

Hello,

I put this information in past years and thought I would do it again this year. As we are celebrating Thanksgiving this week, I am giving you a summary of the many ways in which our parish community has been financially generous to so many different charities throughout the year (11/1/22 - 11/1/23).

We continue to be very generous to our St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) Society with almost \$70,000 donated through our parish. But this is only the amount that was donated through the parish, like many of the other charities, parishioners also donate directly to the cause. This amount only counts for the amount donated through the parish with the intent of SVdP, and does not include anything donated directly to SVdP.

We supported the Qeqchi Partners and Fr. Daniel Vogt's work in Guatemala with approximately \$40,000 when Fr. Vogt preached at all Masses one weekend in July, telling us about their work and the very basic needs of the people.

Beyond these special collections we were also very generous again to the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). This year we pledged a total of \$160,024 to the ACA. This money not only supports Catholic elementary and high schools, but also Catholic Charities, numerous ministries with special needs and the poor, and allows us to continue to grow in our faith throughout the Archdiocese.

Recognizing the gifts that we have received, and sharing those to help others, is a key part of stewardship and of giving thanks to God for all he has done for us. Thank you again for your generosity not only to our parish but also to so many others throughout the year. May you and your families have a Happy Thanksgiving.

We gather and pray before the Holy Family Statue.








Pumpkin Patch for Pre-Kindergarten
