

Did you know that the Feast of Corpus Christi is a holy day of obligation? Well of course it is, it is a Sunday. But in most of the world it isn't on a Sunday, but rather on Thursday. I remember some Holy Days like this, of course Ascension Thursday (which is now on Sunday) may confuse us at times, but I never recalled Corpus Christi being on a Thursday. I figured out an easy way to determine if this was just another one of those recent changes or not, so I asked my dad. He remembered going in a Corpus Christi procession from the rectory to the church on a Sunday when he was a kid, the year he made his First Communion, so I think I am safe at saying we have been doing this on Sunday for a long time. But it also left me with two questions, why is/was it on Thursday in the first place, and why have the processions?

The reason Corpus Christi is celebrated on Thursday is because the Last Supper is celebrated on Thursday. However, Holy Thursday can't have quite the same characteristic to it since it is celebrated during Holy Week and we are thinking of the passion of Christ. Corpus Christi is considered a time when this great gift of Christ can be celebrated with more focus on the great gift given and a little less, although always aware of, the cost of the gift.

I haven't found any official reason why we moved the feast from Thursday to Sunday. The Church strives to find a balance between wishing to promote worship but at the same time not placing undue burdens on us. The tradition of celebrating the feast on Thursday has changed for both Corpus Christi and the Ascension. There was a valuable connection for celebrating each of them on Thursdays, but not a necessary one to that day of the week. I imagine that they were moved to allow more people to participate without making overly burdensome conflicts with our daily schedules.

And that leads us back to the processions. We will be having one here after our Noon Sunday Mass this week, why do we have those? Of course the obvious reason is to show our honor and respect for this great gift Christ has given us. Also, this is a way to do so publicly that involves the community and brings it into the community. Processions through a neighborhood are obvious signs for us that we don't just leave Christ in the church for Sunday, but he is to be with us everywhere. I would have to say one of the most important reasons can be found in the simple fact that my dad remembered being in this procession he was in over 80 years ago. It doesn't just help others see us professing our faith in public, it helps us make memorable moments in our lives that are tied not just to a sporting event, or an election, or school, but to our faith.

May we always be aware of the great gift of Christ in the Eucharist.



# The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ June 6th

On June 6th, we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi! At the 12:00pm Mass, after Communion, immediately after the prayer, a procession - with the consecrated Host placed in the Monstrance - will take place to the “Mary, Queen of Peace Shrine”. We will begin walking through the front doors of church, pass in front of the chapel, turn right (staying on the sidewalk) on W. 3rd street continuing and turning left on Lincoln St. We will then turn right onto Civic Park Dr. and continue to the shrine. We will offer a prayer at the shrine and process back to the chapel following the same path. (The procession is less than a mile one way.) When we return to the chapel, we will offer Eucharistic Adoration until 5:00pm.

**Assumption request for \$321,000 Grant**

You may not have heard, but the federal COVID relief package enacted in December 2020 provided non-public schools a grant-writing opportunity for resources to close the learning-gaps caused by COVID-19. The program is known as EANS (Emergency Assistance to Non-public Schools). In March, Dr. Hensley wrote the grant request and she has received the first round approval. If the grant is approved, this money will help purchase Math textbooks, significant digital resources for learning, new Smartboards throughout our school, new iPads and iPad carts for our students in Pre-K through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and new Chromebooks and Chromebook carts for students in grades 3 and 4. In addition, Assumption will be reimbursed for cleaning materials used to sanitize the school. In mid-June we will hear whether we have been given the final approval.





**June 6, 2021 — Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**

EX 24:3-8; PS 116:12-13, 15-16, 17-18; HEB 9:11-15; MK 14:12-16, 22-26

Today we celebrate Corpus Christi — the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus’ Body and Blood was sacrificed for us on Calvary, but before that excruciating event, He humbly bound Himself to human hands in the Eucharist. As St. Thomas Aquinas expresses, **“In this sacrament sins are purged away, virtues are increased, the soul satiated with an abundance of every spiritual gift. No other sacrament is so beneficial.”**

Our Gospel today recounts the Last Supper. As Jesus ate the Passover meal with His apostles, He broke bread, telling them, **“This is my Body,”** and again, poured wine, saying, **“This is my Blood... which will be shed for many.”** In this moment, Jesus sacrificially gave us Himself in the Eucharist by foreshadowing His passion, death and resurrection. Out of total love, Jesus holds nothing back from us. He gives us His entire self. We must ask ourselves; do we understand Who we consume at every Mass? It is our Precious Redeemer.

As life becomes busy and our minds are filled with countless things we must get done each day, we often forget to acknowledge our Savior at Mass; or to spend time with Him throughout our week; or to accept all the graces He wishes to bestow on us as we receive Him. So let us stop and recognize the real presence of our Savior.

Jesus gave us the perfect and loving Gift of Himself so that we might be nourished, strengthened and more fully united to Him as we journey to eternal life. Let us strive to intentionally honor and reverence Him at every Mass; strive to fully partake in each Eucharistic meal; and let us find time to visit our Savior in the Tabernacle.
