Hello,



This week was the 20th anniversary of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks that we have come to just refer to as 9/11. Most of us can remember where we were and what we were doing when we first heard about the airplane hitting the World Trade Center. We also need to realize since it has been twenty years already, all of those in grade school, high school, and most even in college were not even alive yet when it occurred. A generation has passed. That generation has grown up in the world that was changed by the responses that have come about since that day. Such as, you don't meet people at the gate at the airport, or you may know someone who served, or someone that was injured, or killed in Iraq or Afghanistan. As they see and hear the realities of our withdrawal from Afghanistan they, and many who have served there, may have heard how we began this war, but they do not remember it.

When I was young the Vietnam War was occurring. I saw images on the news at times, and adults and even older siblings were arguing about it. But I wasn't really aware that it was changing our society and world. As I grew up I experienced how it has affected our thoughts and attitudes towards war, to other countries, and to one another. Along with knowing American veterans of the Vietnam War and those who protested against the war, I've also had friends who escaped Vietnam in the mid 70's and in the early 80's. I have heard their view of the war, their experience of the affects, and their perspective of America.

My parents are from the generation that fought in WWII. They remember when they first heard of the bombing of Pearl Harbor. So many went off to war. I've personally known countless American veterans, British veterans, a few German veterans, and a few survivors of concentration camps. Growing up my generation was told and taught of the horrors and the heroics, the atrocities and the sacrifices, the sinners and the saints of that war.

Today we continue to face challenges in the world, as we have in the past, and we will in the future. We pray that we learn from our actions and those of others in the past. We pray that we care for and treasure all life, our own and that of others. We pray that we have the strength to accept sacrifice to assist others. We pray for all people and especially our leaders that they have the courage and faith to choose to do not what is popular, or what is easy, but to be open to God's guidance to do what is right. We know that it is elusive, but may we continue to strive for peace for ourselves, our children, and the world.

A Military Mission for Mary!

If you are looking for a simple way to help spread your faith, please consider joining us on the last Wednesday of every month after the 8:00 am Mass, to make Military Rosaries. These rosaries are made and sent to our service men and women in combat zones, and those stateside preparing to be deployed. Since 2003, over 1 million combat rosaries have been sent to our armed forces around the world through their military chaplains. In the short time since we started this ministry, we have made over 900 rosaries, some of which we have made with and for children and young adults living in the local “combat zones” in the inner city of Saint Louis. We meet in the St. Vincent DePaul house just north of the church parking lot. We depend on donations and prayers to continue this effort, and would greatly appreciate your participation in our project. Assumption St. Vincent De Paul Needs YOU!!

Many of you may know how our own Assumption chapter of St. Vincent de Paul works with many Neighbors in Need to help when they may encounter difficulties with utility bills, rent issues, car repairs, food needs, etc. We would like to also draw attention to how homelessness is affecting our community. At any given time in St. Charles County there are approximately 1390 homeless adults and children. Currently here in O'Fallon there are 273 homeless. There are 532 persons currently in area shelters (which includes 155 children). Unfortunately, there are no shelters in the St. Charles County area that currently allow housing for males. With the absence of public transportation in our area, it is very difficult to hold down employment especially if you do not have a vehicle or a place to stay. There are some homeless clients who do, however, continue to hold down jobs while living outside.

As calls for assistance continue to grow since the Covid pandemic, we would like to ask for any assistance with our homeless client needs.

A few of the items that we are in need of at this time to help fight homelessness in our area are:

- Used adult bikes (We give out many bikes during the year to help the homeless clients get to work while living outside or in local hotels)
- Tents - small size or 1-2 people (\$24-\$29 on Walmart.com or Amazon)
- Sleeping Bags or Blankets
- Single Air Mattresses
- Gas Cards for QT - (We have many clients who live in their cars and occasionally need gas cards to get to work or run their cars for A/C or heat.)
- Dollar Store gift cards or local food gift cards
- Flashlights or Lanterns
- Battery operated fans
- Walmart Gift Cards - Allows clients to purchase non-skid shoes and clothing needed for jobs and phone cards

If you would like to donate any of the above items to help us work with homeless clients or you have any questions, please call Tammy at 314-603-2395. We will PICK UP any large items for donation from your home, SMALL items and gift cards can be dropped off at the parish office, but large items we will pick up from your home. Thank you!

