Hello,

As I was preparing for Thanksgiving Mass, I looked at the Ordo (the yearly booklet that lists all the different feasts and saints for each day throughout the year and the proper readings and prayers associated with that day—no, we don't have them all memorized) and noticed that there were numerous other saints whose feast day was on November 23, Thanksgiving this year. St. Clement I, pope; St. Columban, abbott; and Blessed Miguel Pro, priest, martyr.

Miguel Pro caught my attention because he died in 1927 during a persecution of the Catholic Church in Mexico. Then I realized on Friday, November 24, is the feast day of St. Andrew Dung-Lac, priest, and companions, martyrs. Those named saints and martyrs were only a small portion of the thousands killed for their Catholic faith in Vietnam in the 17<sup>th</sup> through 19<sup>th</sup> centuries. It can be easy to take for granted the ability to freely assemble in a church to celebrate the sacraments and practice our faith. These are just two examples of countries, that during the history of our country, people were killed in those countries for attempting to practice their faith.

Thanksgiving is a national holiday, but one that has become more and more popular to celebrate in connection with our faith and with Mass. From the very beginning this holiday has been one where we are giving thanks to God, not only for the food and bounty of a harvest in this season, but also for the opportunity to form a government to protect our rights and to live in safety. We realize all that God gives us, but also the need for us to cooperate with those gifts. If we don't use them appropriately, we can lose them. Sometimes it takes a reminder like the examples from history of those who could not freely practice their faith without fear of persecution or death to be grateful for the opportunity we have to freely live our faith. Other times we are reminded by war, poverty, starvation, injustices in society and throughout the world.

As we come to the end of this 'Thanksgiving weekend', let us stay aware of all that we have to be thankful to God for in our lives, and express that thanks by how we use all the blessings we have.






