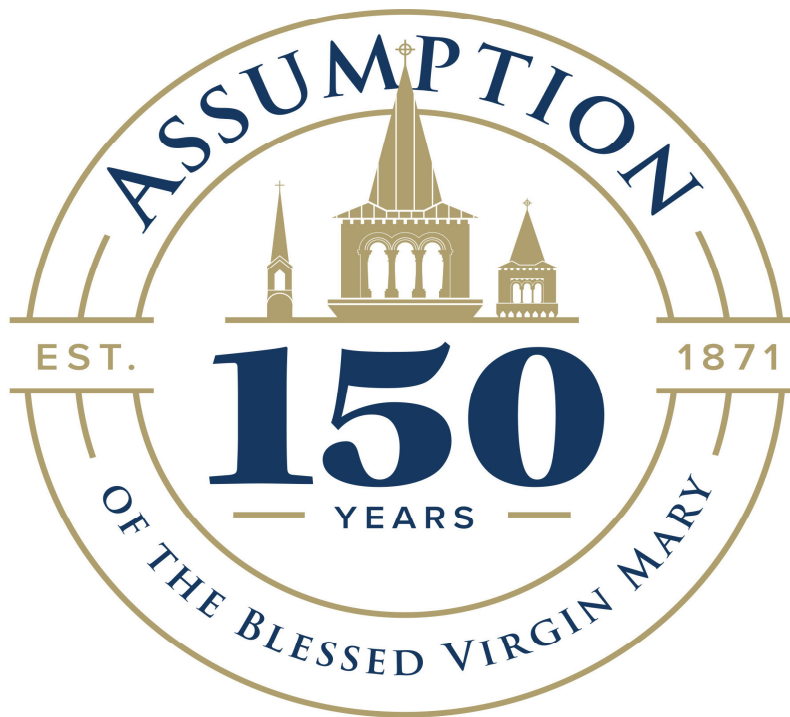

Happy 150th Anniversary,



I think the older I get the more I appreciate how long 150 years is, but also the more realistic and relatable that amount of time is. I celebrated a birthday a few weeks ago, while some of the younger school kids thought I might be 150 I only turned 58. But with that age I've been able to start appreciating how much has happened over my life time, and the changes that have occurred, but also the things my parents or grandparents may have experienced and already experienced when I was young and they were my age or older. My father is turning 95 this year, and his parents were both born in the 1880's, almost back to that year of 1871. It is easiest to consider how different things were back then, and yet it is not that distant, and we can also see how things were the same.

When this parish was founded the local people wanted a church where they could come to worship, a school to educate their children, a community to raise them in their faith. To provide for them all that they could so they could live out the lives God had created them for. We may have e-mails and texts now instead of handwritten letters, have cars instead of horses or just walking, even be able to have distance learning online from our school instead of the first teacher to teach twenty children in a one room school, but we still want the same for ourselves, our children, and our community.

Over the last 150 years we have recorded baptisms for 9,031 people here at Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish. We currently have 9,196 Catholics registered in our parish. In some ways we are a full representation of that history today. We look back and are grateful for the long history of those who have brought our parish community through the last 150 years, but we realize how we need to continue to do so today for ourselves, our children, our community, and the future. As we go into our 151st year may we continue to find Christ here, and bring Christ to the world.

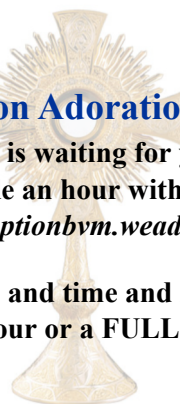

Attending Sunday Mass out of obligation is a good start, but you really don't get to experience the full Love, Joy and Peace of our Catholic faith. Think of anything you do out of obligation versus out of love. Obligation is more of a legal requirement. Love is something you really want to do. When obligated, our needs are usually the center of our atten-

tion. When in love, the other person (or God in this case) is the center of our attention.

Obligation implies that we do the minimum required. We do just enough to pass. It's like taking a class and shooting for a "C" grade instead of trying for an "A". Obligation suggests that we count the minutes until it's over because our heart really isn't in it. We really don't want to be there. Obligation suggests that we don't like talking about it, unless it is to complain, and we may even feel embarrassed being part of it.

