

Hello,

Every year we let you know the numbers of sacraments celebrated in the parish for the year. Celebrating our 150th anniversary, I thought some of you might be interested in seeing those numbers throughout the history of the parish too. Last year (July 1, 2020-July 1, 2021) we celebrated 71 baptisms, 87 First Communions, 142 Confirmations, 16 weddings and 87 funerals.

Over the 150 years you can see our funerals have been on a consistent increase with a sharp rise last year. Baptisms and weddings clearly show the baby boom. The number of families in the parish has obviously played a factor, starting with only 25 in 1871, growing to 130 in 1910, 150 in 1925, around 1,000 in 1980, then 2,658 in 2005 and 3,230 today.

I didn't include a plot of the First Communions or Confirmations as they track pretty well with the Baptisms except for two anomalies. We have a long gap in some of our First Communion records (since this sacrament is repeated, the records are not as important) and the Confirmations would need to be plotted differently. Since the bishop didn't get out here for Confirmations or we didn't go into the Cathedral to be confirmed every year,

Confirmations only occurred about every 5 years or so instead of annually beginning in 1960.

Over the last few decades our funerals definitely appear to be keeping up with the growing parish, but weddings and baptisms have obviously decreased when we hit a peak in 2000 and again in 2007. Baptisms throughout the Archdiocese of St. Louis have fallen from a rate of 39% of all births in 1950, to 25% in 2000, 21% in 2007 and 17% in 2019 (our last pre-COVID numbers). Obviously, the number we were baptizing grew significantly up to the year 2000 as our parish was growing, but has significantly dropped over the last 15 years, at a much greater rate than throughout the Archdiocese. Looking at our baptisms and weddings will hopefully only further embolden us to find a way to welcome, encourage, and assist young adults and families to live out our faith.

Assumption ENRICHMENT LAB OPENS for Gr. 3 and 4

You may be aware that our Pre-K through Grade 2 STEaM Lab will be opening in late-October. But did you know that we are now opening an Enrichment Lab for Grades 3 and 4?

Tere Bowman, a new Learning Consultant, has a background that includes ENRICHMENT programming and has started the lab for grades 3 and 4. The ENRICHMENT Lab is designed to challenge selected students in deeper thinking, critical thinking and problem solving.

Students are teacher recommended and will meet in groups of 2-4 for a half an hour per week. During that time, students are given a mission to complete with Mrs. Bowman providing the process to complete that mission. The students in Grade 3 started with a "Rover Mission on Mars". This mission continues throughout the weeks and is actually a means of CODING without a computer. (A flowchart of sorts that will create paths to solve a problem).

The beginning mission: You are driving the Rover on Mars. There are only certain roads (noted in blue & white) that can be used to accomplish your mission. As you drive from Point to Point, you must write down the path.



Of course the students pointed out that it was just "easier" to take the path from 7 \implies 9. But Mrs. Bowman said, "Sorry that path is not available."

The ENRICHMENT Lab will receive 5 new Chromebooks, which were purchased through a Grant. These will be used periodically to access apps such as Jamboard activities. Students seemed to enjoy their first session and are excited to return.

Attending Patriot Day Remembrance Ceremony

As the country pays tribute to the victims of the terrorist attacks and those who rushed in to help on September 11, 2001, the City of O'Fallon invited Assumption Middle School students to attend the Remembrance Ceremony on Friday, September 10, 2021. The presidential proc-

Included in the program was a rifle salute, playing of taps, singing of God Bless America, laying of the wreath by honored guests and benediction. Following benediction, all attendees were able to place their carnations near the wreath to remember all that have served and fallen. Lastly, the Honor Guard retreated.