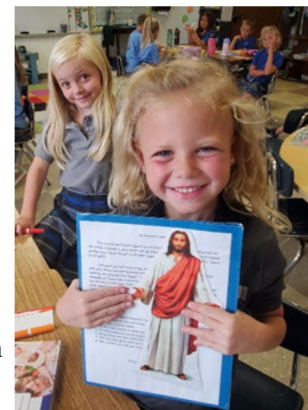

Where in O'Fallon is Jesus?

Our first graders have been talking about where Jesus is, and one project that they are working on is sending Jesus home each week. Each student will have Jesus and can take him to practice, shopping, church, or anywhere they travel that week. When Jesus returns with the student, that child completes a journal page of what the family did while Jesus was with them. By the end of the year, the class will have an entire book to read on where Jesus traveled in O'Fallon (and beyond!).

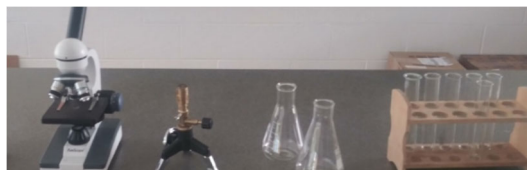


Our Journey Begins in Middle School Science

Our 6th Grade Science class provides the beginnings of significant investigations with equipment and processes. Mrs. Schenk, Middle School Science teacher, begins with her 6th graders learning SAFETY first, with students creating Safety Posters. In addition, students must be able to name scientific equipment and be quizzed on how to use equipment properly and safely.

This summer, we purchased 15 new Biological Light Microscopes and our 7th grade students are learning parts of the microscopes as well as how to focus the lenses on objects presented.

Our 8th graders are learning how to operate Bunsen Burners, and will be using these for upcoming experiments. The students are excited about their new journey into science and are eagerly awaiting their first experiment!



First ART Project for 3rd Graders

There is nothing better for 3rd graders than being able to splatter paint during Mr. Jon Gonzalez's Art class! The "DRIP" technique is what these students recently studied. Jackson Pollock, an American painter and a major figure in the abstract expressionist movement, and his "splats" and "mushed" paint drips created this method of art.

As students learn about Jackson Pollock, they view his art works on the projection smart board, and then try to replicate the technique with paint and paper.

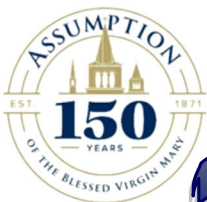

IS 50:5-9A; PS 116:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 8-9; JAS 2:14-18; MK 8:27-35

Jesus addresses His disciples saying, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."

We are Jesus' disciples, and He is speaking those same words to us here and now.

Living a life of discipleship is not always easy. It requires us to be imitators of Christ — who suffered, died, and rose from the dead out of total love for each one of us. This means we are called to share in Christ's sufferings by taking up our cross and following Him daily.

But what does this look like in our day-to-day lives?

We can start by making a firm resolution to follow Christ today, here and now, and renewing that resolution each day when we rise. This requires time with Him each day — speaking and listening.

We should also strive to pick up our crosses each day with Christ by our side. Our cross might be suffering from an illness, fighting an addiction, a day of screaming kids, or a period where things just don't seem to go our way. Instead of avoiding these sufferings or complaining about them, we are called to carry them with Christ, allowing Him to transform us through them.

If we live life constantly focused on us, we will ultimately lose ourselves, but if we surrender our lives for Christ and His mission, we will gain eternal life and become more alive than we could have ever imagined, "For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it." This takes daily commitment and requires endurance in our faith, which can only be done through active discipleship

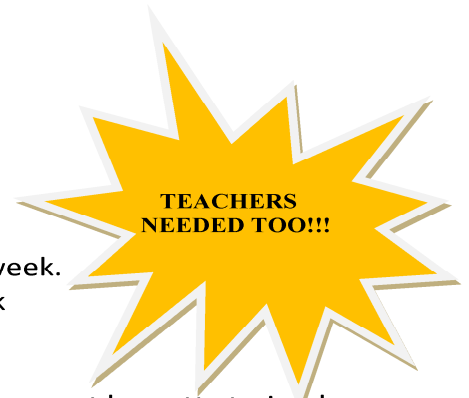