Love, on the other hand is different. With love, there are no limits. You want to spend as much time as you can with the other person. You try to stay in constant communication. You can't wait to see the other person again. You plan for the next time you will be together. When you are in love, you are willing to give everything you have for the other person. When you are in love, you want to tell the whole world about it!

Just like our human relationships, our relationship with God will take time to grow and deepen. And, just like our human relationships, if we want to become friends with someone, we have to take time to talk with them to get to know them. This is the same for God. To grow in love and friendship requires patience and humility on our part. (And, more than one hour a week at Sunday Mass).

The question in many parishes is how do we encourage people to return to Sunday Mass? Let's focus on helping people mature in their love and friendship with God. Let's encourage people to attend Sunday Mass because they want to be there and not out of obligation. How? Let's build a path of discipleship for everyone. From the person in our parish community that is barely hanging on to their belief to the person that is one breath from sainthood. Let's help people move from obligation to living out their faith through love.

Pick a couple of family members, friends or neighbors who may have stalled in the obligation phase of their faith life and share your God story with them. You'll help each grow in friendship with God and with each other. In our parish communities, maybe it's time to reorganize our structures, processes and ministries to help people take those small, incremental steps on their path to holiness.

Let's continue on the same path of our parish founders... Let's help everyone take one step closer to God. **Let's make disciples. Let's make disciples into disciple-makers. Let's help people move from obligation TO love for God. Happy 150th Anniversary Assumption Parish!!**

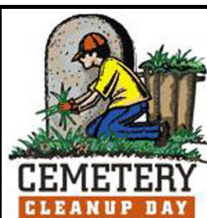

MIDDLE SCHOOL MATH AND THE 150TH ENTIRE STUDENT BODY PICTURE

This 150th year brings back memories and opportunities. One idea for this year's celebration is have a drone take a picture of our entire student body. All students and faculty/staff will be designing the "1", the "5" and the "0" on the upper parking lot.

How was this accomplished? Our Middle School Math teacher, Mrs. Placatka, worked with her 7th grade students in Math class. Using concepts of "upscaling", the drawing of the 150 was outlined on the lot and students chalked in the area for the student body to use. On Friday, August 27th, the drone flew overhead and took a snapshot of our "ABVM student body 150".



ANOTHER 8TH GRADER ATTENDED THE JOSEPH BALDWIN ACADEMY AT TRUMAN

Each year Middle School Principals are asked to nominate students for the Joseph Baldwin Academy held at Truman State during the summer months. Nomination qualifications

are identified as those who are high achievers as indicated by GPA, IQ, enrollment in gifted courses, high standardized test scores, or some equivalent measurement. The Joseph Baldwin Academy offers highly talented students a head start on their future university careers by allowing them to spend three weeks as college freshmen: they move into a residence hall, adapt to living with a roommate, eat dorm food, make new friends, attend classes, and work with Truman State's faculty.

Another student from Assumption that attended Truman State was Madison Huff. Madison's study program was the "Writer's Craft", under the direction of Dr. D'Agostino, Truman English Department professor. In working with Madison, he commented, "We began our inquiries with our lenses zoomed in on a single word, to peel the layers of sound and sense from our most (or least) favorite one. Madison's poem reconfigured the assignment (thankfully) to celebrate words plural, all of them, the whole proliferating swarm of words linking into phrases and sentences, paragraphs and books. It was this kind of fresh approach to any writing prompt that this summer's writers quickly came to rely on from Madison. She was the most thoughtful and reflective writer in the group, and any topic or text she considered always yielded surprising insights and rewards under her pen.

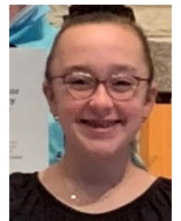
I'm especially grateful for Madison's responses to our readings, those examples that model new possible approaches to explore in our notebooks. Not all young writers have the critical faculties to transplant writers' strategies and "moves" into their own creative experiments. Madison always demonstrated how to identify specific parts of a writer's style, and then how to try them out in our own writing. It's such a crucial lesson for writers to learn, and with Madison, we had the perfect example to help guide our inquiries."

Congratulations, Madison!

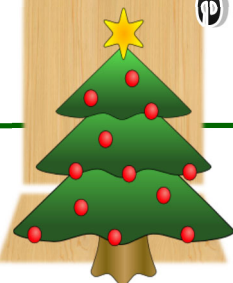
